Renewable energy in Newstead

NEWSTEAD hosted a horde of prominent politicians, TV crews and corporates in high-visibility vests last week at its innovative solar farm. Minister for Energy and Resources, the Hon. Lily D'Ambrosio, accompanied by Member for Bendigo West Maree Edwards, visited on Thursday 22 August to officially open the Newstead Community Energy

Newstead. Minister D'Ambrosio said, "We're supporting regional Victoria to make the most out of the renewable energy transition."

Convenor of Renewable Newstead Geoff Park said that the group was guided by a number of key principles. "We wanted a way to locally generate renewable energy that was accessible Project, initiated by locals under the banner of Renewable to all. We wanted to remain grid-connected and we wanted

a project where community members could opt in," Mr Park said. "We also tried to do no harm; we were sensitive to the

fact that these projects can sometimes cause unrest and angst." The Newstead Community Energy Project includes a 3 megawatt solar farm with 5 megawatt battery energy storage



system to allow excess solar power generated to be stored and used during periods of high demand. It was built on land owned by local farmer Alan who said that it wasn't expected to interfere with his work. "I've had sheep in here," he said, pointing to the field containing shifting solar panels. "They help keep the grass low in line with the fire regulations." Alan explained that there had been extensive fire and safety consultations and that the site is equipped with numerous alarms and a fire suppression system.

Djaara Elder Uncle Rick Nelson spoke at the launch about the significance of the area, which he called Emu Country. "We believe there's a lot of healing to be done. We're really excited to see renewable things like this that don't interfere with the land," he said. Ms Edwards spoke about her own family connection to the location and described the satisfaction of working with the community and the state government over numerous years to see the project developed. "It's been a privilege to work with Renewable Newstead to deliver this project," she said.

To support the successful delivery of the project, Renewable Newstead partnered with the electricity energy retailer and renewable energy developer Flow Power to develop, build and connect the Newstead Energy Project. Flow Power employed local contractors throughout the process and will support additional community benefits through a community fund. The solar and battery project is designed to improve energy security and potentially offer reduced power expenses for consumers. Mr Park said, "We've had a lot of people saying 'you'll never pull it off' but nobody has said we shouldn't give it a crack."

Newstead Energy: Community Q&A



CLOSE to 50 members of the Newstead community participated in a question-and-answer session about the Newstead Community Energy Project on Thursday 22 August, following the launch of the new solar farm. Representatives from project partners Renewable Newstead and Flow Power were on hand to explain the thinking behind the partnership, some technological context and the benefits to consumers for joining the project.

Renewable Newstead Convenor Geoff Park explained that lower electricity bills were only one consideration. "If you're interested in renewable energy, you'll want to know more," he said. "It might be cheaper power this week but it might not be cheaper next week."

Flow Power CEO Matthew van der Linden explained that consumers need to become engaged and monitor their energy usage in order to gain the most out of the project. "If you can engage with the energy market, the benefits can be substantial; you can halve your bill," he said.

Mr van der Linden explained that while Flow Power offers a flat rate, since peak and off-peak times have changed dramatically in recent years, a 'price efficiency value' is also applied to customers' bills to encourage energy efficiency. This is achieved through the use of an app to help make decisions about when to use discretionary power, such as dishwashers or washing machines, which can be functioning during low-demand periods.

Questions from community members indicated some uncertainty about whether to join if they already had solar panels. The responses indicated that the goal is energy efficiency through consumers deciding when to use power, in relation to demands on the power grid, and that all participation is beneficial in creating energy security. Regarding to fears about future price rises, Don Culvenor from Renewable Newstead assured attendees, "The reality is that the networks are regulated businesses, controlled by the AER (Australian Energy Regulator). They can't double their prices tomorrow, they have to justify their prices every five years to the regulator."

A question arose about whether there was any possibility of the solar farm increasing in size in the future. Mr Culvenor responded, "No. If we went to a bigger connection, the work is very expensive. It would be better and more cost effective to start another small one."

In general, the message was that the benefits of the scheme are environmental and that rates are competitive but the best price outcomes will be available to consumers who engage with the process. "Everybody's going to be different," Mr Park said. "It will be a matter of sitting down and looking at your circumstances."

Mr van der Linden said the Newstead project, unique in that it features community involvement in both generating and consuming energy, is a model for other towns. "Our hope is that this is a positive demonstration of what can be done and we want to repeat it and repeat it."

Shire planning scheme review adopted

COUNCIL last week voted to adopt the findings and recommendations of the Mount Alexander Planning Scheme Review (2024).

