Ambulance Victoria's (AV) Maldon Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) has received a significant boost with the arrival of a new response vehicle. The updated 2024 Nissan XTrail 4x4 Hybrid reflects AV's commitment to supplying its CERT teams with the latest equipment to support their critical work in local communities and environmental sustainability.

The new vehicle replaces the team's previous 2018 model and features advanced technology,

enhanced fuel efficiency, and the reflective livery improves visibility on the road. AV Central Goldfields and Mount Alexander Senior Team Manager Kelli Jones said the vehicle upgrade was a welcome enhancement for the Maldon CERT. "AV's investment in this vehicle demonstrates their ongoing support for the CERT program and our critical work in the community."

Call triple zero

CERTs are volunteer first responders who play a vital role in less populated and remote

areas of Victoria. Trained to respond to time-critical emergencies, CERT members often arrive on scene ahead of ambulances to provide immediate care. They are dispatched to incidents such as traffic accidents and medical emergencies but do not transport patients to hospital. In an emergency, locals should always call Triple Zero (000).


Vital work of volunteers

Kelli highlighted the importance of CERT volunteers in rural communities. "CERT are valued community members who serve as the

human connection between their neighbours and the health system," she said. "They are caring and committed people who sacrifice their time to put their community first."

For Maldon resident and Maldon CERT Team Leader Annette Gilham, joining the CERT team was a natural choice. "I've always had a deep connection to my community," she said. "The CERT program offered a way to directly help my neighbours in times of need. Being part of that lifeline when someone needs immediate support is incredibly fulfilling."

LIBRARY ROOF REPAIRS ON THE HORIZON

THE Maldon Athenaeum Library made a quiet announcement in its regular *TT* column on Friday: it has received funding from the Maldon & District Community Bank to repair its roof. It's such fantastic news that it deserves its own article.

The library was built in 1934 and the roof, which must protect thousands of books and historic papers from the weather, has recently been showing significant wear and tear. Library committee member Judy said: "I haven't seen any leaks myself but it's vulnerable," pointing to signs of damp on the interior walls. She said the work would be scheduled when the temperatures cool. "It involves patching rusty holes and a special coating." President Tina Fratta confirmed: "It will be a complete repair and repaint." While the Bank has been generous with this and

other grants, and the library expressed its gratitude for the support, this particular funding is for the exterior. The library, which is completely independent and reliant on memberships and its own fundraising initiatives, will seek financial assistance from other sources for maintenance to the interior of the building.

Reminder that library memberships are due now! Consider signing up; pop in to this fantastic place to find friendly volunteers, cosy reading corners, a communal table and books on every topic. The famous children's room has a variety of comfy areas, lovely light, picture-stories galore and a special shelf of contemporary 'chapter books.'

Maldon is so lucky to have this space — stay tuned to see the roof repairs happening soon.

Water report

AMBULANCE Victoria responded to reports of a water incident in Baringhup just after 4.30pm on Sunday 26 January. Paramedics treated a woman in her 30s for lower body injuries. She was flown by air ambulance helicopter to the Royal Melbourne Hospital in a stable condition.

Swimmers, sailors and jetskiers at Cairn Curran are all reminded to please be careful and mindful in and on the water.

Monitor for blue-green algae in stock water

Agriculture Victoria says livestock owners should look for signs of blue-green algae when

inspecting farm dams, troughs and other water sources, particularly during the warmer months, when algal blooms are more likely to occur. Blue-green algae, also known as cyanobacteria, are bacteria that can multiply rapidly when the water is warm and enriched with nutrients like phosphorus or nitrogen and may contain toxins that damage the liver or nervous system. Drinking contaminated water can kill livestock quickly and a number of livestock may be affected at the same time.

If a suspicious bloom is found, farmers should move their stock to an area on the property with a safe alternative water source. Farmers should plan for managing water

availability in the event that a blue-green algal bloom impacts their primary livestock drinking water supply.

