t is a sensational time of year to enjoy a trip on the heritage train between Maldon and Castlemaine and adjustments have been made to ensure maximum safety for passengers and residents. The Victorian Goldfields Railway (VGR)'s amended summer schedule is designed for effective engine maintenance and includes extra measures to monitor for stray sparks. Changes include shifting normal Wednesday travel times to Fridays and a pause to all services during February.

VGR Administration Manager Tanya Lee (whose role also includes Station Master, Conductor, First Class Steward, Membership Officer, Track Patrol, depending on what is required) told the *Tarrangower Times* that during the peak fire season, the steam engine has a rest and a 1960s locomotive takes its place. "We have always had a standard change of running the diesel, although we like to run the steam as long as possible," she said. "This gives the loco and the crew a break and the team can do some maintenance without too much disruption to services."

Tanya pointed out that the passenger experience is not hugely affected. "Whilst everyone loves the steam train, when you are travelling along, you still have the old carriage, the rocking to and fro. It's about looking out the windows at the scenery." There is also the option for passengers to ride in the engine with the driver for an extra fee (available on the VGR website). Tanya said: "A cab pass is also available to ride with the crew. You ask anyone – they love it, even with diesel, it's loads of fun. Everyone comes out with a huge smile on their face."

The reason for the change from Wednesday to Friday services is to stretch the time between trips and allow for uninterrupted track upgrades. "We've been very fortunate to have some new railway sleepers and our track gang has been very busy swapping out the wood sleepers for concrete ones, this change is to maximise their work time so our civil branch can do the work they need to do," Tanya said. "The railway is always thinking ahead and being prepared for the future. This is about

Fire report

THANKFULLY, it has been a quiet week for our local fire crews. Captain of Baringhup Fire Brigade Brendan McKnight and Bruce Clements 1st Lieutenant (Acting Captain) of Maldon Fire Brigade both reported no call-outs in the last week.

However, Captain McKnight did describe an incident from the previous week in which a young child suffered an injury while swinging into the Loddon River near the Loddon House Holiday Park in Baringhup. "He swung out and we think he came back and hit the tree or a log in the water," he told the TT. The CFA provided some assistance while waiting for a first aid crew to arrive; it's a reminder that we cannot be too careful and that accidents will occasionally still happen."People are just having fun in the water until suddenly it's not fun any more," Brendan said.

Meanwhile, Acting Captain Clements reflected on the terrible information filtering through from the catastrophic Los Angeles fires. He said that fire awareness here is high but many factors in LA are similar to many Victorian localities, including what he described as "fingers of vegetation reaching into the town," that increase the flammability of residential areas. He pointed out that the time of year made the event surprising. "It's winter over there, although it's very dry," he said and referred to news commentary suggesting that this is a wake-up call. Australia has traditionally called on aerial firefighting appliances from the Northern Hemisphere during our fire seasons but that option may no longer be available if the risk is year-round. "Australia can't afford to be complacent," he said. Bruce concluded that Australians just need to remain vigilant and fire-ready, as always.

Fire exposes risk of chicken farm waste

THE management, storage and disposal of farm waste products has become a focus after residents reportedly discovered a smouldering fire in a chicken litter stockpile last week.

A resident in the Baringhup/Carisbrook area says they discovered evidence of self-combustion in a pile of chicken farm waste following a day of Total Fire Ban in the district, expressing concern that it could happen again.

The Environment Protection Authority (EPA) Victoria has confirmed that it was aware of the fire but did not provide details of location or date. "EPA has responded to a recent report of a fire in spent chicken litter that was stockpiled by a farmer on their property," a spokesperson stated via email. "We'll require the property owner to reconfigure the chicken litter stockpile to reduce the risk from possible future fires."

The CFA told the Tarrangower Times: "CFA is aware of a small amount of chicken manure that self-combusted at a local property near Baringhup on Tuesday, 7 January. No call was made for help. The property owner managed the fire and had a 20,000L water tank and machinery on site which he used to quell the small amount of smoking chicken manure before spreading it out across his paddocks."

While Baringhup and Maldon fire brigades were not required to attend, they acknowledge

that there is a risk of fire caused by self-combusting chicken waste. Bruce Clements 1st Lieutenant (Acting Captain) Maldon Fire Brigade explained: "Any sort of organic matter where there is moisture present, hay that's not completely dry — even grass clippings — it can happen." Both he and the EPA reiterated that everyone is responsible for taking care on their own property. "It's incumbent on all people to know the risks of the stuff that they're handling and be careful," Bruce said.

