Leadership Opportunities at Maldon Inc.

The local traders association Maldon Inc. held its annual general meeting (AGM) last Tuesday 12 November but has yet to attract a new president or secretary. Barry Robinson has served as president of the organisation since 2022 and Lindsay Calloway from Warral Maldon has been serving as secretary. The committee has, in those two years, paved the way for continuing growth and innovation and Barry is remaining on the committee to ensure a smooth handover to whomever steps up into the role.

Committee members applauded Barry's efforts at the helm. Luz Restrepo said, "Look at the huge changes in recent years, due to Barry's persistence." Outgoing secretary Lindsay thanked Barry for two amazing years as president and said it seemed like 10 years of work has been achieved.

Barry acknowledged that there is reduced enthusiasm for joining committees in 2024 but said the organisation is considering the creation of an advisory board, so people can contribute to certain topics or on certain projects in which they specialise. "Now Maldon Inc. is being a curator/promoter and asking others to step up and be involved in the way you want to be involved," he said.

After the outgoing President's Report, the AGM featured guest speakers Bruce Turner from Victorian Goldfields Railway (VGR), Councillor-elect Rosalie Hastwell and Economic Development Coordinator Daniel Bone from Mount Alexander Shire Council. The common themes were around working together towards strategic thinking, plus the links between business success and community wellbeing.

The vote was taken for a new committee, with Peter Christen of Panacea Estate, Bruce Turner from VGR, Lisa Speed from This Little Piggy accepted as ordinary members. Artist Catherine Tait returns to her role as treasurer and Barry Robinson remains as an ordinary member during the transition period. Bendigo consulting firm Business Management Specialists has been appointed as the statutory manager of Maldon Inc. until a permanent secretary is secured.

With a strong team, positive plans in place and enthusiasm for future activities, Barry Robinson said the organisation is in great shape for a new president and secretary. "What sort of one-plus-one-equals-three impact can we have?" he challenged the meeting. "How do we reignite people's desire to be part of something, to make something happen?" Now is your chance.

Rail sale: Council and VicTrack respond

A property leased by the Victorian Goldfields Railway (VGR) is being sold by the Victorian Government, raising questions about zoning and community consultation around the sale of a heritage asset that has been a green buffer around Maldon Station since the gold rush era.

The *Tarrangower Times* reported last week in its Friday 8 November edition that 14 Reef Street, attached to Maldon Station, has been listed for sale by the manager of State Government transport properties, VicTrack.

The *TT* requested information from Mount Alexander Shire Council (MASC) to ask about the zoning for 14 Reef Street, which was

understood to have been changed to make way for the sale. A Council spokesperson explained that the zoning on the property has not been and has never been proposed to be changed by MASC. "State-led reforms to the residential zones in 2014 introduced General Residential Zones (GRZ)," the spokesperson said. "GRZ was applied to all land that was previously zoned Residential 1 Zone, which became a redundant zone. This meant that there was an automatic transition to GRZ for land zoned Residential 1 Zone. This was done across Victoria by the State Government at that time."

A document from what was the Department of Transport, Planning and Local Infrastructure (now the Department of Transport and Planning) in 2014 shows that the role of the new zone was to: 'Respect and preserve urban character while enabling moderate housing growth and housing diversity.' Another departmental document states that public comment was sought on the proposed zone reforms until 28 September 2012 and that over 2,000 submissions were received.

The *TT* contacted VicTrack to ask whether any community consultation had occurred in relation to selling a heritage asset and whether there had been any interest in the property as at the deadline for Expressions of Interest. These questions were not answered by VicTrack's spokesperson.

The *TT* also asked why the land is being sold, how the decision had been made, whether VGR had been consulted about the sale of some of the land that it leases and whether any consideration had been made into the impact of the sale on the future operations of the VGR.

A VicTrack spokesperson said, "We sell land that is no longer required for transport and re-invest the revenue back into public transport

assets across Victoria. We have consulted with the railway about the sale of the land to ensure there will be no impacts on their operations."

By way of background information, VicTrack explained that its annual land sales program sells land no longer needed for transport. The spokesperson said that the land at Maldon is not required for transport and is zoned residential, therefore is not able to be used by the VGR for its operations. They said, "We have liaised with the VGR about the sale of the land, and we amended the boundaries of the parcel to ensure the railway can still access its storage yard."

