small, but enthusiastic, group of Maldon bike riders has just finished its winter ride program. They went out most Tuesdays, despite the weather (well, not always) on 18 occasions for the 'Tour de Bakery'. The route varied each week and involved return trips from Maldon to Dunolly, Bridgewater, Maryborough, Harcourt/Castlemaine, Leanganook (Mt Alexander), Lalgambook (Mt Franklin),

Curran via Newstead. Distances were from 50 to 105 km and generally involved a stop at a bakery (or two) for coffee and cake.

# Council election results declared



RESULTS for the 2024 local government election were declared by the election manger for Mount Alexander Shire Kelvin Tory on Friday 9 November at the Council Chamber in Castlemaine. A small gathering of supporters and constituents joined key council officers, as each of the successful candidates gave a short speech.

The successful candidate for Barkers Creek Ward was Rosie Annear, who is returning after being elected unopposed. "I'm happy to be back and to work with some new colleagues," she said.

Also returning to council is Tony Cordy, candidate for **Calder Ward**, who won with 57.61% after preferences were distributed. He said, "Thanks to all the people involved in running the election. It's a great council and it's very rewarding work."

Bill Maltby was successful in Campbells Creek Ward, winning with 58.36% of first preference votes to return him to his council position. "I'm sure we'll work well together and work for the betterment of the shire," he said to the other elected candidates.

New candidate Phillip Walker won in Coliban Ward with 52.18% of the votes after preferences were distributed. His speech acknowledged the efforts of the other two ward candidates and the outgoing councillor, Christine Henderson. He went on to say: "I'm not looking for short term gains, I'm looking for strategic shifts."

Toby Heydon won Forest Creek Ward unopposed for his first term on Council. "We're going to work hard together and we'll have some robust debates," he said. "I acknowledge all the great work of the outgoing council."

Returning as the successful candidate of Loddon River Ward is Matt Driscoll, who was elected unopposed. The former mayor offered special congratulations to the new councillors. "One of the most important things is being able to debate with open heart and open mind and listen to each other," he said. "I'm looking forward to working with you all."

New candidate Lucas Maddock won Moonlight Creek Ward unopposed. "I felt like I was pretty connected to the community before but this process seems to have taken it to a whole new level. It's an engaged, creative, passionate and progressive community," he said. "It's clear that it has been a high-functioning council, I look forward to maintaining that momentum."

Rosalie Hastwell, successful new candidate for Tarrengower Ward, was also elected unopposed. "It's a privilege to be here; it's exciting, it's slightly surreal," she said. "It is an honour to be standing on Djaara Country and part of Mount Alexander Shire. Shout out to my relatively new community in Maldon. Thanks to everyone and here we go!"

Council Chief Executive Darren Fuzzard concluded the official proceedings by providing welcome packs to the successful candidates, saying; "We look forward to the next four years working with you." Full election results can be found at: tinyurl.com/mvnauwbn.



When campaigning to be elected I was often asked 'well what will you do for us?' In four years' time I would like people to be saying, well what did we achieve together and what can we learn from it?'



I take a holistic view that everything is connected. People talk about Council being the 3 Rs and there is truth in that, and Council generally does a good job here, but Council also has a bigger role. Climate change is the umbrella issue because if we do not deal with that then everything else falls down. Having spent three decades as a community development professional working in many countries, how Council relates to and works with communities is a prime issue for me. Council does good work, but I would like to see it deepened because residents are the core of our society. While my focus is thinking about the legacy for the next generations, part of that is coming to terms with the past. That includes historical societies, but importantly Council has a role working with Traditional owners as the State Treaty negotiations progress. Arts and sports are obvious big interest items for our residents.

I'm thinking through (plans for staying in touch with constituents). Listening Posts are one mechanism, but I would like to go beyond that to find a way for ongoing interaction. Social media is appalling for informed discussion as it is just an arena where people vent. Possibly a WhatsApp group might work. I think regular community forums is one way, along with consistent engagement with existing community organisations. Plus, there are our community newspapers such as Chewton Chat and Taradale Talk.

I swim. It clears the head and is meditative. I like going bush and camping. I love blues and jazz music, a good book (either fact or sci-fi), and too much sport on TV. I laugh a lot.

We only take rescue dogs. Our current two came to us when we were living in the Kimberley.