The EPA spokesperson said: "EPA has guidance on how to store and manage combustible materials, such as spent chicken litter, in a way that protects the environment and human health from the risk of fire." The spokesperson also pointed to the General Environmental Duty (GED), which is part of the Environment Protection Act 2017, saying: "The General Environmental Duty (GED) makes it everyone's responsibility to take reasonably practicable steps to minimise the risk of harm to human health and the environment from pollution

A spokesperson from Central Goldfields Shire Council stated: "The council is currently investigating these matters and working with the EPA to understand any potential non-compliance."

stronger tracks because they last longer and give a smoother ride. The wooden sleepers don't last forever, they rot and wear if you don't keep an eye on them."

In addition to timetable amendments, an extra fire safety vehicle is put into service during fire season. "We run a High Rail vehicle, it runs behind the train to check for spot-fires - to keep a lookout and a smellout – it has a water pump and a water tank. It has two qualified crew to address any spot-fires, sort of like First-Aid," Tanya explained.

State Government announces changes to health system

The Victorian State Government announced on Friday 10 January that it is establishing Local Health Service Networks grouped together by geographic regions. The local network is Loddon Mallee and it includes: Bendigo Health, Boort District Health, Cohuna District Hospital, Dhelkaya Health, Echuca Regional Health, Heathcote Health, Inglewood and Districts Health Service, Kerang District Health, Mallee Track Health and Community Service, Mildura Base Public Hospital, Robinvale District Health Services, Rochester & Elmore District Health Service and Swan Hill District Health.

The government claims that the change will support improved cooperation between local services, ensure doctors and specialists are available to care for patients closer to where they live, deliver clearer pathways in and out of hospital, and support better waitlist management across a region. The final groupings were determined following extensive consultation with health services, with consideration given to population growth, community need, clinical capability and distance between services. The government says that the governance of each health service, including its board and CEO, unique identity and connection to their community, will remain unchanged and that in early 2025, health services will come together to discuss the priorities and arrangements for their Network. Local workforces and communities will also be consulted in 2025 to gain their views as well to address each individual community's health needs.

Minister for Health Mary-Anne Thomas said: "These Networks will mean stronger referral pathways between health services – freeing up beds in busier hospitals, taking pressure off our dedicated workforce, and ensuring Victorians get care sooner, closer to home."

Patient transport reforms

The State Government will also introduce a range of reforms for Victoria's non-emergency patient transport (NEPT) sector following an extensive review of the sector undertaken by Member for Melton and former paramedic, Steve McGhie, with the review reporting that service demand has increased significantly since 2019 – averaging 400,000 individual transports each year.

The review also highlighted that while the current system has many strengths, improvements are necessary to boost access, increase efficiency, and better meet patient needs and workforce expectations.

Changes include better integration and coordination of NEPT within the wider health system, strengthening monitoring of performance and patient experience, and improving staff conditions, governance and oversight. Private providers will be required to implement permanent employment targets and develop dedicated strategies to support the attraction, retention and ongoing development of the workforce. Work will also get underway to improve timeliness and reliability of services, so planned transports aren't delayed by crews being diverted to a Triple Zero caller.

RACV recommends car clear-out

The RACV has advised that drivers should regularly check their vehicles for items that should be removed and stored safely elsewhere. Five common items you shouldn't keep in your car include:

Electronic devices: Smartphones, laptops, and other gadgets with lithium-ion batteries can overheat, potentially leading to fire

Medicine: Both prescription and over-thecounter medications can become less effective or inactive when exposed to extreme temperatures in parked cars.

Aerosol cans: Deodorants, air fresheners, and other spray cans may explode under pressure in hot vehicles.

Sunscreen: Heat can break down the active ingredients in sunscreen, rendering it ineffective for sun protection.

Glasses and sunglasses: Frames can warp in high temperatures, and lenses left on dashboards may create fire hazards.

When asked whether it is difficult for applicants to put pitch on their projects without knowing what they are up against, Sophie



Natural Newstead

Handover time


It's always a challenge to 'puzzle out' bird behaviour.

Rainbow Bee-eaters are well advanced with their 2024 breeding and it appears eggs are about to hatch.