Plenty of fish thanks to record stocking

The Victorian Government has released more than 66 million fish across Victoria since 2014 including golden perch, Australian bass, estuary perch, trout, salmon and dusky

flathead, so fishers can wet a line and reel in. Several Victorian lakes are open year-round, including Lake Eppalock, Rocklands Reservoir and Lake Eildon. Since 2014, Lake Eppalock alone has scored 2.4 million cod, with locals and visitors now catching increasing numbers of fish – which are likely upward of three-four years old. Several other waterways are flourishing thanks to record stocking and delivering benefits for nearby communities like Melton Reservoir, Cairn Curran, Taylors Lake near Horsham, Eildon and Lake Nillahcootie. Fire Report

MALDON Fire Brigade is grateful for a fairly quiet week while Baringhup and Newstead have had a few call-outs for various reasons. All are on alert as the temperature repeatedly heads up towards the high 30s and the environment remains very dry.

Baringhup Fire Brigade Captain Brendan McKnight advised that his team had been called out on Sunday 26 January. "It was a very small fire on the side of the road at Laanecoorie where the wheel had come off a boat trailer," he said. More troubling was the news that they had attended two fires on Tuesday 21 January in the Moolort area that may have been deliberately lit.

Newstead CFA Captain Doug Richardson reported that a semi-trailer lost its load of round hay bales on Friday 24 January and his team attended. "Basically we provided some

traffic control until police arrived and removed the fire risk from the road," he said.

On Sunday 26 January, at around 5pm and in the midst of the bustling Newstead Live Festival, the Newstead alarm rang out. "It was a grass and scrub fire in Strangways reported to us, all appliances attended and 16 members turned up," Doug explained, saying that the fire investigator attended to gather information and data but the cause of the fire is unknown. In relation to the music festival, he said that extra caution had been taken due to the high numbers of people in town and extra warning signals were used in addition to the usual bells and sirens. "The air horn was something a bit different, to catch people's attention, because we had more pedestrians than usual."

Police arrested a man in the Welshmans Reef area on Wednesday 22 January in relation to the discovery of a body in Quambatook. Detectives from the Homicide Squad charged the 67-year-old man, who was reportedly from Quambatook, and subsequently charged him with murder.

Cairn Curran: needle warning

A local family has posted a warning on social media after finding two needles, which they believed were drug related, in the sand beside Cairn Curran Reservoir. Swimmers and visitors who plan to sit on the embankment, particularly those with small children, are warned to carefully inspect the area before settling in with a picnic.

Chicken farm pushback

Some locals have expressed grievances regarding applications to Central Goldfields Shire Council (CGSC) for the development of three new broiler farms in the Baringhup and Moolort areas. The front page of the *Maryborough Advertiser* (Friday 24 January) declared that in total, the plans have received over 40 objections from nearby residents. A spokesperson from CGSC told the *Tarrangower Times* that Council will decide in due course, saying: "The applications will be heard and considered by the council at an appropriate point in time but there is no clear timeframe for this currently."

Back to school!

For readers who do not have to worry about shuffling kids off to school each day, this is a reminder to slow down and stay alert when driving past our local schools.

For families with children, the return to school routine can cause mixed feelings. Kids

are navigating learning environments and social challenges, while parents and carers are juggling finances and busy schedules.

Positive Parenting Program 'Triple P' pointed to research from the Australian Council for Educational Research revealing that Australia has the highest level of bullying compared to other OECD countries, with one in six students being bullied at school, sometimes with devastating outcomes.

Triple P recommends that families build children's ability to face setbacks by encouraging activities that they enjoy or are good at, engage in open communication by asking non-judgemental, open ended questions about school and recognise changes in behaviour that may indicate bullying such as school refusal. Resources for families include school counsellors and kidshelpline.com.au. To assist with the cost-of-living pressures that come with paying for equipment and activities ahead of the 2025 school year, the State Government announced last week that it is again providing a School Saving Bonus to eligible families. The \$400 bonus can be used in the lead up to the start of Term 1 and beyond to buy school uniforms and textbooks or can go towards school activities such as camps or excursions.

Notice for antique enthusiasts

As the next Maldon Antique Fair rolls around, the organiser has a few requests for keen attendees. Mark Blythe from Maldon Events asks that all caravans and vehicles park in appropriate and legal locations, regardless of how excited and early they are. Mount Alexander Shire Council warns that camping in the wrong place may attract a fine, pointing out that Butts Reserve campground is free and accessible. Mark wrote on social media: 'Please, do not clog the local streets.' He also reminded eager antiquers to save their cash in

advance to avoid cleaning out the local bank's ATM during the fair, which takes place at Maldon's Bill Woodfull Oval on Saturday 15 and Sunday 16 February.