A parcel of land that has been part of Maldon Railway Station since the 1880s has been advertised for sale, with expressions of interest closing last Thursday 7 November according to the listing.

The property at 14 Reef Street, which is adjacent to a railway access road and train maintenance sheds, is being offered for sale for the first time, having been leased in recent years by the Victorian Goldfields Railway. The land is owned by the Victorian Government and managed by its transport land, assets and infrastructure department, VicTrack.

Steve Strangward, chair of Railway and Tramway Heritage Victoria, which is the representative body for the 19 Victorian rail and tram operators and museums in the state, has expressed concerns about the ramifications for railway operations. "I'm concerned about that land being sold without the approval of existing leaseholders," he said.

President of Victorian Goldfields Railway (VGR) Robert Lee told the TT that the

proposed sale originally caused uneasiness within his organisation, which manages the station precinct. The block's boundary lines have since been altered by VicTrack and the land for sale no longer includes the station driveway. The VGR now accepts the current smaller parcel has less of an immediate impact on the railway. "There are already residents on Reef Street," Robert said. "And we will still have clear access, which was originally a worry to us."

The sale also raises broader questions around the apparent rezoning by Council of the block, which is being advertised as General Residential zone. Furthermore, the reasoning behind the sale of this heritage asset by the State Government is not clear. The Tarrangower Times has approached both Mount Alexander Shire Council and VicTrack to ask questions about the process and community consultation that has been undertaken prior to advertising the sale.

# Shelbourne farm fire

TRUCKS from Maldon, Baringhup, Woodstock, Bridgewater and Kangaroo Flat Fire Brigades attended a fire at Shelbourne on Blossoms Hill Road on Monday 4 November.

Bruce Clements 1st Lieutenant (Acting Captain) Maldon said the fire was ignited while a farmer was carting rolls of hay, possibly by the truck exhaust. "About eight trucks arrived, all told," he said. "The load was pulled apart and doused." He estimates that the fire took around two and half hours to control.

Maldon CFA alerted the community on Facebook, but some users of a private group noticed that the notification appeared a few hours later after volunteer group moderators had approved the post. Lt. Clements said this was a timely reminder to not rely on Facebook for fire emergencies. "Facebook can be a very useful tool but it has its limitations," he said. He recommends the VicEmergency app and says: "Be sure to set your parameters to 50km at a minimum in the app. If you set it less than that, it doesn't give you much time to do anything if it is something big."

Bruce also recommends the Vicfires app, which covers all of Victoria. Fire Restrictions commenced in Mount Alexander Shire on Monday 11 November. See cfa.vic.gov.au/ home/local-information.

# Home intruders target sports cars

LEADING Senior Constable David Rose, of Maldon Police Station has confirmed that an aggravated burglary took place at a residential address in Maldon two weeks ago. He said the resident disturbed a male in her kitchen in the early hours of the morning, after being alerted by her dog. Words were exchanged and the intruder fled.

LSC Rose said the incident was property-related and similar to other recent offences across greater central Victoria, in which late model sports cars such as Audis, BMWs and

Mercedes have been targeted. "I can only stress that people need to secure their premises, use sensor lighting, use CCTV and soundly lock their cars." Maryborough detectives have an ongoing investigation into this and similar



REMEMBRANCE Day was honoured in Newstead on Monday. The service at Memorial Reserve (near The Red


Shed) marked the anniversary of the Armistice that ended
















THE annual Remembrance Day service hosted by Maldon RSL at the Cenotaph on Monday 11 November attracted numerous attendees, including grade five and six students from Maldon Primary School.

Commencing with a minute's silence, the service proceeded with Maldon RSL President Kevin Moschetti acknowledging Traditional Owners of the land. He then provided an overview of some key dates in the establishment of the Remembrance Day tradition that is carried on today. The observing of a period of silence for respect and reflection was first suggested by an Australian journalist in 1919, he explained, while the state funeral of The Unknown Warrior at Westminster Abbey in 1920 solidified the tradition of holding services on 11 November. An Unknown Australian Soldier was reinterred from France to the Australian War Memorial on 11 November 1993, again highlighting and reigniting the date for the public.

Since 2011, Maldon RSL and Maldon Primary School has held a poetry competition to celebrate excellence in expressing the ANZAC spirit. The poems are displayed alongside photos and artworks on the fence at the school and this year's winner Athena read her moving poem at the memorial service.