As hatching approaches both parents keep a close eye on the nest, with one adult inside the tunnel at all times, apart from 'handover time'. This happens when one of the adults returns to perch near-to and above the nest before uttering a series of quiet trills - a signal for the incubating adult to leave the nest and be immediately replaced by its partner. This pattern is repeated every 10 minutes or so. Earlier in the incubation phase the eggs may be left unattended for extended periods as both adults forage aerially nearby.

I'm surmising that the eggs are yet to hatch as there was no evidence of food items being delivered.

The federal bazaar

IN December 1900 the Maldon Presbyterian community organised a 'Federal Bazaar' to raise funds for their new church, (now the Neighbourhood Centre). It was held in the Temperance Hall, (now the Community Centre), over four days opening on Wednesday 5 December. The *Maldon News* reported that it would not be a bazaar in the ordinary sense but 'a grand combination of interesting, amusing, edifying and unique events'.

The Hall was decorated with a fine display of flags and bunting, including many miniature Union Jacks. Also among the decorations was Hamilton McFarlane's hand-painted fishing scene, created especially for the occasion. Among the many stalls, the most admired was the fancy goods stall featuring Mary Ann Pollard's handmade patchwork quilts. There were also refreshment, lolly, flower and produce stalls. A bachelor's stall loaded with 'pretty and useful articles for gentlemen' was very popular. The bazaar also featured cake, handicraft and even potato peeling competitions.

The most original feature of the Bazaar was the parade of poster and fancy dress costumes. Poster costumes had become a craze following a highly successful 'Poster Ball' that was held earlier in the year to raise funds for the Children's Hospital in Melbourne. The costumes combined advertising with fancy dress with participants often dressing as characters from well-known advertisements.


The outstanding entries were Miss Johnson representing local draper, John McFarlane's Commercial House and Mrs Jane Oswald representing grocer Robert London's IXL Store. Miss Johnson was dressed in pale blue satin trimmed with blue chiffon and lace. She also wore a Gainsborough hat and carried a crook, flowers and a miniature hatbox. Mrs Oswald was dressed in a white brocade bodice trimmed with swallows and a front of pink satin and London's name in silver lettering.

Other poster costumes related to popular advertisements such as Miss Olive McFarlane as Robur Tea and Miss Flora McArthur impersonating Sunshine Soap. In fitting with the times Miss Frances Way was dressed as 'Federation'. She wore a red skirt featuring the Southern Cross and a Union Jack bodice. She also carried the *Melbourne Herald*'s Federation flag that had won a competition held by the paper to find a national flag. Castlemaine photographer Adolphus Verey was on hand to record some of these costumes.

In total, over 30 men and women entered the costume parade. Many of the men were dressed in their uniforms from local organisations such as the Brass Band and Fire Brigade. Several men were also dressed in kilts supplied by George McArthur. The 'Federal Bazaar' was a great success and it ended with a garden party at Jane and Robert Oswald's home 'Ethandune' in High Street.





Is the Maldon Athenaeum Library part of the Goldfields Libraries group?

No, we are an independent community library staffed by volunteers and managed by a committee of members.

How is the library funded?

We depend on the support of the community for funding. This comes from membership subscriptions, book sales and other fund-raising activities, donations and occasional (but very gratefully received) grants.

How many books does the library have and how are they chosen?

The library houses over 15,000 books. Books are chosen to match the interest of members and the community of Maldon and district. We aim to keep the collection current, both by purchasing recent releases and asking members for suggestions of books they are interested in reading.

Can I visit the library even if I am not a member?

Notice the large stained-glass windows in the art nouveau style, which are reputed to have come from a hotel in Melbourne being demolished in 1934 at the time of the rebuilding of the library. Sit in the Reading Room and catch up on the local paper and information about upcoming local events. The Children's Library is a quiet place to read a story or play with the toys. The Maldon Athenaeum Library is a pleasant and interesting place to visit. You can find us at 97 High Street Maldon, next to the Post Office.

The Armour of Light by Ken Follett, 2023

The Spinning Jenny was invented in 1770, and with that, a new era of manufacturing and industry changed lives everywhere within a generation. A world filled with unrest wrestles for control over this new world order: a mother's husband is killed in a work accident due to negligence; a young woman fights to fund her school for impoverished children; a well-intentioned young man unexpectedly inherits a failing business; one man ruthlessly protects his wealth no matter the cost, all the while war cries are heard from France, as Napoleon sets forth a violent master plan to become emperor of the world. As institutions are challenged and toppled in unprecedented fashion, ripples of change ricochet through our characters' lives as they are left to reckon with the future and a world they must rebuild from the ashes of war.