Australia Day Honour

Mount Alexander Shire Resident Lynette Maskell has been awarded a Medal of the Order of Australia (OAM) in the General Division for services to the community of the Brighton region. The Elphinstone local and former primary school teacher has an exceptional list of community activities to her credit with groups including Rotary Club of Brighton Beach, Urban Life Savers and education programs in the Philippines and Arnhem Land.

Baringhup Farmers help deliver hope

COLIN and Doug Jennings are involved in the Aussie Hay Runners in a big way. On Friday 24 January at 5.30am the first truck arrived at their Carram Dale Farm, Baringhup for loading. Doug and Colin loaded 820 round bales on 24 trucks that day. All up they loaded a total of 1,200 round bales of their hay onto 35 trucks over the three-day Australia Day long weekend.

The Carram Dale hay bales are a big part of the 3,630 bales of hay being transported by the Aussie Hay Runners to drought-stricken farmers in South Australia. "The hay is mainly

going to the drought-affected mid-north SA, west of the Murray River and as far west as Ceduna," said Doug. "It's been a massive logistical operation, but it's great to be a part of it. Aussie spirit at its best from all involved."

After loading up, the trucks gathered at Bridgewater Friday evening before heading to Peterborough South Australia on Saturday. From there the hay will be delivered to 130 plus farms across 11 Local Government Areas of South Australia.

Contain your excitement for the CDS

THE Container Deposit Scheme (CDS) is simpler than it seems and provides a great way for folks to recycle while supporting local community groups. All you need to do is drop off your containers to the local depot and they will send the funds across to a registered group of your choice. Note that there are a few small conditions, read on!

How and What

The CDS is run by VISY, the packaging company, who suggests that the first step is to collect small containers eligible for a 10 cent refund when returned. Most small beverage containers between 150mL and 3L can be returned and are identified by a 10c mark on the label. Examples include aluminium cans, plastic and glass bottles, plus juice and milk boxes under one litre. Containers should be uncrushed and lids can be kept on. Note that containers without the 10c mark may still be acceptable for recycling in your kerbside recycling bin.

Return for refund

Once the containers have been collected, they can be returned to a CDS refund point. Residents in the Tarrengower region from Walmer to Newstead should deposit their used containers with Steve from SP Machinery and Hardware, the hardware shop at 14 Main Street, Maldon. Steve says it makes life easier if they can be sorted into types and handed directly to him or his staff. "It's easier for us to count out," he said. "Anything that's got the ten cent return mark on it."

Other drop-off options include Chewton Service Station at 37 Pyrenees Highway and Asteria Services at 64-68 Nelson Street, Maryborough. There is also a location in Baringhup known locally as the 'big white bag,' adjacent to the Baringhup Hall (from which Steve in Maldon also collects).

Who receives the refund

The wonderful thing about this scheme is that you can pocket the refund or nominate your favourite community group as a recipient. The catch is that the group must be registered with VISY. If you deposit in 'the big white bag' your refunds will be distributed to Baringhup Landcare Group, Baringhup CFA or the Baringhup Community Committee. If you take your containers directly to Steve in Maldon,

he can refund to his current list of community groups as listed below:

- Maldon Bowling Club
- Maldon Brass Band
- Maldon and District Fire Brigade
- Maldon Football Netball Club
- Maldon Neighbourhood Centre and Maldon Pantry
- Maldon RSL

- Maldon Swimming Pool
- Maldon Tennis Club

If your preferred group is not shown, they can be registered via the VISY website.

NO this is not about the singer, but the artist Julie Andrews whose landscapes are both mysterious and meditations on the early evening or twilight time, when everything is softer and dream like. They are on show at Cascade Art Gallery in a highly desirable exhibition of work to be opened on Saturday 1 February at 2pm by Stephen Turpie, a former lecturer in painting and drawing at Latrobe University.

Cascade Gallery Director Kareen Anchen has written, 'In this body of work Julie Andrews explores mornings and evenings in her central Victorian environs with an eye for the transient effects of light on the landscape. The art works venture into the twilight, blurring the line between the recognisable and the imagined, an amalgam of reconstructed fictions, dreams, memories, feelings and experiences.'