Veteran Keith Stancombe laid the wreath and Zoe Boyd, the floral artist who created it, spoke beautifully about the significance and symbolism of the flowers and the day. She spoke about being too young to know what it is like to go to war, and "being thankful that I don't have a reason to be afraid of lightning or fireworks and being able to look at a field of poppies" without reviving terrible memories.

Meanwhile, the Maldon Cemetery Trust (MCT) had spent Sunday 10 November placing Australian Flags on the graves of former service members. MCT committee member Rhiannon Govier spoke about the importance of introducing younger people to the significance of the cemetery, noting that she has five generations of forebears buried there. "It's very meaningful, this whole cemetery," she said. Her son Will Govier from Maldon Primary School, here with grandmother Jenni McKenzie, swept and cleaned the grave and headstone of his great-grandfather before proudly placing a flag.














# Epic, ambitious new prints by accomplished Printmaker David Frazer is now open.

CAROLINE Field - Curator, Australian Catholic University Art Collection and esteemed arts writer, opened David Frazer's exhibition in Maldon recently at Cascade Art Gallery. For those who were unable to make the event, here is an excerpt from her speech notes. Caroline shares with us thoughtful, intelligent insights into the Art of David Frazer which she clearly knows and understands so very well.

"Each print embodies personal, often whimsical traits, conveying a sense of empathy and a reassuring reminder that everything will be alright.

David's art honours the dignity and positive dimensions of human nature, celebrating the warmth of relationships and the joy found in shared experiences.

Yet, interwoven within this tapestry of light, there exists a shadowy undercurrent that invites viewers to contemplate the deeper complexities of life.

Much of his work draws upon song lyrics that revel in complex human experiences, exploring the nuances of poetry and visual expression.

Interestingly, David initially envisioned a career as a songwriter or rock star; however, fate led him to substitute classic, heartbreaking ballads for vivid narrative illustrations.

Over the past 30 years, he has dedicated himself to the art of printmaking, where the impact of carefully chosen words resonates through his powerful prints.

This extraordinary body of work emerges from collaborations with iconic singer-songwriters Paul Kelly, Nick Cave, and Tom Waits, blending their lyrical depth with his artistic vision.

Through this fascinating medium, David thoughtfully explores themes of love, the human condition, melancholy, and the passage of time.

In this exhibition, the tree emerges as a vital motif; standing solitary or entwined with another, David likens trees to people, believing they too have personal stories to tell.

The linocut *Free* depicts a relinquished, pre-loved couch alongside a solitary tree which is replete with signs of presence and occupation, while *Fallen* captures the excruciating snap of a delicate tree against the dark foliage of a dense thicket.




The expansive etching *Time Passes Together* powerfully reflects the passage of time encased in time honoured canopy. The monumental linocut, *Walking for solace IV*, strikes at the heart of those seeking relief from the maddening crowd. The clouds are as heavy as the dense foliage below.

Far from creating pretty scenes, David favours the stark beauty of mundane rural landscapes, allowing a strong graphic narrative to take centre stage. His imagery evokes a profound sense of nostalgia, imbuing his work with noble beauty, as seen in works like *Just Like the Old Days*, and *In the Garden*.

His work oscillates between tenderness, wit, and sombre reflection. As he states, "My latest work portrays the hands of time—getting old, aches and pains, life's journey with family, and the solace of nature and love in the face of fear and uncertainty."

# **Bite Size News and Opportunities**

### Gold mines in the news

An earthquake that originated in the north-east of Bendigo was recorded by Geoscience Australia on Tuesday 5 November at 6.41am. According to the Geoscience mapping, it was felt across s large area of central Victoria, including Castlemaine and Maldon. The Seismology Research Centre described it as a magnitude 3.5 event on the Richter scale. Not long after the event, Fosterville Gold Mine posted on social media that it had 'experienced a mine-induced seismic event' which seems to be an articulate way to say that the mine had caused the earthquake. The Mine, which is owned by a Canadian company, invited residents to attend a meeting at 8.30am on that same day to discuss the earth tremor.

Meanwhile, the Kaiser Reef mine in Maldon was the subject of a profile in *The Age* newspaper on Saturday 10 November, which discussed the soaring prices of gold and new technology to recycle waste-water in gold processing. The article said that Kaiser Reef is preparing to resume mining in Maldon after a six-year maintenance period, now that the price of gold is making it worthwhile to dig again.