It seems as though lessees of VicTrack properties should check the zoning on all the land that they intend to use in the future; it is possible to do this using dedicated web tools. And as VicTrack points out, any future use of the land at 14 Reef Street would be subject to the standard planning approvals process through Mount Alexander Shire Council. It is not clear how community members should keep track of which parcels of land that VicTrack might choose to sell in the future.

Maldon Fire Brigade report

BRUCE Clements 1st Lieutenant (Acting Captain) Maldon Fire Brigade spoke to the *Tarrangower Times* to provide a summary of recent call-outs. The warm, windy weather on Saturday 16 November was a recipe that kept Maldon Fire Brigade very busy for much of the day.

The most dramatic and suspicious was the last; a blaze at the old school campus in Ety Street, Castlemaine from about 10.45pm that left two portable classrooms totally gutted.

"We hooked into the boost system and boosted the water for the firefighters involved in putting out the fire, because sometimes the water pressure is not enough," Lt. Clements explained. Police are investigating the Ety Street fire as a possible case of arson.

Earlier in the day, Newstead and Maldon Units were called to a small fire on Castlemaine Road, Maldon at about 2pm. "It was an old burn that had been done about eight days ago, before the fire danger period. And the person concerned had

checked it and thought it was ok," Lt. Clements said. "But with the high temperatures and strong winds, it reignited."

At around 4pm, a Maldon tanker was called to Harcourt. "That was an orchard that had been grubbed out some time ago and it looked like it had been covered with earth," said Lt. Clements. "The problem there was that it was big piles of old trees and stumps and pruning, we had to pull them apart and spread them out to extinguish the fire. And there was no water supply on site."

As we head towards summer, the undergrowth is already very dry and weather conditions will intensify, the CFA urgently reminds the community to be vigilant about fire. Lt. Clements said about the weekend fires: "It's a wake-up call for people to be aware that they must fully extinguish any fires. You can smother a fire with earth but it can continue to smoulder underground for days before reigniting."

Shift for solar battery: communications in question

A solar battery, to be installed in the town by electricity distributor Powercor for community use, is to be moved, reportedly due to community feedback. A post on Wednesday 6 November by 'CitiPower and Powercor Australia' on the Maldon Noticeboard Facebook group says that while planning had commenced to install the battery on Parker Street, an alternative location is now being explored for the project.

The *Tarrangower Times* was puzzled by the choice of a private Facebook group to make an announcement that may affect many residents, and was unable to find any recent communications available to the general public. Powercor hosted a community information session in Maldon in November 2023, attended by around 25 people, and indicated then that it was keen to work with the Maldon community, local council and in partnership with DJARRA (Dja Dja Wurrung Clans Aboriginal Corporation). In the lead-up to that meeting, Powercor told the *TT* that the design and survey work for the proposed battery would be completed by February/March 2024. There does not seem to have been a public update in the past year.

When asked what community consultation had occurred to prompt the location change, a Powercor spokesperson told the *Tarrangower Times*: "Our teams have been speaking with residents and groups such as the Commonwealth Government, DJAARA (Dja Dja Wurrung Clans Aboriginal Corporation),

Mount Alexander Shire Council, and other community stakeholders during this process. An initial site was determined to be unsuitable during this engagement process." The spokesperson did not immediately explain why a private Facebook group had been chosen to communicate this update.

The Maldon solar battery project was initiated by community members and proceeded after energy provider Powercor successfully secured a \$500,000 Federal Government grant under the Community Batteries for Household Solar program. The idea is to allow local households to feed solar power from their own roof panels into the shared battery during the day and draw from it at night, aiming to reduce electricity bills, carbon emissions and pressure on the grid, while improving reliability.

The original preferred location for the battery was reportedly the corner of Parker and High Streets, near the Maldon Bowling Club. Powercor has not indicated which new locations are being considered and the spokesperson says, "We're in the final stages of identifying a suitable location for its planned community battery in Maldon. We're taking the time to get the location right so this project best delivers for the community." The company indicated that local conversations have occurred, "We're listening to the community and we're determined to find the best possible site for the battery, ensuring it aligns with local values and minimises disruption."

Powercor says it will update the community when more information is available about a location and project timeline. The *Tarrangower Times* has asked for details about how this information will be disseminated and in the meantime, Powercor encourages residents to sign-up for direct email updates by sending an email to majorprojects@powercor.com.au.