According to documents presented to Council as part of the agenda for the Tuesday 20 August Council Meeting, the review primarily involved a policy neutral audit of all local Planning Scheme content and an analysis of additional, relevant documents including local plans and strategies, Local

Planning Policy content, Schedules to Zones, Overlays, and Particular Provisions.

The review of the Mount Alexander Planning Scheme was an independent external review prepared for Council by Plan2Place Consulting. The review noted that, overall, the Mount Alexander Planning Scheme provided a robust strategic and statutory framework for land use and development in Mount Alexander Shire.

Recommended amendments to the scheme

included, "policy neutral changes that should be made to the planning scheme to align it with the Ministerial Direction on the Form and Content of Planning Schemes." According to Plan2Place and Council Officers these proposed changes are mostly administrative matters and do not change the policy intent of the scheme.

The adopted Planning Scheme Review will now be forwarded to the Minister for Planning as evidence that Mount Alexander

Shire Council has met its obligations to review the planning scheme every four years in accordance with the Planning and Environment Act 1987.

The amended planning scheme will be exhibited publicly for a four-week period, during which submissions to Council may be made, which Council will then consider at a future Council Meeting.

Disruptions expected for Victorian public transport users

A spring maintenance and construction blitz is forging ahead across the state and may disrupt travel plans across Victoria. Work to remove a dangerous and congested level crossing in Diggers Rest will result in short-term disruptions for passengers on the Bendigo, Echuca and Swan Hill lines, with coaches replacing trains between Southern Cross and Gisborne from Monday 7 October to Wednesday 9 October. Roundabout construction works on the Midland Highway in Bannockburn will result in disruptions throughout spring, while on the Western Highway near Bacchus Marsh, delays are likely due to work to strengthen the Pyrites Creek bridges. Connecting Victorian Producers To Global Markets

State Minister for Economic Growth Tim Pallas last week announced the establishment of trade managers in Barwon South West, Grampians, Loddon Mallee, Hume and Gippsland to turbocharge exports for regional Victorian businesses. The locally-based trade managers will support new and established food and fibre businesses to enter or expand in priority export markets, while promoting the state's food and beverage credentials internationally. Partnering with Austrade to deliver TradeStart in Victoria will provide further support for Victorian businesses in addition to the 23 Victorian Government Trade and Investment offices. TradeStart advisors provide business advice, build export capability and provide connections to international markets. Victoria is the nation's premier state for food and fibre, with exports increasing seven per cent in value in 2022-23 and reaching a record \$19.6 billion.

Grants To Support And Engage Young Victorians

Grants of between \$60,000 and \$180,000 over three years or \$20,000 to \$60,000 per annum are available for youth participation and engagement activities across Victoria through Engage! 2025–2027 program grants. The grants will fund community organisations, local governments, Aboriginal entities and social enterprises to work with young people aged from 12 to 25 to design and deliver activities that suit their interests and the goals they aspire to achieve.

There are three categories of activities funded in the program – youth engagement and participation, youth development and youth celebration and events. This includes activities that promote the voices of young people and their participation in decision making, help them develop new skills and showcase and recognise their contribution to their communities. Local government inquiry in Bendigo on Wednesday

The Victorian Legislative Council's review of local government funding and services moved to central Victoria for a public hearing on Wednesday 21 August. Nine regional and rural councils gave evidence to the inquiry which is investigating the delivery of core services, impacts of cost shifting and current revenue structures. Representatives of Greater Shepparton, Buloke Shire, Campaspe Shire, City of Greater Bendigo, Mitchell Shire, Strathbogie Shire, Gannawarra Shire, Hepburn Shire, Macedon Ranges Shire and Indigo Shire appeared throughout the day. Last week's sessions followed a public hearing at Camperdown in the state's southwest earlier in August.

A Cheaper, Cleaner, Renewable Future For Victoria

State Minister for Energy and Resources Lily D'Ambrosio last week released a statement which sets out the State Government's plan for delivering Victoria's future energy system and reaching the target of 95 per cent renewable generation by 2035. By 2035, Victoria's electricity system will be fundamentally transformed. Electricity use will have increased by about 50 per cent per cent or more, driven by homes and businesses switching to electricity, and population growth. At the same time, all of Victoria's ageing coal-fired power plants will have closed. To ensure that the lights stay on and the state reaches its 95 per cent renewable energy target, Victoria will unlock around 25 gigawatts of new rooftop solar, offshore wind, onshore renewables and energy storage over the next decade. VicGrid is collaborating with landowners, local communities and Traditional Owners on the way renewable energy infrastructure - including transmission - is planned and developed. An orderly transition is critical to keeping the lights on and energy prices down as Victoria moves towards its target of net zero by 2045. To view the statement visit: tinyurl.com/d3sey8pw.