Carisbrook Football Netball Club and Maryborough Football Netball Club Inc are amongst the winners of the State Government's TAC (Transport Accident Commission) Club Rewards program, which is for community football and netball clubs to help eliminate deaths and serious injuries on the road. In 2024 the rewards focused on speeding, with each club eligible for up to \$10,000 worth of funding.

A Maryborough drop-in centre for parents has been recognised by the Victorian Early Years Awards, which honours outstanding people and programs that support and nurture our youngest Victorians. Go Goldfields runs a centre in Maryborough called The Nest, which focuses on building confident and capable parents in a safe and supportive environment. It was awarded for 'Supporting Parents to Build their Capacity and Confidence'

### Nationals release financial plan

The National Party in Victoria has launched a financial plan called 'Our Plan For Financial Integrity,' saying they will manage taxpayers' money better in order to better deliver what really matters to constituents. The party states that it will deliver a Charter for Budget Honesty, ensuring every budget is transparent with clear, enforceable rules that hold the government accountable for every dollar spent. The announcement also says the National Party will also give taxpayers the power to track funds, and where it's spent, in real time through a Public Expenditure Tracker. It says it will also institute an Intergenerational Report, akin to a financial roadmap, released every five years "so future generations aren't burdened by the decisions of today".

### Landcare fighting for a fair go

Landcare Victoria Inc, the peak body for Landcare in Victoria, has launched an advocacy campaign calling on the State Government to invest \$48 million into the Victorian Landcare Facilitator Program (VLFP) over the next four years. Landcare Victoria Inc. Chair Jane Carney said that without longer-term and greater funding, the future of the VLFP is at risk.

"Critical to the success of Landcare are our 80 local facilitators and 10 regional coordinators who harness the power of tens of thousands of volunteers across more than 600 Victorian Landcare groups," Mrs Carney said. Landcare says the work of facilitators has massive environmental, social and economic benefits. However, inadequate funding and lack of support has led to issues including dissatisfaction with remuneration structures and role insecurity for facilitators. These issues threaten the longevity and effectiveness of the program.

### Fire planning for farmers

Agriculture Victoria is reminding farmers to update their farm plan, saying it can help protect your home, livestock and vital farm infrastructure. It will also help identify what you need to do and when you need to do it in preparation for the upcoming fire season. ### Call for driver organ donor register

The National Party Member for Northern Victoria Gaelle Broad has called on the State Government to act on a report to increase organ donation rates and allow Victorians to register on the Australian Organ Donor Register when applying for or renewing a driver licence.

"In March this year the Legislative Assembly Legal and Social Issues Committee released their report about increasing the number of organ and tissue donors in Victoria," Ms Broad told Parliament. "The report makes recommendations to increase the donation rate, including the option of registering as an organ donor when renewing a driver's licence," she said. "The inquiry also highlighted some of the barriers preventing organ and tissue donation, especially in regional areas, and the need to increase the amount of donor specialists and ensure that hospitals have suitable facilities to carry out a transplant."

There are currently around 1,800 Australians on a waitlist for organ transplant and around 14,000 more people on dialysis, many who would benefit from a kidney transplant. To read the report visit: tinyurl.com/286rx8b9.





# From the Land

THE next feature artist at the bijou MANet Art Gallery in Main Street is Cheryl Kennedy, one of the group of eight who are the backbone of the gallery. Her exhibition is titled *From the Land* - traversing personal connection to landscape and materials. It will be opened on Friday 15 November at 5pm by renowned photographic artist Julie Millowick's speech, delivered by her fellow artist, Linda McLean. The exhibition will be on from Saturday 16 November to Sunday 5 January.

Cheryl is an assemblage artist based in Castlemaine. Her creative practice explores sculpture, textiles, mixed media, and installation. Her starting point is her collection of materials: the countryside provides a rich source of found objects, along with her collection of textiles, scrap metal and memorabilia, that enables her to tell a story in her work. She has visited many of the local tips over the past 21 years, including Castlemaine, Talbot, Carisbrook, Maldon and Trentham.

Having grown up on a farm with considerable domestic responsibility from a young age, she moved to Melbourne when she was 18 and worked in IT. However, her early experience of cooking morphed into running a corporate catering business for board rooms for 15 years before returning to live in the country.