Fire danger period now in place

The Country Fire Authority (CFA) has announced that the Fire Danger Period for Mount Alexander Shire, which is in the North Central Fire District, will run from Monday 11 November 2024 until May 2025. This means you cannot light a fire in the open air unless you have a permit or comply with certain requirements. Mount Alexander Shire Council, the CFA and other emergency management agencies are working with communities to plan and prepare for this year's fire season. Elders welcome babies to Country

DJAARA hosted a Welcome Baby to Country ceremony on Tuesday 12 November in partnership with Bendigo Health. The ceremony took place at the Garden for the Future for more than 50 babies born on Dja Dja Wurrung Country. DJAARA General Manager Cassandra Lewis explained that the ceremony honours and acknowledges infants' connections to the lands on which they are born. "The smoking ceremony and traditional Welcome connects babies to Country and offers them wellbeing and protection," Ms Lewis said. "We hope that, by nurturing babies' connection to Dja Dja Wurrung Country, we are not only enriching their own lives but also fostering greater understanding and connection to Dja Dja Wurrung People."

More than 50 families registered to participate in the Welcome ceremony, which is for Dja Dja Wurrung and non-Indigenous babies aged up to 36 months. Families were invited to participate in the smoking ceremony. Babies were then individually welcomed to Country by Dja Dja Wurrung Elders and presented with a certificate and cultural gifts. Ms Lewis said, "Practising our traditional cultural ceremonies helps Dja Dja Wurrung People to heal from the impacts we still experience as a result of colonisation, keeping us connected to our Culture. DJAARA is committed to practising and revitalising our cultural traditions and customs, which have been handed down by our Ancestors and Elders."

Paramedics prepped for your wild adventures

Ambulance Victoria's (AV) Wilderness Response paramedics are prepared for any emergencies in remote and wilderness areas across the state. AV's team of more than 120 specially trained wilderness paramedics are ready to support you in an emergency but they are reminding outdoor enthusiasts to be cautious if heading out for a hike or bushwalk in the warmer weather. They say don't over-exert yourself and be prepared; plan ahead by monitoring the conditions and let someone know where you're going and when you'll return. Take plenty of water, sunscreen, food, phone and a Personal Locator Beacon (PLB).

VFF calling for fairer rates

The Victorian Farmers Federation (VFF) says newly elected councillors must listen to communities to deliver fairer rating strategies. VFF President Emma Germano said the VFF has previously observed unfair rate increases for farmers in many areas, often driven by sudden and unexpected increases in the valuation of farmland. The VFF believes that to achieve fairer rates each council should spell out its approach in a comprehensive rates strategy. "It's critical that the newly elected councils protect farmers and ensure a fair distribution of the rates burden," Ms Germano said.

Healthy Water, Country and Communities

Coliban Water and DJAARA (the Dja Dja Wurrung Clans Aboriginal Corporation) signed a significant partnership agreement on Monday 11 November, committing to work together in shared custodianship of gatjin (water) on Dja Dja Wurrung Country and deliver shared outcomes for both organisations. In a joint ceremony on Country at Upper Coliban Reservoir, Dja Dja Wurrung Group Chief Executive Officer Rodney Carter said working together to heal water is central to DJAARA's approach. "We work ngaldururrong (together) with Coliban Water to establish processes to share our knowledge to help heal our water systems and benefit people, animals and the broader landscape," Mr Carter said. During the past year the two organisations have worked on many projects together, including Aboriginal Waterways Assessments to inform works, advice through DJAARA's water knowledge group, Kapa Gatjin, and to ensure that Traditional Owner voices are heard in industry forums. Don't take them home

Victorians are being reminded that it is illegal in Victoria to take and keep sick, injured or orphaned wildlife from the wild. Chief Conservation Regulator Kate Gavens said while the intentions might be good, in most cases it's not the best outcome for an orphaned or injured wild animal. "If you find an injured or orphaned wildlife, it's in the animal's best interests for you to call 136 186 or use the Help for Injured Wildlife online tool to find a



trained rehabilitator who can take proper care of them." People taking wildlife home may also face fines and can risk exposure to diseases to themselves or their pets. If unauthorised people take in wildlife, the animals can be exposed to domestic animals, loud human living environments and inappropriate, and sometimes unsafe caring and feeding techniques. If members of the public encounter sick, injured or orphaned wildlife they should call the Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action on 136 186 or use the Help for Injured Wildlife tool.