On a very hot day, I wandered down the hill to meet Julie in the delightfully cool gallery

to learn more. Her journey from doing a Master of Arts (Art in Public Space) with High Distinction at RMIT in Melbourne, way back in 2014 to various other degrees in Bendigo, Sunderland in the UK, Sydney and Ballarat to name a few. Her path to this exhibition is quite varied to say the least. In the past she has painted murals and organised interactive exhibitions as part of her public art roles, as well as exhibited both here and overseas, winning various awards, grants and prizes. In fact, there seems to be nothing she hasn't done, including residencies in places like Singapore, Melbourne, Shanghai and Sunderland in the UK. You name it, Julie has done it.

This exhibition took two years to complete, as Julie went out to capture the mystery and gentle peaceful moments of twilight. All her work is painted in oil on canvas except the largest work titled *Morning Light* which is oil on linen. Julie said she generally paints from

nine in the morning until seven or eight at night with a break for a walk occasionally, when her thinking about what she is painting happens. She always stands to paint moving back and forth from her easel to appraise her work. She relooks at the painting the next day to decide whether she is happy with the result.

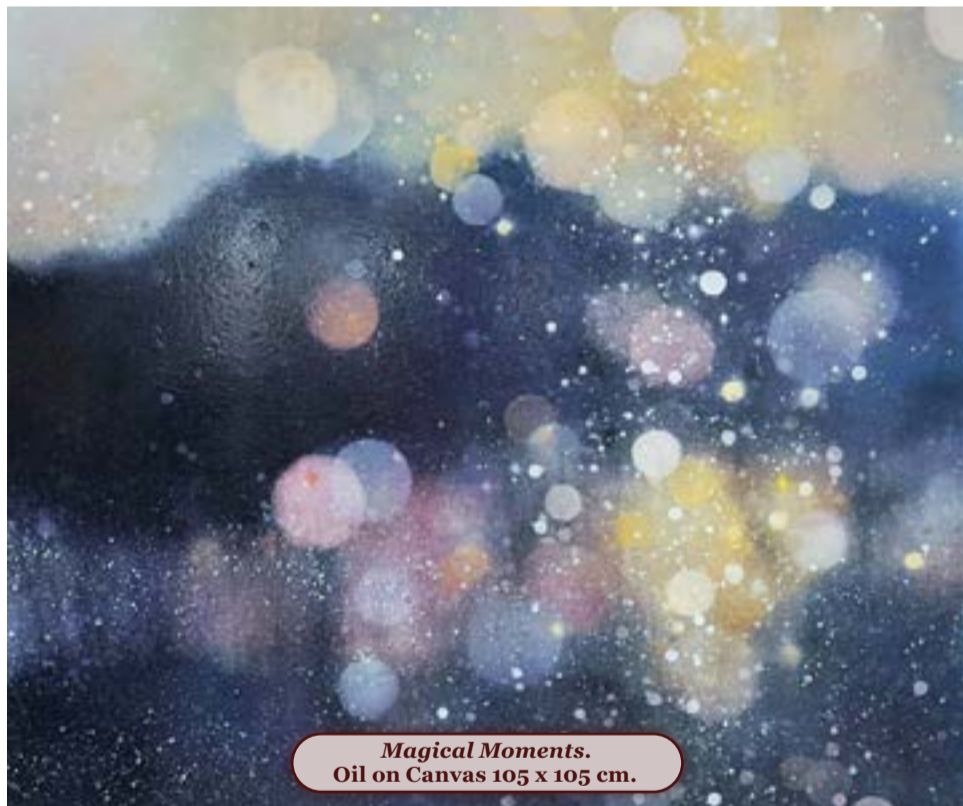
As Kate Gamble recently wrote so succinctly about Julie's previous exhibition at Cascade ... 'Julie's works aren't precisely located, rather they are a kind of any place, one that's only partially apprehended, as if we're moving through, on our way somewhere else. Often these are recognisable, but don't so much evoke a place as a sensation.'

Rather than being full of layered meaning, Julie seeks to use an equally dense and rich backdrop of theory often psychological, along with her particular manipulation of materials, to evoke a state of being.'