After about two years, she undertook an *Art Pathways* Course at Castlemaine Continuing Education, where she discovered she was hopeless at two-dimensional work, but took to sculpture 'like a duck to water'.

Cheryl loves collecting things of all sorts including rusted wire and metal from tips (when it was still possible), fabric scraps and anything at all really. Observing the history and unadorned beauty of the well-worn, weathered and decayed objects is the lens through which she views all her work.

Cheryl wrote, 'I am attracted to the pating of the old and

Cheryl wrote, 'I am attracted to the patina of the old and rustic; I look for the story in the discarded and forgotten. I collect these things: rusty bits, scraps of lace and haberdashery. It is from my stash of nostalgic stuff that I have moulded the stories of the women of my history. Rusted, shaped metals and wire are mixed with found objects and vintage fabrics.'

She was a Finalist in the Yering Station Sculpture award in 2022 AND a Joint Winner of Wangaratta Contemporary Textile Award 2019.

Cheryl told me a lovely story about how one of her first works sold to Angelina Chaperon many years ago. Just recently, when Cheryl was on duty in the MANet Gallery, Angelina suddenly appeared and mentioned that her piece was slightly worse for wear having got mixed up with renovations and needed a little help. So, the piece has been restored to its original glory as you can see in the piece titled *Angelina*. The real Angelina will be a special guest at the Opening.

Cheryl said that this will be her last exhibition of this type of work because the process involves using tin snips to cut pressed metal, riveting and manipulation, which is taking a heavy toll on her hands. Thus, she needs to direct her creativity and assemblage skills to less difficult materials in large

installations.



Meanwhile don't miss the opening on Friday 15 November at 5pm.

### Six honeyeaters


Spent some time at my favourite bushland pool recently, in advance of some excellent rain.



### Tony Cordy - Calder Ward -



As a returning Councillor I feel very thankful to be re-elected. Out Alexander Shire is a wonderful place to live and I feel very fortunate to be able to serve our community in this way. The new Council has four returning Councillors and four new Councillors so a great mixture. It is diversity of opinions and ideas

that assists Council to make well considered and thoughtful decisions on behalf of the community. I have met the new Councillors and they bring a wealth of experience and ideas and I am sure we will work together in a very positive way. Over the journey I have always worked in the best interests of the community and the previous Councils have achieved a lot.

I have a strong interest in agriculture and I will continue to advocate for farming and business. I have devoted the majority of my professional life to the hospital sector so understand the realities of human services and the important role our Council has in delivery of quality services to older residents.

As a local resident I am fortunate to have strong linkages in the community. My wife Jo and I have raised our family here and our three adult children live locally and are raising their children here as well. Members of the community are always welcome to contact me to discuss Council issues.

My other interests apart from Council include: everything to do with farming; family and watching the grandchildren develop; everything to do with old vehicles; music. I have played in rock bands from an early age, my current band is called Knight Moves and we are available for bookings.

### Bill Maltby - Campbells Creek Ward -

I'm happy that I've been reelected and I'll continue to represent and respect the community. One of the things that I campaigned about is that politics doesn't belong in local government and the community responded by voting for me. I'm looking forward to continuing the work that the previous council has done. We were adventurous in starting the housing trust and looking to help the housing situation, which is a bit out of the circle of local government. And we're one of the few councils in the state still doing aged care, which is very important because we do have an aging population.

I have been pushing for a review of the planning scheme, in particular when it's only one acre or five acres because it should be 'rural living'. There's a tonne of little blocks that technically can't be built on because they



are zoned farming, but they're not big enough to farm. Otherwise just keeping the shire and facilities and council going, it's about the community; it's not about your own personal thoughts.

I talk to constituents all the time because I'm out and about, they can be in contact with me any time. I'm actively involved in the CFA, Rotary, the Castlemaine Art Museum (as a trustee) and BUDA, a slight interest in horse racing and I like good food.

I have goldfish in a pond; when I built my house there was a strip of land behind the house and I decided to build a pond. I saw something like it at Chelsea Flower Garden Show and I thought it was a good idea.

### Lucas Maddock - Moonlight Creek Ward -

I feel absolutely honoured to be trusted by my community with this role. We have some very good momentum from the last council and some big new opportunities. We can do incredible things here and I'm looking forward to getting stuck into it.