Eating nuts is not nuts

Regular consumption of nuts is associated with maintaining a healthy lifespan, new research from a Monash University-led team has found. A study involved 9,916 adults aged over 70 years, who reported on their usual diet as part of the *ASPREE Longitudinal Study of Older Persons (ALSOP) sub-study. Those who reported frequent consumption of nuts, including every day or several times a day, regardless of the type or form of nut, lived longer without dementia or persistent disability, compared to those who never or infrequently consumed nuts. A mixture of nuts was recommended as a way to enjoy the benefits of the varying amounts of nutrients found in different types of nuts. Chopped, crushed, meals, butters or paste options may be more accessible to those with oral health issues, and chopped nuts can be added to salads, cereals and smoothies. The current Australian Dietary Guidelines suggest that adults should be consuming 30 grams (a small handful of whole nuts or two tablespoons of nut butter) on most days of the week — not including chocolate-covered nuts, sadly.

Audit shows disparities in rural healthcare delivery

The recently released audit of the Australian health and medical research workforce by the

Department of Health and Aged Care throws light on the importance of supporting rural, regional and remote health workforce and researchers, the National Rural Health Alliance (NRHA) says.

The NRHA says strategic and targeted measures are required to ensure rural Australians enjoy the same health benefits as their city counterparts. According to the latest findings, only 13 per cent of the health and medical workforce is in regional, rural, or remote areas, which is insufficient to serve Australia's 30 per cent rural population. The report also points to the underrepresentation of researchers in regional and remote areas and the additional barriers that exist for regional researchers. The NRHA says, "It is essential that the government and funding agencies support researchers working in rural and remote areas so that all Australians' needs are considered when formulating important policies and strategies."

Ensuring fair elections

The Victorian Electoral Commission (VEC) has this week published its response to Parliament's Electoral Matters Committee (EMC) report on the conduct of the 2022 state election and calls on the Victorian government to enact significant reforms to the state's electoral laws. Key recommendations the VEC supports include: changing the election timeline to alleviate pressure points and account for the growing complexity and scale of Victorian elections and implementing additional measures to protect the safety of all participants at election venues. It suggests adding safeguards to protect against mis- and disinformation, taking legislative action in response to social media companies ignoring requests from the VEC to remove inaccurate material about the electoral process from their platforms and developing a legally enforceable code of conduct for candidates and campaigners. The VEC also supports expanding the use of electronic roll mark-off across the state and reporting on responses to lessons learned about ballot paper shortages during the last election, plus extending access to telephone-assisted voting.

Help celebrate women's stories



The State Government Minister for Women Natalie Hutchins is calling on Victorians to vote for which women's stories should be told through the next round of the Victorian Women's Public Art Program. She says, "Creating a permanent record of the excellence and leadership of Victorian women shows future generations of women and girls what is possible — if you can see it, you can be it." The Victorian Women's Public Art Program is addressing the underrepresentation of women artists and women in public art, along with gender stereotypes about women's achievements. Fewer than two per cent of close to 600 statues in Melbourne's public spaces currently represent women. Natural Newstead

Of butterflies and warblers





The following collection of butterflies was sufficiently entrancing to divert my attention from a pair of **Speckled Warblers**.

I'm always out on a limb with invertebrates, including butterflies, so feel free to confirm or deny any of the identifications. I'm confident about both of the *Vanessa* species, the other two much less so.

Neolucia agricola apparently feeds inside the flower buds of plants in the Family Fabaceae. While this one was photographed resting on a Sticky Everlasting there were a number of native peas flowering nearby.

The larvae of *Trapezites luteus* feed on mat-rushes (*Lomandra*).

Holiday levy from January: stress for BnBs

THE Victorian State Parliament has passed the contentious 'AirBnB Tax' law to impose a 7.5 per cent levy on short-stay accommodation platforms. The Act was passed in the Upper House on Thursday 17 October and the levy will apply to bookings made and completed on or after 1 January 2025. The levy applies to Victorian providers who offer accommodation for less than 28 consecutive days. The levy is a flat 7.5% of the total booking fees paid, including fees and charges such as cleaning fees and GST.

The Short Stay Levy is a feature of the Victorian Government's 'Housing Statement,' which aims to tackle housing supply and affordability in Victoria. The revenue raised from the Short Stay Levy will go to Homes Victoria, which manages social housing in the state, with 25 per cent of funds to be invested in regional Victoria. The Housing Statement also says: "other local council charges on short stay accommodation will be removed."

Michele Waddington, owner of Fairbank House holiday home rental, believes the levy will have an impact on local accommodation providers and beyond: "The legislation, which

taken with other recent taxes, has significantly impacted Maldon's economic recovery," she told the *TT*.