Stay safe in spring

Highlight your house number

Paramedics are asking Victorians to make sure their property numbers are visible from the street to help crews find their property quickly in an emergency. Visible property numbers are crucial when emergency services need to find a location quickly, and by taking simple steps to ensure it can be seen from the street, it could save you or a loved one's life. Ideally, property numbers should be reflective to ensure they can be seen during both day and night. Ambulance Victoria Acting Executive Director Regional Operations Michael Georgiou said Victorian paramedics sometimes respond to properties with inaccurate, unclear, or missing property numbers. Whenever possible, send someone outside to wave the ambulance down and take first responders directly to the patient. If you're unsure of your exact address point location and number, you can check using Mapshare at mapshare.vic.gov.au/webmap/address/.


Dangers of drowsy drivers

The Transport Accident Commission (TAC) has released its annual Road Safety Monitor report, which found around two-thirds of the more than 2,300 survey respondents had driven while feeling 'quite tired' or 'very tired', with 21 per cent admitting to driving when they could not keep their eyes open. The survey highlighted that men aged 18 to 59 in outer urban and regional areas were most at risk, with 37 per cent of this cohort stating they have driven while very tired. Drowsy driving is a factor in 16 to 20 per cent of fatal crashes each year on Victorian roads and contributes to approximately 25 per cent of road trauma injuries at The Alfred and Royal Melbourne hospitals. TAC CEO Tracey Slatter said: "Our message is that drowsy driving is a danger to everyone who shares the road, not just you, so please rest up and get more than five hours' sleep before driving."

Start fire planning now

The Country Fire Authority (CFA) advises that while we can't control fire, we can prepare for it. Victoria is one of the most fire-prone areas in the world, and all Victorians need to know how to plan for and respond to fire By taking the time to prepare, we can reduce risk and keep loved ones safe. The CFA has produced an on-line fire planner that takes as little as 10 minutes to create. Visit: fireplanner.vic.gov.au to create a personalised fire plan now.

Tunnel filled



IN a sad and unexpected development, the entrance to Carmans Tunnel has been filled with boulders and rubble. The historic site, which was an operational mine in the 1880s and more recently a tourist attraction, was closed in late 2019 after experts determined that a significant amount of expensive repair was required to make it safe.

Mining One consultants conducted a geotechnical assessment in 2021 at the request of the state government and found numerous safety concerns, including rock instability and deteriorating timber supports leaving the tunnel entrance at risk of collapse.

Local residents were informed in May this year that works to secure the site, for safety reasons, would include fencing, placing a grate over the air shaft and replacing the gate at the tunnel entrance. A council planning application from April simply stated: 'Works associated with Carmans Tunnel Historic Reserve mine site including fencing.' However, residents were surprised to notice recently that the tunnel appeared to have been backfilled.

In response to queries, the Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action (DEECA) said that a rockfall in June indicated the need to undertake immediate safety works. "Following a rockfall at the site in late June, DEECA and Heritage Victoria sought advice from an independent archaeologist on the best course of action for public safety



as well as preservation of the heritage at the historic site," a spokesperson said. "Based on the advice provided and in order to ensure public safety, immediate work was undertaken to use rocks that had fallen in the area to block the entrance and install new fencing."

Asked if there was any hope that one day the government might budget to repair this important historical and tourist site, DEECA said that there are currently no plans to fund the restoration and reopening of the tourist mine to the general public. The tunnel entrance, now containing a large amount of dirt and rocks that were evidently removed from a nearby hole, looks to have been blocked in a permanent fashion. However, the spokesperson indicated that if there is ever a change of policy that the debris can be removed. "These safety works are reversible if the entrance needs to be re-opened in the future," they said.

The DEECA spokesperson did not respond to a query from the TT about whether DEECA had attempted to communicate the drastic step to the community, and the TT notes that only residents in the immediate area of the tunnel have been informed about works in the past. The road entrance to Carmans Tunnel remains closed with clear signs indicating it is not open to the public.



Thompsons Foundry

WHILE exploring the museum exhibits, I noticed some 'sectioned' pieces of machinery toward the back of the main shed. I mentioned to my host, museum president Alan Miller, that they looked as much artistic as they were functional. He informed me that they were part of the 'Thompsons' exhibit.