The most important (issues) are probably the least interesting to many - that is, good governance, decision making, and leadership. Seeing bad decision making and lost opportunities drives me crazy - as a community we need to be as resilient and equitable as possible and get the right people in leadership roles. As far as local issues go I have a very long list but the two that come up on top right now



are affordable housing and access to childcare. These factors are compounding cost of living pressures for many and driving out essential workers, which has a devastating impact on our services. I'm also very passionate about our local education, health, active transport, environment and creating an equitable and inclusive community.

I'm planning to do weekly informal Listening Posts around Castlemaine in cafes, parks and public buildings. I'll start these in a couple of weeks and will announce them on my Facebook page, which you can find below. I will be available by phone and email too - check the council website next week for contact. facebook.com/lucasmaddockgreens.

You'll often find me and the family at the Wesley Hill Market or at any of the many events in town. If I get a moment, I enjoy jogging or riding through the bush - usually around Barkers Creek or La Larr Ba Gauwa Park. I love tinkering on our bush block - revegging, landscaping, building things. You'll occasionally see me at Park Run or any of the kids playgrounds. I'm an artist and art teacher too, though less of the former these days. I always enjoy learning a new sculpture technique and if I find time I might do a little exhibition occasionally or get to some openings. # BLAST FROM THE PAST

### The Sandy Creek thieves

ON Friday 27 February 1863 Margaret Bryant appeared in the Maldon Police Court charged with receiving stolen property. Rachael Reed brought the charge claiming that on the previous Friday her plaid scarf had been stolen at William Bruce's Store at Sandy Creek. Police later found the scarf in Margaret Bryant's possession when they arrested her husband Henry Bryant for being in possession of stolen goods.

When Rachael Reed took the witness stand, she admitted that while she lived with Richard Reed she was not married to him. She said she was in fact a widow and her surname was Payne. Due to the property laws at the time, Margaret Bryant had been charged with possessing a scarf belonging to Rachael's assumed husband Richard Reed. Bryant's solicitor Robert Garrett then submitted that the charge was incorrect and his client should be released. The Bench however ordered that the case proceed.

Rachael Reed said she had been at Bruce's Store drinking with Richard Reed and friends when she missed the scarf that she had earlier been wearing. Margaret Bryant had also been in the store and had shouted the Reeds a round of drinks but she had left by the time the scarf was missed.

Constable James Burns told the Court that on the previous Tuesday he had arrested Henry Bryant for having stolen property in his possession and when he went to the Reed's tent he found his wife altering a scarf. When Burns asked where she had got the scarf, Margaret said she had bought it at Dunolly and was going to make a dress from it. Burns confiscated the scarf and the next day arrested her.

Robert Garrett, for the defence, suggested that Rachael was a drunken abandoned woman. The Bryants' friend William Bradley, who was also present at Bruce's Store, supported Garrett's view. Bradley swore that Rachael had been very drunk and had been ordered to leave the store. He said that a man known as 'Cannibal Charlie' had then taken her home. Bradley said he had picked up the scarf, not knowing who owned it, and later gave it to Margaret Bryant.

The Bench then ordered that Margaret Bryant stand trial and allowed her to be released on bail of £50. They also recommended that Bradley be charged as, in his own evidence, he had confessed to taking the scarf and giving it to Bryant. Constable Burns acted on this suggestion and as Bradley left the Court he was 'logged' and charged with stealing the scarf.

Henry Bryant was then charged with being in possession of goods, including thatching tools, stolen from John Subritzky and Michael Zala. He was also convicted of stealing various tools from Amos Cousins and Joseph Knight and was sentenced to six months hard labour. The next day William Bradley appeared in Court charged with stealing Rachael Reed's scarf and was also sentenced to six months hard labour.