Michele points also to Council requirements for holiday houses to be registered and rated as a commercial property and attract land tax at a commercial rate (which is 30% more than residential properties). She says that the short-stay levy creates financial stress for what she calls 'Investor Supporters' of Maldon's tourism and events such as: "...residents and second-home owners (who) joined the highly competitive short stay rental market" as well as "Maldon homeowners who capitalised a granny flat or annex into a short stay money earner."

The State Revenue Office is delivering an education program about the Short Stay Levy, with on-line sessions for property owners, renters, booking platforms, tourism associations, real estate agents and local councils. A series of webinars are happening in November to further explain the levy and obligations for those who take bookings. Visit tinyurl.com/2ajbmnt.

BLAST FROM THE PAST

The Maldon Tiger

IN 1885 a 'Tiger scare' gripped Victoria. In the northeast reports came in of the 'Chiltern Tiger' that was said to have escaped from a circus at Mansfield. Several sightings were reported, including one in May 1885 by railway workers near Chiltern. Stories circulated about missing children and livestock being devoured. The police and local volunteer rifle corps hunted for the tiger, but the most dangerous animal they found was an escaped donkey.

In June another tiger was said to have devoured a schoolgirl at Lilydale. The girl was later found lost in the bush, but sightings of the tiger continued around Doncaster and Burwood. After two horses were killed, police and locals armed with rifles searched for the animal but found nothing.

These tiger sightings were widely reported in the Victorian press including the *Tarrangower Times* and on 1 July 1885 the *Times* published a satirical account of the 'Maldon Tiger'.

Two respected gentlemen had called at the *Times* office and reported seeing a tiger in the scrub near the brewery at the Butts on the previous Saturday night. The *Times* then dispatched its special reporter to the scene with orders to capture the tiger and bring it back 'alive or dead'. Armed only with a bottle of whisky, the reporter went into the night intending to subdue the beast with his 'magnetic personality'.

From his notes that were later found, our reporter had fallen asleep after several nips of whisky only to be awoken by a tremendous roar. Just as the tiger was about to spring on him the reporter transfixed it with a mesmeric stare and rendered it as tame as a family pet. Then, as they shared the whisky, the noble beast told his story.

The tiger had only been in Maldon a few days but was delighted with the countryside and especially with the view from the Mount. He found the local beer excellent and had feasted on a cow and several truant schoolboys. He sometimes wandered Maldon streets at night but complained that the footpaths hurt his feet. After taking another swig of whisky, the tiger said he was disgusted with the way the press disparaged him and was considering suing for defamation. On a lighter note he said that after travelling extensively throughout the colony he intended to write a series of articles entitled 'Picturesque Victoria'. The pair talked into the night and the reporter seems to have convinced the tiger to move on to fresher pastures. After finishing the whisky they parted on the best of terms.

The *Times*' editor apologised for not providing the full interview but at the time of going to press his special reporter had not recovered from his ordeal. However, the empty whisky bottle shared with the tiger was on display in the *Times*' office.

Library news

Behind the scenes at the Athenaeum

HAVE you ever wondered what is happening at the library when the 'Library Open' flag is not flying? What occurs behind the scenes each week and who is involved? You might be surprised by the range of activities that is carried out by a group of enthusiastic and committed locals.

There are the regular tasks, such as processing new books, both purchased and donated (thank you) and maintaining the catalogue, available to everyone via the library website maldonlibrary.org.au. Check out the website for opening hours, how to join as a member and maybe become a volunteer, lists of new books, book reviews and the weekly Library News. Volunteers also respond to requests for book reservations, carry out book repairs and organise book displays. We want the library to look appealing but also for it to be easy for members to find old favourites or discover new authors and genres.

Other activities behind the scenes allow the library to continue the role it has played in the life of Maldon since its foundation as a Mechanics' Institute in 1863. The aim of Mechanics' Institutes was to create free educational, cultural and self-improvement opportunities, providing, in addition to reading materials, adult education programs and social and recreational events. As recorded in the *Tarrangower Times* and *Maldon District Advertiser* of November 1860, the desire was to provide for Maldon a place where people could 'meet, form classes for mutual instruction, read the current literature of the period, hear lectures, and otherwise benefit themselves'. Today the Library provides local residents with a friendly, knowledgeable and comprehensive library service, but it also actively participates in Maldon special activities and hosts events such as play readings, book launches, author talks and book groups.

