Musical gift from the Bowe family to Maldon Hospital residents



MUSIC plays a vital role in promoting joy and well-being for residents in aged care, and recently, Maldon Hospital welcomed a meaningful gift that will enhance the musical experience for its residents. The family of nursing heroine Ethel Jessie Bowe has donated a beautiful Thalberg piano to the hospital, celebrating the legacy of the remarkable woman for whom Jessie Bowe House is named.

Ethel Jessie Bowe, a distinguished Australian Army Nursing Service Reserve member, served globally in Egypt and Morotai Island. Her contributions earned her prestigious accolades, including the Royal Red Cross, the Florence Nightingale Medal, and the United States Bronze Star Medal. She was honoured with a State Funeral, reflecting her significant impact.

Rod Bowe, Jessie's nephew, proposed the donation of the piano after the hospital's previous instrument reached the end of its musical life and could not be restored by a tuner. The timing of this donation could not have been better. The Bowe family not only transported the piano but also arranged for it to be tuned upon its arrival at the hospital.

Rod Bowe has deep roots in Maldon. Born in 1934 to Jim and Isabelle Bowe—Jessie's younger brother—Rod attended Maldon Primary School and later Castlemaine High. At 15, he began his banking career at the State Savings Bank in Maldon, returning as manager in 1977. After a long banking career, he and his wife, Betty, retired to Bendigo.

The piano, originally purchased for Rod and Betty's daughter Christine 50 years ago while they lived in Bendigo, has since travelled extensively with the family due to Rod's work commitments. Christine reflected on her early lessons, saying, "I had lessons then but didn't go much further. Life got in the way." Over the years, the piano has journeyed through various towns, including Redcliffs, Echuca, Wangaratta, and Swan Hill before returning to Bendigo.

On Thursday 26 September, Rod Bowe and his daughter Christine, son Peter and daughter-in-law Leanne attended a piano recital featuring David Smith and soprano Elizabeth Barrow at the hospital. This event provided an opportunity for hospital staff, management, and residents to express their gratitude for the Bowe family's generosity. Rod noted, "We have a strong family connection to both our Aunty Jess and Maldon, so the Hospital made a very fitting choice to donate the family piano."

The addition of the Thalberg piano is expected to bring joy and enrich the musical atmosphere at Maldon Hospital for years to come.



LIKE many painters, Chris has had to find her own way and has spent a lifetime doing so; we are much richer for her endeavour.


Roadside Impressions is an immersive survey exhibition from 2003 – 2015. On exhibition are meditative landscape paintings by Chris Delpratt. Harmonious oil on canvas paintings which appear like gentle liquid watercolours works rather than oils. Delpratt has invented a unique way of painting en plein air. Her evocative paintbrush technique is washy, deft and consistent. Very painterly works which whisper, rather than scream from the gallery walls.

Chris has returned to the same places and painted hundreds of impressions, backroads, fields, paddocks, gullies and tracks looking toward the undulating foothills of the Dandenong Ranges in Melbourne's east. Green Corridor, Boundary the Other Side and Everchanging are not only evocative incantations of the pastoral world of landscape in painting, but these artworks are also subjective evidence of the Melbourne urban periphery. Albeit as art paintings, not photographs, we witness the documentation of the suburban food bowl, butted up to the necessary fields farmed for strawberries and the like. We sight rows of trees on the horizon, wind breaks and creek gullies. As observed in September Haze, Rain, Smoke Haze, Chilled Through the painter has been in the moment and at one with weather elements.



Observation is key to these complex worlds. Paintings woven together with the rigorous discipline and intuition of a textile designer, conducting the warp and weft of pattern to make something beautiful and pleasing to the eye, the touch and senses.

"Her easy expertise with the brush and with paint that is whisper thin, results in an image in which we can almost feel the damp air caressing our skin. By including only what detail she needed to, we sense the paintings fragmentary nature; its breath and its pulse." Simon Gregg - Director/Curator Gippsland Art Gallery



"I guess my work still contains that awareness of abstraction."

Chris has spent a lifetime learning about space. Close up space not distant space. She is cogniscient of abstract painting and sites as influences Abstract Expressionist painters, William De Kooning, Mark Rothko and then later discovering Richard Diebenkorn's painting. All interested in gesture, the vibration of colour and the deep understanding of what it means to work with space; no simple matter.