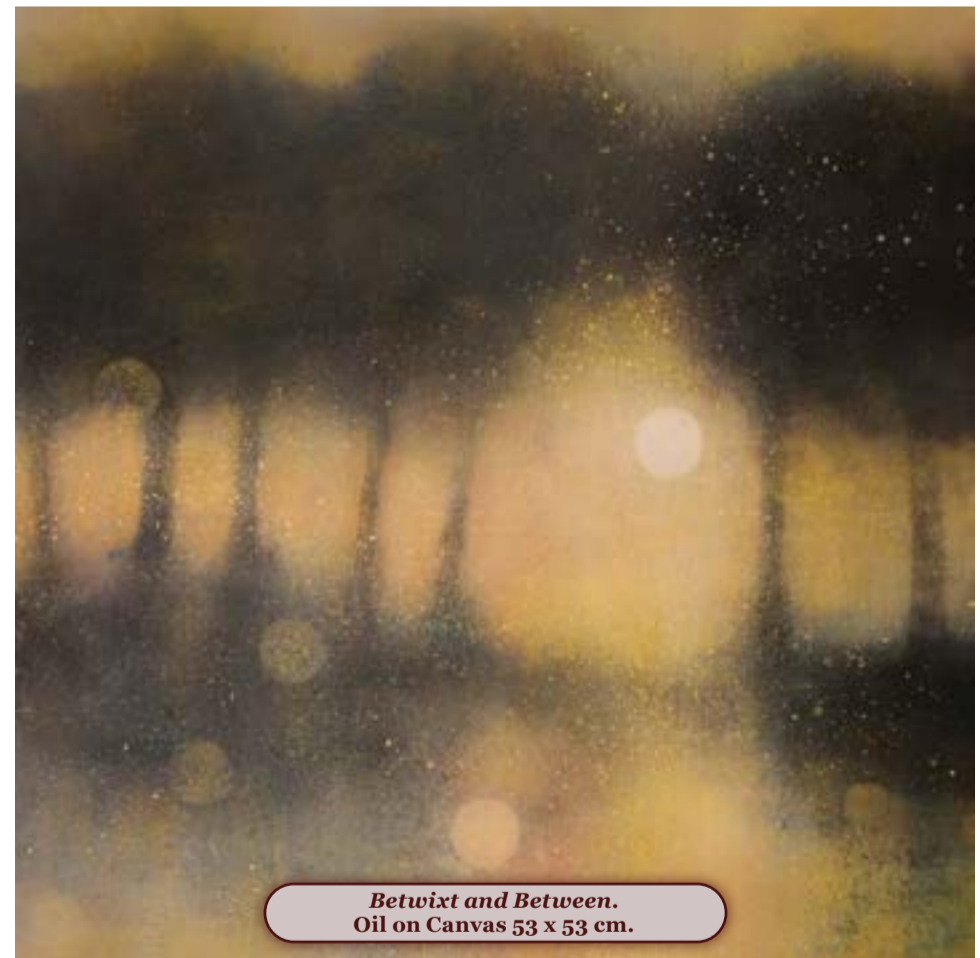
Kareen says, "Julie is a very physical artist and moves paint around with gusto. It is at times literally thrown over the canvas leaving explosive divots, splashes and energetic marks and paint craters that 'form a skin', sometimes highly glossy smooth, other times not so. Mediums and glazes have been worked and reworked in a manipulative manner, more akin to a sculptor modelling a three-dimensional form, often achieving unique and sublime results'.

So come to the opening at the Cascade Art Gallery tomorrow at 2pm, to see the dream like images Julie has created with her sometimes whimsical titles, such as *Betwixt and Between*.