The Maldon Athenaeum Library is proud of its long history, beginning within 10 years of the town being gazetted. Groups of volunteers are busy mining the records, diving into the library's considerable collection of documents, including correspondence, borrowing records, minute books and newspaper articles. Information from these and other archival sources are being used by volunteers as part of the library History Project. This aims to create a series of 'vignettes' ('brief, evocative descriptions, accounts or episodes') that will be published on the library website, starting early in the New Year. The history of the library is, in many ways, the history of Maldon as it has grown from a gold rush collection of tents to the established community of today.

The Maldon Athenaeum is a busy place with volunteer-led and managed activities to maintain the effective running of the library and events. We welcome new members (only \$30 a year) and volunteers. Drop in any time the library is open (Monday, Wednesday and Friday 2-4pm, Saturday 9.30am to 12 noon) or email maldonathenaeumlibrary@gmail.com.

Book reviews

Jacqueline in Paris by Anne Mah, 2022

In August 1949 Jacqueline Bouvier arrives in postwar Paris to begin her junior year abroad. She's 20 years old, socially poised but financially precarious, and all too aware of her mother's expectations that she make a brilliant match. Before relenting to family pressure, she has one year to herself far away from sleepy Vassar College and the rigid social circles of New York, a year to explore and absorb the luminous beauty of the City of Light. Jacqueline is immediately catapulted into an intoxicating new world of champagne and châteaux, art and avant-garde theatre, cafés and jazz clubs. She strikes up a romance with a talented young writer who shares her love of literature and passion for culture, even though her mother would think him most unsuitable.

But beneath the glitter and rush, France is a fragile place still haunted by the Occupation. Jacqueline lives in a rambling apartment with a widowed countess and her daughters, all of whom suffered as part of the French Resistance just a few years before. In the aftermath of World War II, Paris has become a nest of spies, and suspicion, deception, and betrayal lurk around every corner. Jacqueline is stunned to watch the rise of communism, an anathema in America but an active movement in France, never guessing she is witnessing the beginning of the political environment that will shape the rest of her life and that of her future husband.

Landlines by Raynor Winn, 2022

Raynor Winn knows that her husband Moth's health is declining, getting worse by the day. She knows of only one cure. It worked once before. But will he, can he, set out with her on another healing walk?

The Cape Wrath Trail is over 200 miles of gruelling terrain through Scotland's remotest mountains and lochs. But the lure of the wilderness and the beguiling beauty of the awaiting glens draw them northwards. Being one with nature saved them in their darkest hour and their hope is that it can work its magic again.

As they set out on their incredible 1,000-mile journey back to the familiar shores of the Southwest Coast Path, Raynor and Moth map the landscape of an island nation facing an uncertain path ahead.

Thunderclap: A Memoir of Art and Life by Laura Cumming, 2023

In 1654, the Thunderclap, an enormous explosion at a gunpowder store, devastated the city of Delft, killing hundreds of people, including the extraordinary painter Carel Fabritius, and injuring thousands more.

Framing the story around the life of Fabritius, Cumming illuminates this extraordinary moment in art history while also writing about her own father, a painter. Like Dutch art, the story gradually links country, city, town, street, house, interior all the way to the bird on its perch, the blue and white tile, the smallest seed in a loaf of bread. The impact of a painting and how it can enter our thoughts, influence our view and understanding of the world is the heart of this book.

Humble Pi by Matt Parker, 2019

Our whole world is built on math, from the code running a website to the equations enabling the design of skyscrapers and bridges. Most of the time, this math works quietly behind the scenes until it doesn't. All sorts of seemingly innocuous mathematical mistakes can have significant consequences. Math is easy to ignore until a misplaced decimal point upends the stock market, a unit conversion error causes a plane to crash, or someone divides by zero and stalls a battleship in the middle of the ocean.

Exploring and explaining a litany of glitches, near misses, and mathematical mishaps involving the internet, big data, elections, street signs, lotteries, the Roman Empire, and an Olympic team, Matt Parker uncovers the bizarre ways math trips us up and what this reveals about its essential place in our world. Getting it wrong has never been more fun.

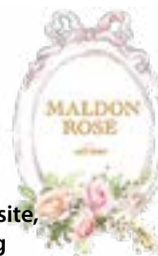

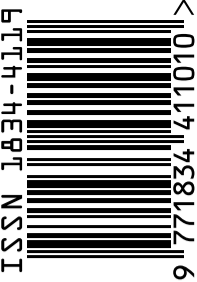