Chris Delpratt's paintings are remarkably consistent, enduring yet fragile and melancholic moments framed on canvas, which speak more to the Golden Age lost and Virgil's pastoral poetry than illustration of a depicted scene. Winter Greys, Soft Winds and Golden Glow are magnificent, understated experiences of what it must feel like to be in this painter's shoes whilst communing with nature. Painted in one sitting and on location en plein air these alla-prima works reflect a feeling of being fully present in the eternal now. The moment may pass, the impression disappears forever, yet the paintings endure as a human record in time and one's memory.

"Chris Delpratt has devised an approach to oil painting utilising a medium of pure linseed oil. Through transparent layers of colour, light passes and is reflected from the white of the canvas beneath with the resulting effect rather akin to the luminosity of watercolour on paper.

Delpratt has invested her canvases with a meditative quality. In depicting the moods of this place, she has found the perfect vehicle from which patterns of order and harmony can be transposed and fixed in time." *Damian Smith – Curator/Arts Writer*

Chris trained as a graphic artist in

Queensland, quickly realising it was not going to be enough to sustain her curiosity and painter's spirit. Chris attended summer schools at the Darling Downs Institute where she met like-minded artists. She met Sydney painters Suzanne Archer, David Aspen and was introduced to the works of Guy Warren, Elisabeth Cummings, Ann Thomson, John Peart who all had a genuine impact on her painter's life.



Chris migrated to Melbourne and enrolled at RMIT to study a Bachelor of Arts, Fine Art – Painting. Abstract Expressionism was de rigueur in Melbourne painting colleges in the early 1980s. It was a time when the pervasive male gaze was starting to be challenged. Despite worldly artistic influences permeating the Melbourne bubble, the times were still conservative, and women artists did not fare so well against their male contemporaries; there were only two women on the RMIT academic art staff. Those art student days were intense, swashbuckling and heady and to stay true to vocation required enormous


nerve. Chris Delpratt clearly had the goods and pushed on with her singular vision and deeply enquiring mind.

Not surprisingly, Chris might have become a professional pianist but instead made a conscious decision to choose painting over a career in music. Music is still clearly part of her process. When we look at a Chris Delpratt painting, 'yes' there is subject, a landscape, but there is so much more. What is It? It is a musical form of lyrical abstraction. One must take time to see and to feel and to look; her paintings are a type of meditation. Spending time in a room with her paintings requires time, not only to 'get your eye in' but to tune in to the artists unique visual language. Recently, at the 2023 Maldon Landscape Prize at EDGE Galleries, judge and esteemed Australian painter Mary Tonkin gave honourable mention to Chris Delpratt's entry Enriched.

"For the haptic way I see with this painting; the feeling that each form has been palpated by the eye and for its glowing, writhing, thoroughly embodied sense of being present."

Chris has been a finalist in many a significant Australian art prize with her paintings, including twice in the John Leslie painting prize, Gippsland; the Fleurieu Landscape prize in South Australia; the Paddington prize, Sydney; the Heysen, the Muswellbrook, the Flanagan to name a few. Chris Delpratt has had several solo exhibitions in Melbourne and Brisbane.





Tree pruning around powerlines starts soon



TREE pruning will commence soon in Castlemaine to provide appropriate clearance around powerlines.

More than 400 trees have been identified for pruning as a result of Council's annual tree inspection program.

The trees identified will be pruned by qualified contractors to meet electricity safety requirements, reduce the risks of bushfires, blackouts and power surges.

Council is responsible for maintaining vegetation (e.g. trees in parks or Council owned property) that may interfere with powerlines on road reserves in the Declared Area of Castlemaine.

This does not include trees on private property, or areas outside the Declared Area such as McKenzie Hill, Chewton or Campbells Creek.

The local energy distributor Powercor is responsible for maintaining trees on road reserves outside the Declared Area of Castlemaine.

Powercor also has the authority to prune trees on private property in order to maintain powerline clearance.

Every effort will be made to retain tree shape and character.

Pruning will start in October and will be finished by the declared bushfire season.



THE Dja Dja Wurrung Clans Aboriginal Corporation (DJAARA) has been named the Victorian winner of the Telstra Best of Business Awards in the Indigenous Excellence category, marking a significant milestone as the organisation celebrates its 20th anniversary.