Celebrating World Children's Day 20 November




# My Two Blankets written by Irena Kobald and illustrated by Freya Blackwood, published by Little Hare Books, 2014


# I am not a Sleepy Sloth written by Jane Riordan and illustrated by Louise Anglicas, published by Bookoli, 2022


# Stuck written and illustrated by Oliver Jeffers, published by Harper Collins Children's Books, 2012

### **Book reviews**

### Time of my Life by Myf Warhurst, 2022

As the youngest child, and only girl, in a family of creative types, Myf Warhurst grew up with the music in her. Whether she was watching Daryl Braithwaite on TV on a Sunday night or listening to the crackle of the needle across vinyl as Agnetha and Anni-Frid took her from rural Victoria to Eurovision, music has always shaped Myf's life. Later her love of music (and the realisation that a professional pianist gig wasn't part of the plan) would shape her career. But music isn't just about memories. It's a safe place for people who feel different. Songs and lyrics helped Myf make sense of the world and deal with heartbreak and uncertainty. Music steered her hopes and fashion choices, cemented friendships and bonded family. In Time of My Life she shares funny, fabulous and occasionally fraught tales about growing up in a small country town with an unhealthy obsession with Countdown, then working in Australian radio and her experiences on the much-loved music quiz show Spicks & Specks. She spills the backstage beans on work, fame, feminism, failure, love and success.

### Mission: Angela by Denise Main, 2022

After WWII a defeated Germany is divided, and East Berlin becomes the de facto capital of the German Democratic Republic. The Berlin Wall is built, which becomes the most powerful and oppressive iconic symbol of the Cold War. West Berlin Police retrieve the body of a woman who drowned in the Havel River. Erna Klemp, an MI6 agent is assigned to take on the dead woman's East Berlin identity. As Angela Muller she is sent through an escape tunnel on a perilous operation to East Berlin. Her Mission? To infiltrate the Secret Police Headquarters of the Stasi. The Stasi is the most repressive, hated and feared arm of the GDR Government and responsible for espionage, domestic and political surveillance.

Angela gains promotion to Oberleutnant Axel Hempf's administration where she must access Stasi secret intelligence, vital in assisting MI6 agents and the East Germans escape to the West. Over time, and against better judgment, a dangerous attraction develops between Angela and Axel. It becomes so powerful and compelling they are unable to resist.







# Pétanque with a difference



The club's pistes are located in the grounds of the Imperial Palace - a huge walled space in Kyoto that was home to the Japanese imperial family from 794 to 1888, when the capital and the royal family were moved from Kyoto to Tokyo. The Imperial Palace grounds, which are over a kilometre long, are filled with beautiful trees, gardens, wandering paths, wide avenues, lakes and then there's the palace itself. All manner of sports are played in the grounds, from baseball to an obscure game called gate ball. And, of course, pétanque.

Our entry into the club was smoothed by its one English speaker: a very generous and laidback guy called Masami Yasuda who did an excellent job of introducing us to the other players and overcoming any cultural hiccups. Despite the language barriers, everyone was welcoming and friendly, and Andrew's Japanese phrases came in very handy.

There's an expectation in Japan that visitors always arrive with presents, so that's what we did. We presented each player with a koala key ring, with each koala clutching a penny. When the Japanese play a sport, they decide who's going to go first by playing rock, paper, scissors. We showed them the Australian alternative: tossing a coin. They found this to be quite intriguing, and took to the idea enthusiastically.

The major difference between playing pétanque in Maldon and Kyoto is the playing surface. In Australia, we usually play on a piste with a gravel surface. In Japan, however, most sports are played on a relatively smooth, sandy terrain and pétanque is no exception to this rule. This is because it rains regularly in games, 75mm of rain fell - and yet the pistes the next

day were dry and perfectly playable.

When it comes time to make up the teams, the Kyoto club's approach is markedly different to that of Maldon's. In Maldon, George and Sue huddle over the computer to come up with a random draw for the day. In Kyoto, each player draws a 'straw' from a bunch of numbered chopsticks to see who their partner(s) will be. Simplicity itself!

Another standout difference in the way that pétanque is played in Japan, or at least in the Kyoto club: shooting is the order of the day. We expected the Japanese players to be very cautious in their approach to the game, but on the contrary - they live dangerously. They'll shoot at anything and everything. We also expected them to be sticklers for marking the coche and the ring, but no - they're quite relaxed about such rules.

In Kyoto, a city of 1.5 million, there are around 20 active pétanque clubs, with many tournaments played between local clubs and those from the surrounding prefectures. The age range of the club we played with would be from around 45 to almost 90. Almost all of the players - 90-year-olds included - ride their bikes to the local club games. Kyoto is, in fact, a city of bike riders - it's cheap, quick and there's nowhere to park anyway! In fact, you can't buy a car in Japan unless you can prove that you can provide your vehicle with a permanent car park. Space in a Japanese city is always tight!