Thompsons Foundry, now Flowserve, or more correctly Thompsons Castlemaine Ltd, then Thompson Byron Jackson and then Thompsons Kelly and Lewis, is a Castlemaine institution.

I'm not going to attempt a history of Thompsons here; books have been written, and many of the readers of the *TT* will have personal knowledge and memories, which are often entwined in their family history over generations.

To summarise, though taken from the website:

It was James and David Thompson who initially established Thompsons Foundry. James and David were two Irish brothers who

emigrated from Ireland to Australia in 1852 and 1853. It was first established in 1875, alongside many other foundries in Central Victoria during the gold rush to supply mining equipment to the

Castlemaine goldfields. However, Thompsons Foundry's ultimate success is in fact noted for its ability to diversify through working with the Victorian Railway, plumbing industries and WWII munitions suppliers. The foundry's ability to move with the market enabled it to continue to employ the locals of Castlemaine, to support the economy and develop Castlemaine into the town

My personal experience was years ago hearing the factory whistle for the first time, a bit like Hong Kong's noonday gun. It was not only a time signal but a comforting reminder that all is well in the world and that feeling of security.


Much later in life, I was astounded to see the diving bell from the 'Niagara' salvage recovery, just sitting in the corner of the Castlemaine Visitor Information Centre. Just Google the Niagara Gold and read the full story; it's absolutely amazing. Briefly, the Niagara was a ship with a cargo of gold bullion ingots that was torpedoed during WWII. A diving bell was designed and constructed and was sent down to the wreck and recovered the gold! Where was it made? You guessed it, Thompsons Foundry in Castlemaine.

I digress; the thing that emerged while speaking with Alan was the depth of importance to the local community that the foundry became. So much more than an employer, but a foundation of the local culture. This became apparent when I read the comments engraved on alloy plates created for the company's centenary. I'm going to feature these as a separate article because I think they are important enough to be recorded.

Here's an example: I worked there for a long while 1954 to 1966. I left because I was getting married. They didn't employ married women. Just as simple as that. It's been a strong influence in the family, my two sons worked there, their dad worked there and his father. On my mother's side, her father worked there and her two brothers. I think everyone regarded Thompsons as a part of the community. Known as 'The Foundry' The whistles were a big part of the town. Everyone knew what they meant, what time it was. You didn't need a town clock. Unfortunately, the author's name is not noted; maybe someone reading this can recognise who it is; I'd like to know.




When the Golden Wattle blooms

Putters and Plus Fours



A group of Hickory Golf enthusiasts converged on Maldon Golf Club last weekend to play the Walter Travis Schenectady Putter Trophy as part of a weekend tournament. These fans of old-fashioned golf technology played on Sunday 26 August with wooden clubs; many were restored antiques. Some players wore traditional golfing attire known as plus fours; knickerbockers that are so-named because they extend four inches below the knee. The TT attended to chat about the appeal of the vintage style game.

Andrew Thomson, who writes for the *Royal* Melbourne Golf Digest, explained that the history is part of the appeal. "You can compare it to people who like classic motor cars, you get a feel for how it used to be played," he said. We're interested in how it was played a hundred years ago. Most of us are playing with antiques and we now find new clubs bland and uninteresting."

The group, which included

Golf Society of Australia President Kim Hastie, explained that the wooden shaft behaves differently to the modern, metal version and means that it's important to play by feel. John Evans, who had travelled all the way from New Zealand to join the Maldon tournament, thought it helped his game." If you get the ones that suit you, it makes it easier," he said. The group pondered this suggestion and not everyone agreed. "When you play with the new clubs, you only remember the bad shots, with these you only remember the good ones," quipped Andrew Baker. "And if you don't play well you can blame the clubs.'

Meanwhile, Mango Maguire, former winner of the trophy and runner-up in last week's event, demonstrated a traditional method of dragging the club before a swing. The TT also had a chat to Ross Baker, a craftsman who makes and restores old golf clubs, who explained that learning about the vintage tools of the game provides an extra layer of interest. He

said, "These players are not trying to overtake modern golf, just trying to acknowledge history." The winner of the Walter Travis Schenectady Putter 2024, for the second year in a row, was Simon Sheedy. Michelle Dorian

A permanent home has been found



THE Directors of the Regional Community Vet Clinic (RCVC) are delighted to announce that after years of hard work to find a suitable location, they have finally secured a permanent home to build their clinic. The clinic, which will be wholly owned by RCVC, will be the first Notfor-Profit community veterinary clinic in regional Victoria. This is a major milestone for this groundbreaking initiative, which will deliver massive benefits to the residents of Mount Alexander and surrounding shires.