DJAARA, established in 2004 with just two staff and 75 members, has grown into one of Central Victoria's major employers, now supporting around 200 staff and over 550 members. CEO Rodney Carter attributes this growth to the corporation's focus on self-determination, economic empowerment, and cultural preservation.

Over the years, DJAARA has expanded into three key enterprises: DJANDAK (natural resource management), DU-MAWUL (creative arts and cultural tourism), and DJAKITJ (bush foods). "We are shifting the dial not only for Dja Dja Wurrung People but also for Traditional Owners across Victoria and Australia," said Mr. Carter.

In 2013, DJAARA became the first Victorian Registered Aboriginal Party to sign a comprehensive Recognition and Settlement Agreement (RSA) with the State of Victoria, cementing their role in managing public land and leading initiatives around renewable energy, water management, and traditional burning practices.

'When Traditional Owners lead, great things happen," said Mr. Carter, adding that this latest recognition reinforces DJAARA's commitment to advancing Indigenous excellence in the region and beyond.





A good news story ...

A text message from a thoughtful local resident came through early last Thursday ... my new neighbour at No 1 sent me a message this morning ... re the visitor in their chook yard ... asking what best to do. She's left the chooks in their shed ... and the owl is still in the little yard ... Lyn, another neighbour suggested contacting you for best advice.


Here's what happened next.

The baby **Powerful Owl**, or owlet had got itself into a pickle (above), apparently departing the nest hollow a little ahead of schedule. It was able to fly, but weakly - image #2 shows it on the railing of the chook yard.


I carefully wrapped the owlet in a blanket and transferred it to the low branches of a Blackwood Wattle, near to where I think it flew from the nest site image #3. It remained there throughout the day, but had disappeared when I checked again after dusk (around 7pm).


The great news is that it was sighted again a few days later, very high up in the nest tree, with one of the parents watching on from close by.

BLAST FROM THE PAST

THE RACECOURSE

HORSE racing was one of the most popular sports on the early Victorian goldfields. The first race meeting on the Tarrangower diggings took place on Boxing Day 1854 on an improvised racecourse near the current site of Sandy Creek Clydesdales. A fee of £3 was required to enter a horse and total prize money of over £100 was offered. The event was advertised as 'Hack Races', and most races were only open to untrained horses.

Over the next few years several race meetings were held at Sandy Creek. The main organisers of these events were local publicans who profited by selling alcohol on course and holding balls and dinners associated with the races. Professional men, particularly doctors, also played prominent roles. Dr Charles Hardy usually officiated as the Chief Judge and Dr Robert Lisle entered his horses and acted as a starter or steward.

In October 1856 the *Mount Alexander Mail* claimed it could not say anything in favour of the Sandy Creek course. It was situated on thickly wooded undulating ground with some parts of the course being very much up hill. Some of the cleared areas were extremely narrow and dangerous with jockeys often narrowly escaping injury from overhanging branches.

In July 1857 Israel Berry Spencer, the proprietor of the Brighton Hotel at Porcupine Flat, announced that he was preparing a racecourse on Crown land at the rear of his hotel. Spencer had opened the Brighton Hotel in 1854 after being granted one of the first publican's licenses on the Tarrangower diggings and was one of those who had organised the earliest race meetings. Following his announcement, a gathering of Maldon's racing fraternity decided to hold future meetings at the 'Ascot Course at the rear of Spencer's hotel'. The first races were held there in November 1857 followed by another meeting on Boxing Day.

Sadly, in August 1859, Spencer was committed to the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum, suffering from 'monomania'. At this time, his racecourse was described as properly cleared and fenced in. It had a grandstand and a range of roomy stables and carriage sheds. There was also a blacksmith's shop and it was connected to the Brighton Hotel's large garden and 'pleasure grounds'. Following Spencer's death at Yarra Bend in February 1860 his widow Sarah and later their son James continued to operate the hotel and racecourse.

In September 1891 the racecourse was gazetted as a recreational reserve to be managed by the Shire of Maldon. The reserve was extended in February 1899. Many local organisations used it for sports meetings and picnics. Most significantly, St Patrick's Day race meetings were held there from 1905 until 1936. More recently the reserve has been the home of the Maldon and Baringhup Agricultural Show and also the Pony and Campdraft clubs.