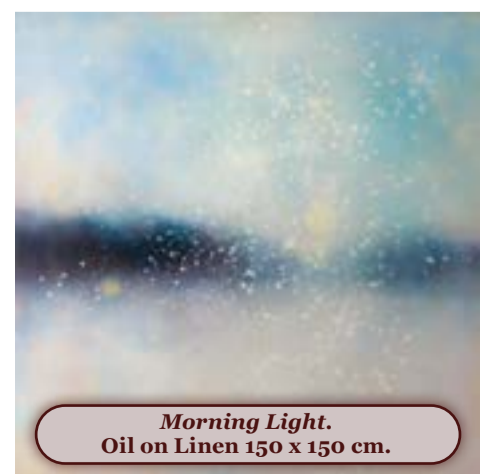

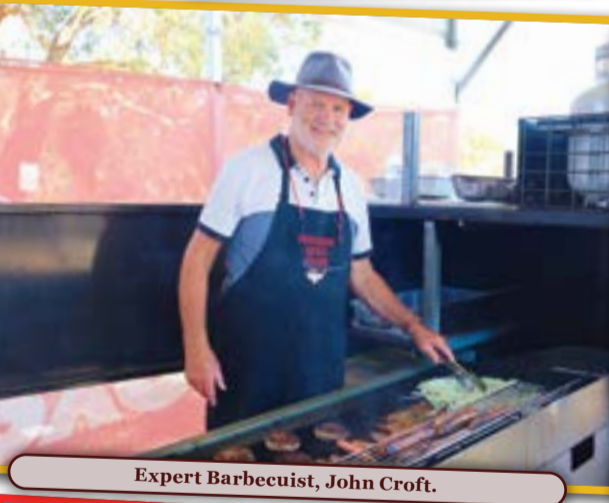

Lunar new year of the snake

ONE of the most wonderful legacies of the Victorian Gold Rush is the enduring influence of the Chinese miners who journeyed here en masse to seek their fortunes.

While the remaining traces are fainter in Maldon and surrounds than in the larger gold centres of Bendigo and Ballarat, we can still see hints in the local cemeteries (and perhaps even architectural details of Main Street*).

Celestials

What better opportunity to remember the intrepid Chinese gold diggers than Lunar New Year? It takes place from Wednesday 29 January and culminates on Wednesday 12 February when the full moon appears. This

significant celebration — which is observed by many of Australia's nearest neighbours including Indonesia, Vietnam, Singapore and of course, China — involves preparatory cleaning, sharing meals and distributing gifts of cash in little red packets.

2025 is the Year of the Snake, which represents resilience, resourcefulness, determination and strategic thinking, all qualities that might come to mind when reflecting upon those Chinese miners. They were called 'Celestials' by nineteenth century Europeans after an ancient word for their homeland (meaning 'heavenly dynasty') and while it sounds lovely, the word was used in a derogatory manner because the Chinese were thoroughly resented.

They worked in cooperatives, shared household and digging labour, worked endlessly and stuck together (in fact they were legally required to live away from everyone else). They also found gold in places where Europeans had missed it, which must have been infuriating! Maps in Christopher Creek's book, *A Rich Vein* (2015, Eaglehawk Press), indicates 'Chinese Reworkings' located in Porcupine Flat and numerous Chinese camps in Eagle Hawk Gully, to Maldon's north. Creek describes conflict and contempt between the Chinese and the European diggers, partly due to cultural differences, suggesting that the 'Celestials' were eventually run out of town by a drunken mob. Better to remember the Chinese for their market gardens and fresh produce, while the 1876 Maldon Easter Parade reportedly featured a Chinese dragon (sadly, no photos exist of what must have been a magnificent sight).

Significant snakes

People born in the Year of the Snake are thought to possess ophidian (snakey) qualities. Seen through western eyes, snakes seem cunning, threatening and are associated with temptation; while Asian cultures add graceful, intuitive, intelligent and charismatic to the list (Kipling's python comes to mind). 'Chairman' Mao Zedong was verifiably a wicked serpent born under this sign and benevolent 'snakes' include Mahatma Ghandi and Anne Frank, Bob Dylan and Taylor Swift. Womanising artist Pablo Picasso, born in Year of the Snake 1881, was as complex and slippery as a bag of snakes.

Where to celebrate

Drumming and firecrackers will signal the start of the new year and there are events not

too far away for everyone to enjoy. The Bendigo Chinese Association will present a free community event at Dai Gum San (adjacent to the Golden Dragon Museum on Bridge Street, Bendigo) on Saturday 1 February from 4pm - 8pm. Look out for community cultural performances and those cheeky, dancing lions! Also nearby is the Great Stupa of Universal Compassion (25 Sandhurst Town Road, Myers Flat) which offers free activities every day throughout the Lunar New Year period including workshops, talks and traditional lion dances.

Snake season

Our unique position in regional Victoria means that we can celebrate the Year of the Snake but we must remain ever mindful of real, deadly, killer snakes. Safety steps start with avoidance — stick to the path and wear long pants and covered shoes when walking. Always take your phone with you! At home, trim the lawn and clear debris like woodpiles and rocks that could provide shelter. If you see a snake, don't mess with it — they will usually not attack unless provoked. If you need to move a snake, call an expert: search for 'licensed snake catcher' on the internet.

Snakebite steps

If you suffer the misfortune of a snakebite? In summary: lie down, stay still and call Triple Zero (000). If you have a helper, they can apply a tight bandage near the bite and take note of the time, while monitoring and caring for you. A more detailed guide can be found at: tinyurl.com/yycynh8j.