William Cooper: An Aboriginal Life Story by Bain Attwood, 2021

William Cooper's passionate struggle against the dispossession of Aboriginal people and the denial of their rights and his heroic fight for them to become citizens in their own country has been widely commemorated and celebrated. By carefully reconstructing the historical losses his Yorta Yorta people suffered and endured, William Cooper: An Aboriginal Life Story reveals how the first 70 years of Cooper's life inspired the remarkable political work he undertook in the 1930s. Focusing on Cooper's most important campaigns: his famous petition to the British King George for an Aboriginal representative in the Australian parliament; his call for a day of mourning after 150 years of colonisation; the walk-off of the Yorta Yorta people from Cumeroogunga reserve in 1939 and his opposition to the establishment of an Aboriginal regiment in the Second World War, this carefully researched study sheds important new light on the long struggle that Indigenous people have fought to have the truth about Australia's black history heard and win representation in Australia's political order.

The Promise of Iceland by Kari Gislason, 2011

In 1990, Kári Gíslason travelled to Iceland to meet his father for the first time. What he finds is not what he expected. Born from a secret liaison between a British mother and an Icelandic father, Kári Gíslason was the subject of a promise, a promise elicited from his father to not reveal his identity. The Icelandic city of Reykjavík, where Kári was born, was also home to his father and his father's wife and five children none of whom knew of Kári's existence. Moving regularly between Iceland and Australia, he grew up aware of his father's identity, but understanding that it was the subject of a secret pact between his parents. At the age of 27, he makes a decision to break the pact and contacts his father's other family. What follows, and what leads him there, makes for a riveting journey over landscapes, time and memory.

Mosaic: Techniques and Traditions by Sonia King, 2003

With the work of hundreds of artists on display throughout, this visually arresting volume showcases mosaics from all corners of the globe and teaches the skills needed to produce 15 beautiful pieces. The history of the art, tools and materials, and techniques come first: bases, adhesives, and grout; shaping and placing tesserae; practical and artistic design considerations; and several methods of creating the actual mosaic. Put that information to use on an array of magnificent international projects, from a Blue Willow Tray to a Rock Garden Fountain, all beautifully illustrated and with the level of difficulty noted.







The dodgy doodle bug

AUSTRALIANS are well known for their ability to innovate and their resourcefulness.

We are seeing patterns developing here with our close-up examination of some of the museum exhibits.

The carousel developed from stuff stored and lying around Alan Tori's place, Hargreave's and Duigan's experiments with flying machines, the stump jump plough...we've heard all the stories.

If you've ever been stuck and really needed to do something without the right tools, or enough money, or no one to help, it's quite amazing what you can sometimes come up with.

I remember once installing some wall cupboards in our kitchen on my own and not having anyone to help hold them while I attached them to the wall, I ended up getting the ironing board out and putting it on the bench and sitting the cupboard unit on it while I screwed it in! Not sure how I thought of that, it must be in my Aussie DNA.

This time I'm chatting with Charles Hall about an old vehicle which is a bit of a time capsule. There's lots of examples of making do when you look a bit closer, in fact the whole thing is a bitsa, which is exactly why it's so interesting.

If you asked what it was, you'd get a different answer depending on which end you were looking at.

The front is a 1919 Dodge, otherwise known as a doodle bug and the back is a very early 1907 T Model Ford.

So the farmer, who owned it originally in Birregurra, had the car but needed a truck/tractor, so he cut about five feet (around one and a half metres) out of the chassis and welded in the rear half of the Ford and hey presto, a tractor!

There are a few other mods that it's picked up along the way. The fuel tank has been moved from the back to the front, so it doesn't need a fuel pump, just gravity to feed the engine and on the topic of fuel, it was altered to run on Kerosene, which was a bit cheaper than petrol back in the Great Depression.

After the great stock market crash of 1929, unemployment was running at around 40%, there was absolutely no money around, no Centrelink, and everyone had to make do as well as they could. This was around the time this doodle bug was created. Also a truck was 10 shillings to register and a car was 30 shillings, so there was an obvious saving there.

Some of its other features include Buick front wheels and jam-tin hub caps, courtesy of Charles.


Now the doodle bug is not just a pretty face; the volunteers at the museum reckon they are going to get it going for the Easter Parade, maybe not this year, but I've got no doubts at all and I fully expect to see it outside Robert Cox's garage.

I would love to see the expression on Robert's face when Charles says, fill her up ... with Kero!