Djaara Elders arts and cultural talks afternoon



THE new Indigenous Interpretive garden space, garingilang gatjin wii, at the Central Goldfields Art Gallery in Maryborough, was the setting for an arts and cultural talks afternoon last Sunday. Djaara Elders Aunty Marilyne Nicholls and Uncle Rick Nelson co-shared cultural talks about Country and explained the use of chosen stones, plants and rock wells. This followed the Welcome to the Country Smoking Ceremony by Uncle Rick Nelson.

This peaceful space, named garingilang gatjin wii, represents the words for water and fire garden in the Djaara language. It highlights the deep connection between land and culture. This garden is for the public's well-being, a space that supports the health of people and Country. It was created to be a bright, happy place to attract butterflies, bees and birds. Djaara artists have developed pieces on the healing themes of gatjin (water) and wii (fire). These artworks share Djaara Traditional Knowledge and connection to healing Country with visitors and project partners. Each piece embeds Djaara Culture into this meaningful living place. The garden was planted mainly by the Djaara Women's Knowledge Group using traditional planting methods to return spirit to Country.

This event was an excellent opportunity to connect with the local Indigenous community and celebrate the continuation of culture through art, storytelling and education.

New equipment boosts maintenance efforts at MVM&M





Adrift in Melbourne by Robyn Annear, 2012

This book contains a series of walks created by local author and historian Robyn Annear. For the energetic, each can be followed on foot (or by tram, free during Seniors Week) but can also be enjoyed from the comfort of an armchair. This is a guide to Melbourne's past and present, showcasing the hidden and surprising histories of her buildings and the characters that inhabited them. (Adrift in Melbourne can be found in Travel Tales.)

The Best Gardens in Italy by Kirsty McLeod and Primrose Bell, 2013

It's an old one, but still a great read. Kirsty McLeod and Primrose Bell celebrate over 100 of the finest Italian gardens open to the public. They take the reader with them on a journey to these gardens: they explore their history and context, and we meet the owners, hear the stories behind the gardens, and learn how they were made and how they are maintained. (Also located in Travel Tales.)

The Hairy Bikers Ride Again by Dave Myers and Si King, 2007

Even armchair travellers need food to sustain and inspire them. Dave and Si are back on their motorbikes, from Morocco to Belgium, to India and more, in search of adventure and delicious food. The book contains recipes for fuss-free and tasty food using easy-to-source ingredients, plus fascinating travelling tales to sustain the mind. (To be found in the Cooking, Food and Wine section of the library.)

Riding With Giants by Peter Holmes a Court, 2020

Another bike odyssey, but this time the pedal kind. Escaping the financial world, international businessman Peter Holmes a Court ends up in rural France, aiming to ride the L'Etape du Tour, the amateur leg of the Tour de France. He spends

his days photographing his custom bike being built, meeting the locals, and learning about the rich traditions of artisan craftsmanship. He and his daughters finally begin to put down roots and understand the beauty and calm of a smallscale existence - and a very different approach to excellence and the well-lived life. (Riding With Giants can be found in Autobiography, Biography and Memoir.)

Dark Star Safari: Overland from Cairo to Cape Town by Paul Theroux, 2002

No collection of recommended travel books would be complete without one by Paul Theroux, arguably the best-known and celebrated contemporary travel writer. In Dark Star Safari he takes readers the length of Africa by rattletrap bus, dugout canoe, cattle truck, armed convoy, ferry and train, enduring danger, delay, and dismaying circumstances. He talks to locals, aid workers, missionaries, and tourists. What results is an insight into the history, politics, and beauty of Africa and its people. (Dark Star Safari can be found in Travel Tales.)

The Bush: Travels in the Heart of Australia by Don Watson, 2012

Most Australians live in cities and cling to the coastal fringe, yet our sense of what an Australian is – or should be – is drawn from the vast and varied inland called the bush. But what do we mean by 'the bush', and how has it shaped us?

Starting with his forebears' battle to drive back nature and eke a living from the land, Don Watson explores the bush as it was and as it now is: the triumphs and the ruination, the commonplace and the bizarre, the stories we like to tell about ourselves and the national character, and those we don't. Via mountain ash and mallee, the birds and the beasts, slaughter, fire, flood and drought, swagmen, sheep and their shepherds, the strange and the familiar, the tragedies and the follies, the crimes and the myths and the hope - here is a journey that only our leading writer of non-fiction could take us on.