The initial project was for a transportable building to be located on council-owned land at the Campbells Creek Community Centre but unfortunately, due to inaccurate information received, the site proved unsuitable. RCVC then had no choice but to look at other options, Co-founder and Director Robyn Slattery said, "This was a major setback and meant the Directors' vision of creating a low-cost veterinary clinic for disadvantaged residents of the Shire has been delayed by over two years."

After a long search for a suitable and affordable property and lengthy negotiations with funders, RCVC is happy to announce that they have secured 4 Midland Highway, Castlemaine as their permanent home. Locals may recall that previously the property housed a retail nursery. Chair of RCVC Yvette Berkeley said, "We have worked tirelessly for over 12 months to secure this property, which now means RCVC will have a forever home that will secure the long-term future of the Clinic." Yvette said they hope to announce the successful commercial builder soon.

RCVC is hoping to have the clinic open one day per week in the first quarter of 2025, providing preventative veterinary services to financially disadvantaged residents (who are recipients of a government support payment). Despite not having a permanent home, RCVC has since early 2022 conducted monthly pop-up clinics de-sexing cats, provided dental and general health checks and for the first time in June, a de-sexing clinic for dogs. RCVC has also since mid 2022 been offering an outreach program, assisting older members of the community to maintain their companion animals at home and assisting with emergency care for pets whose older people require unplanned emergency hospital stays.

To renovate and fit out the premises for its purposes, RCVC will need to spend significant funds. RCVC is now reaching out to community members, businesses and individuals who can offer in-kind or financial support towards the renovation and fit out costs for the clinic. RCVC is a registered charity with DGR1 status, which means any donation over \$2 is tax deductible.

RCVC is a volunteer-run organisation, founded with the belief that companion animals play a vital role in the welfare and overall well-being of residents in regional communities. Our aim is to reduce isolation and build social cohesion, while improving the lives of companion animals.

To submit a nomination, candidates must schedule an appointment by contacting the Candidate Helpline at 03 8620 1316 between Tuesday, 20 August and Monday 9 September. From 9 September onwards, candidates can call 131 832 to be directed to the relevant election office. Proof of completed online candidate training, a legal requirement, must be provided during submission.

New funding round to support Victoria's small towns

VICTORIA'S smallest towns are set to benefit from the latest round of funding, with applications opening for the \$20 million Tiny Towns Fund on Monday, 26 August. The initiative provides grants ranging from \$5,000 to \$50,000 to towns with populations of up to 5,000, aiming to enhance tourism, liveability, and community engagement.

The fund supports a range of projects, including new barbecues, bike tracks, walking trails, and upgrades to community facilities such as clubs and halls. The grants are designed to celebrate community spirit while making a positive contribution to the lives of locals.

The first round of the Tiny Towns Fund has already backed more than 200 projects in 181 towns across regional Victoria, helping to strengthen communities by improving local infrastructure and creating jobs. This second round aims to continue that momentum with simplified application processes to encourage participation from smaller, volunteer-run community groups.

Examples of past projects include the restoration of the Thomas Montgomery Pavilion in Mortlake, which will enable the town to host more local events, and a \$50,000 grant for an augmented reality experience in Glenrowan, building on the success of the Ned Kelly Discovery Hub.

Premier Jacinta Allan highlighted the importance of the fund in small communities: "Supporting projects that make small communities great is one of the ways we encourage their vibrancy, making them even better places to visit and live."

Minister for Regional Development Gayle Tierney added, "Now we're giving more tiny towns a chance to make their own projects a reality – creating local jobs, boosting economies and attracting more visitors."

BLAST FROM THE PAST



ELIZABETH CALDER

ELIZABETH Calder was born in Manchester in 1835 and followed her brothers Thomas and James to the Victorian goldfields in 1855. After spending a short time in Castlemaine, Elizabeth and Thomas moved to Maldon. Elizabeth purchased land in Templeton Street in March 1857 and Thomas established himself as a builder and undertaker.

Elizabeth was active in the early years of Holy Trinity, first as a Sunday school teacher and later as an assistant teacher at the Penny School. In 1863 she completed a teaching course at the Board of Education's Model School in Melbourne. On her return to Maldon, Elizabeth established an infants' school in the former Lutheran Church that once stood in Church Street opposite the Penny School. The school was associated with the Penny School and catered for children up to eight years old.