Australia Day

Uncle Rick then conducted a Welcome to Country ceremony in an Aboriginal language. Whilst impressive, most of us remain puzzled as to who was being welcomed. The Citizen Ceremony finally commenced and was conducted with dignity by the Mayor. Embarrassingly, she had to advise the audience that she was authorised to conduct the ceremony despite her mayoral regalia being locked in her office (Oops!). We were repeatedly advised to respect the fact that 'today is a day of grief for many Aboriginal people' and hence the event is also a Survival Day activity.

The whole event was spoiled by the repetitious advice by dignitaries about Aboriginal

custodianship of the land. Despite the large number of speakers, there was little recognition of Australia Day and none of the speakers spoke enthusiastically about our great country and the massive progress that we have achieved since 26 January 1788. The event was dominated by Survival Day content and as far as a celebration of Australia Day, I have been to funerals that were more exciting.

This year, Australians have overwhelmingly endorsed 26 January as our national day of celebration. We have also made it clear that we reject divisive agendas such as the Voice. Perhaps our new and old Council members need to be trained on the meaning of democracy and that conducting Survival Day on our national day is offensive and inappropriate. No wonder 99.9% of the Shire's population repeatedly shun the Victory Park event.

... are the dominant hues of the plains country at present.

Large, noisy flocks of Galahs and corellas (a mix of Long-billed and smaller numbers of Little Corellas), are feeding in stubble. Each flock tends to be dominated by either Galahs or Long-billed Corellas with many recently fledged birds apparent.

Of note were sightings of three Cockatiels, first a single then two birds some minutes later. This species is an irregular visitor from inland regions.

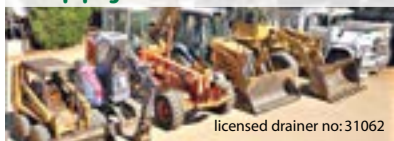

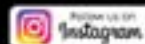

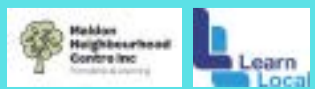

The car that changed the world

BACK in 1923, when our subject for this week, the T-model Ford, was built, the world was a different place.

The first model Ts came off the production line in 1908. Back then, most car manufacturers were pitching to the wealthy. Part of Ford's genius was to recognise that the real future was in making the 'new invention' of the automobile accessible to the masses. The savings from mass production allowed the price to decline from \$780 in 1910 (equivalent to \$25,506 in 2023) to \$290 in 1924 (\$5,156 in 2023 dollars).

You've probably noticed by now that I'm a student of history, but events and inventions need to be put in perspective before they become meaningful or interesting.

The average wage for a Clerk was about \$1,700 PA by 1923, so the Model T at \$290 or about 17% of a typical annual salary. This is roughly similar to today's numbers relatively, but when it was first introduced, it was more like a full year's wage. So, in the 13 years from 1910 to 1923, the Model T had become affordable to the average wage earner and by the time its run ended, there had been around FIFTEEN MILLION produced. That's a lot of cars.

The population of the USA in 1923 was 110 million, so you can see that the age of personal ownership of the car had arrived. We also have to remember that obviously Ford wasn't the only car manufacturer, but

our Dodge Doodlebug from the last article sold for approximately twice as much as a Model T when new. This was in an era of significant social change, at least partly brought on by the First World War, which had just ended. Most significant was the role of women in society. Women got the right to vote in the USA in 1928, Australia in 1902 and the UK in 1918. Times were changing. Cars were seen as a symbol of freedom and independence and women were embracing the new technology.

The world completely changed in the twentieth century and so much of it started with a Model T like the one in the Maldon Vintage Machinery and Museum.

BLAST FROM THE PAST

The neereman aboriginal protectorate



IN 1838 George Gipps, Governor of New South Wales, established an Aboriginal Protectorate in the Port Phillip District with the aim of encouraging Indigenous people to settle in prescribed areas and so minimise conflict between them and British squatters. It was hoped that the Indigenous people would adopt Christianity and a settled agricultural way of life.

Gipps appointed as Chief Protector George Augustus Robinson, who had been responsible for the removal to Flinders Island of those few Tasmanian Aboriginal survivors of the Black Wars. Four Assistant Protectors were also appointed. One of these, Edward Stone Parker, was made responsible for the Loddon district.