At once magisterial in scope and alive with telling, wry detail, The Bush lets us see our landscape and its inhabitants afresh, examining what we have made, what we have destroyed, and what we have become in the process.

No one who reads it will look at this country the same way







North and South by Elizabeth Gaskell

PUBLISHED in 1854-55 and serialised in Household Words, this masterful novel deals with love in its various forms, death and grieving, justice and ethics in a context of social change during the early industrial revolution. Mrs Gaskell (as she was generally known) published 11 books - mostly novels but including a biography of her friend Charlotte Bronte - as well as a large number of short stories. While the love story in North and South has similarities to that of Pride and Prejudice, I must confess to preferring Gaskell's writing; reading Jane Austen sometimes has me grumbling, "Get on with it!" But Elizabeth Gaskell, having set the scene and rounded out her characters, moves into a page-turning narrative both gripping and intriguing.

The Hale family – an Anglican vicar, his wife and their daughter Margaret - move from the peaceful rural parish of Helstone in Hampshire to the bustling industrial city of Milton in the north of England. The Reverend Hale, a fine and conscientious minister, had begun to doubt aspects of his faith and resigned his post to work as a teacher/lecturer. His decision sets the tone of the very strict ethical code that governs the protagonists' lives. Hale's lifelong friend and Margaret's godfather Mr Bell is a property owner in Milton and facilitates their move.

The new location is dirty, smoky and characterised by the well-to-do class's pursuit of

prosperity and profits along with the poverty and suffering of the factory workers and their families. The Hales are introduced to the Thorntons – John, a self-made mill owner, his formidable mother and his fatuous sister Fanny. Margaret and John take an

almost-instant dislike to each other, which is aggravated by their disagreement about the treatment of factory hands, though underneath is a deeper attraction. John is initially taken by Margaret's aloof beauty, whereas she respects his stoic integrity and yearns to know that he admires her.

Margaret also finds
herself becoming involved
in the lives of working families, specifically the Higginses - Bessy and her father
Nicholas. Bessy is terminally ill
with a lung disease resulting from inhaling cotton dust and other pollutants during
factory work. Her father is a union leader and
a key organiser of a strike that pits Capital
against Labour. Things get out of hand when
John Thornton recruits an Irish workforce to
replace his striking mill hands, and a group of
outraged strikers gather outside his residence

intent on a confrontation. Margaret is visiting

the family at the time, and her intervention at that point marks a dramatic turning point in the narrative.

Far be it from me to divulge the rest of the plot and provide spoilers if your appetite has

been whetted to read *North and South* yourself! The characters are skil-

fully drawn, and also include the Hales's faithful house servant Dixon, and their

beloved son Frederick who is in forced exile after his involvement in a naval mutiny. A strength of Gaskell's writing is her acknowledgement of the dignity and gruff common sense of workers, personified by Nicholas Higgins. It's Margaret who dominates the story, becoming the pillar of strength for her family as they confront massive change, illness

and death – and who forges a link between Thornton and Higgins that gradually leads to cooperation, if not friendship, between these two honourable but stubborn leaders.

North and South provides a snapshot of English society almost 200 years ago: most striking is the stern moral code of the time. Margaret agonises over telling what we would call an 'honourable lie, all but obsessed with

John Thornton's bad opinion of her behaviour. There is a detectable stereotyping of the downtrodden Irish, and some not unexpected sexism. I was interested to learn that in the mid-19th century well-off women did not generally attend funerals, being seen as unable to control their emotions. And for this language whore there was a keen interest in the spoken English of almost 200 years ago - in particular the working-class dialect of factory workers, mostly represented in the Higgins family. Mrs Gaskell uses now-redundant vocabulary such as 'sate' as the past tense of sat, and 'gripe' (grip) which some may recognise occurs in Shakespeare's *Macbeth*. (The author Jeanette Winterson once noted that working men in the north of England given the opportunity to study Shakespeare did so readily partly because, even in the early 20th century, their speech differed little from Shakespeare's time.) And what better way to conclude but with

supplies, adding further appeal to the event.





Stevie Wonder came back!