In 1870 Elizabeth resigned her teaching position and made the first of a number of trips to England. She was away from Maldon for three years but on her return resumed her teaching career at the newly formed Maldon State School.

When in Maldon, Elizabeth lived at 'Roseneath', now Calder House, the home of her brother Thomas and his wife Anna. She helped Anna care for her growing family and was also involved with local groups such as the Ladies' Benevolent Association.

In 1889 when returning from England, Elizabeth met the Countess of Meath who four years earlier had formed the Ministering Children's League. The League aimed to promote kindness and selflessness among children and encourage them to help others who were in need. Its motto was, 'No day without a deed to crown it'.

The Countess persuaded Elizabeth and her travelling companion Annie Hitchcock to form a branch of the League in Victoria. Elizabeth soon became the League's Australian organising secretary and travelled throughout the colonies establishing branches and raising funds. Her work took her as far north as Rockhampton and west to Perth and the Kalgoorlie goldfields.

In Victoria the League's major achievement was the building of the 'Cottage by the Sea' at Queenscliff. The Cottage opened in 1895 to care for children convalescing from illness. Its focus later changed to providing respite and holidays for children in need.


In 1909 Elizabeth developed pneumonia while visiting Tasmania on League business. She returned to Maldon but did not recover. She died at 'Roseneath' on May 15 1909 and is buried in the Calder family plot at the Maldon Cemetery.

Following her death Elizabeth's charitable works were widely acknowledged and a wing of the 'Cottage by the Sea' was named in her honour. There is also a plaque in Holy Trinity commemorating her life.

Book Reviews

The Little Italian Hotel by Phaedra Patrick, 2023

Ginny Splinter, acclaimed radio host and advice expert, prides herself on knowing what's best for others. So she's sure her husband, Adrian, will love the special trip to Italy she's planned for their 25th wedding anniversary. But when Ginny presents the gift to Adrian, he surprises her with his own very different plan, a divorce. Beside herself with heartache, Ginny impulsively invites four heartbroken listeners to join her in Italy instead while live on air. From hiking the hills of Bologna to riding a gondola in Venice to sharing stories around the dining table of the little Italian hotel, Ginny and her newfound company embark on a vacation of healing.

However, when Adrian starts to rethink their relationship, Ginny must decide whether to commit to her marriage or start afresh, alone. And an unexpected stranger may hold the key to a very different future.

France: an Adventure Story by Graham Robb, 2022

This is a profoundly original and entertaining history of France, from the first century BC to the present day, based on countless new discoveries and 30 years of exploring France on foot, by bicycle and in the library. Beginning with the Roman army's first recorded encounter with the Gauls and ending with the gilet jaunes protests in the era of Emmanuel Macron, each chapter is an adventure in its own right. Along the way, readers will find the usual faces, events and themes of French history: Louis XIV, the French Revolution, the French Résistance, the Tour de France and all presented in a shining new light.

Birnam Wood by Eleanor Catton, 2023

Five years ago, Mira Bunting founded a guerrilla gardening group: Birnam Wood. An undeclared, unregulated, sometimes-criminal, sometimes-philanthropic gathering of friends, this activist collective plants crops wherever no one will notice on the sides of roads, in forgotten parks and neglected backyards. For years, the group has struggled to break even.

Then Mira stumbles on an answer, a way to finally set the group up for the long term: a landslide has closed the Korowai Pass, cutting off the town of Thorndike. Natural disaster has created an opportunity, a sizable farm seemingly abandoned. But Mira is not the only one interested in Thorndike. Robert Lemoine, the enigmatic American billionaire, has snatched it up to build his end-times bunker, or so he tells Mira when he catches her on the property. Intrigued by Mira, Birnam Wood, and their entrepreneurial spirit, he suggests they work this land. But can they trust him? And, as their ideals and ideologies are tested, can they trust each other?

The Murder Squad by Michael Adams, 2023

As Australia sank into the darkest days of the Great Depression, a succession of bloody mysteries grabbed headlines and gripped the country. The Hammer Horror, The Bungendore Bones, The Park Demon, The Human Glove and The Pyjama Girl were just some of the grisly cases that had to be solved by the Sydney detectives of The Murder Squad. With the people, press and politicians screaming for justice and vengeance, homicide chief Tom McRae and his colleagues used bold new investigative tools in the massive manhunts for these maniacal killers. Working under intense pressure, hard-nosed and hard-charging cops solved some cases brilliantly yet others were 'closed' with dodgy convictions while several shadowy figures were to get away with murder.