Parker, a Methodist minister, had never met an Aboriginal person when in late 1838 he arrived in Sydney with his wife Mary and their six sons. They immediately travelled to Melbourne and soon after, Parker established a temporary base on Jackson's Creek near the present site of Sunbury. From this site, the inexperienced Parker tried to deal with the many conflicts between Indigenous people and squatters that arose as Europeans and their livestock moved rapidly inland.

Parker soon realised that he needed a permanent station more centrally located in the area he was responsible for. In September 1840 he left his base at Jackson's Creek, travelling with Yerrebulluk, a Dja Dja Wurrung man who he referred to as his 'native attendant'. Together they visited an outstation of William Mollison's run near Lalgambok (Mount Franklin) before moving on to the Loddon near what is now Newstead. Along the way Parker investigated several claims of Aboriginal attacks on shepherds' huts.

Parker and Yerrebulluk then proceeded down the Loddon looking for a suitable site for a station. Parker finally chose one at a place known by the Dja Dja Wurrung as Neura Mong, (now Neereman). This was on the northern side of the Loddon east of Hamilton's Crossing. The area is still known as Parker's Plains.

Parker moved to Neereman in early November 1840 with several Aboriginal children who were in his care. Over the next few weeks, many of the Dja Dja Wurrung visited him. Parker's station, however, was in the middle of a run claimed by squatters William Darlot, Henry Dutton and Donald Simson. While they had no legal right to the land, the squatters resented Parker occupying such a prime site on the river and campaigned to have him removed.

In June 1841 Parker left Nerreman and, accompanied by a large number of Dja Dja Wurrung, moved to Larnebarrumul (now Franklinton) where he established a new protectorate. This station continued to operate until the protectorate system was dismantled in 1849. Parker remained at Franklinton working with a small group of Dja Dja Wurrung farmers. He died there in 1865.

Library reviews

***The Booklover's Library* by Madeline Martin, 2024**

In Nottingham, England, widow Emma Taylor finds herself in desperate need of a job to provide for herself and her daughter, Olivia. But with the legal restrictions prohibiting widows with children from most employment opportunities, she's left with only one option: persuading the manageress at Boots' Booklover's Library to take a chance on her.

When the threat of war becomes a reality, Olivia must be evacuated to the countryside. In her daughter's absence, Emma seeks solace in the unlikely friendships she forms with her neighbours and coworkers, as well as the recommendations she provides to the library's quirky regulars. But the job doesn't come without its difficulties. Books are mysteriously misshelved and disappearing, and her work forces her to confront the memories of her late father and the bookstore they once owned together before a terrible accident.

***Prettier if She Smiled* by Toni Jordan, 2023**

As the eldest child in a single-parent family, Kylie's always had more important things on her mind than smiling. Controlling her job, her home, her romantic life and most importantly, her family, takes all her concentration. She's always succeeded, though, because that's who Kylie is.

Until one Monday morning, when Kylie discovers the local pharmacy where she works is being taken over by a huge corporation, putting her stable job at risk. This leads to a cascade of disasters: her boyfriend is acting suspiciously and she finds herself caring for a high-maintenance Pomeranian. When her fiercely independent mother breaks an ankle and needs help, it's up to Kylie, as usual, to fix things. She reluctantly packs her bags, but back in her childhood home, things start to unravel. Could it be that Kylie's carefully curated life is not so perfect after all?

***Unfinished Woman: A Memoir* by Robyn Davidson, 2023**

In 1977, while she was in her twenties, Robyn Davidson set off with a dog and four camels to cross 1,700 miles of Australian desert to the sea.

A life of almost constant travelling followed: from the Outback to Sydney's underworld; from 60s street life, to the London literary scene; from migrating with nomads in India and Tibet, to marrying an Indian prince. The only territory she avoided was the past. In *Unfinished Woman*, she ventures into that unknown, unearthing an ache for a lost but barely remembered mother and an unmet desire to feel at home in her freedom.

***Cold Enough for Snow* by Jessica Au, 2022**

A mother and daughter travel from abroad to meet in Tokyo: they walk along the canals through the autumn evenings, escape the typhoon rains, share meals in small cafes and restaurants and visit galleries to see some of the city's most radical modern art. All the while, they talk: about the weather, horoscopes, clothes and objects, about family, distance and memory. But uncertainties abound. Who is really speaking here - is it only the daughter? And what is the real reason behind this elliptical, perhaps even spectral journey?
