

THE Village Business Expo took place on Tuesday 8 October, with a great atmosphere and great attitudes abounding at the Maldon Golf Club. Collaboration was the word of the day, with Rebecca Barnett of Maldon Bakery declaring: "if you don't have money, you need to have friends."

Hosted by Member for Bendigo West MP Maree Edwards, the opening ceremony featured an address by Hon. Natalie Suleyman MP, Minister for Small Business who said that collaborations between state and federal governments, plus councils and educational institutions, provide great supports to small

and micro businesses. "It's important to have an understanding of some of these; for example, Business Victoria does mammoth work throughout Victoria." The Minister pointed to the Business Bus as being a "wealth of tools

Expo organiser Luz Restrepo reinforced the idea of working together. "One of the most beautiful things that businesses have is voice," she said. "Governments don't know about our jobs, they don't know everything that we do." She asked attendees to write suggestions on a 'Collaboration Board' in the hope that new ideas for collaborative growth might emerge.

THE operator of a Carisbrook broiler farm, who has two open applications for further developments, has been fined nearly \$10,000 for mismanaged waste, the Environment Protection Authority Victoria (EPA) revealed last week.

EPA Northwest Regional Manager Paul Ratajczyk says the investigation began when a member of the public encountered a lane covered in wastewater. "The water had been used to wash down the inside of a poultry shed, which made it industrial waste from a legal point of view, and a source of biological contamination for nearby waterways," Mr Ratajczyk said. "The presence of bacteria from poultry manure made the wastewater a potential hazard to the environment and neighbouring farms."

When EPA officers inspected the Baringhup Rd site on Thursday 15 August, they found wastewater escaping from a breached evaporation dam. It was flowing across Hurses Lane and Black Lane. The inspectors traced the flow back to the dam on a property run by Pavilion Farms 3 Pty Ltd. Water samples confirmed the origin of the escaped wastewater and the EPA fined the company for unlawfully depositing waste of more than 1,000 litres via an offsite

Pavilion Farms is the company that was involved in tense negotiations with some Baringhup locals between 2012 and 2019, relating to large-scale broiler farm proposals. It is also listed as the applicant for proposed future broiler farm developments at 70 Baringhup Road and 3280 Pyrenees Highway, Carisbrook. A spokesperson for Central Goldfields Shire said that the current applications are unlikely to be considered until early next year. The approaching local government elections mean that the council is in the caretaker period and is unable to make decisions until after the vote is complete.

Pavilion Farms has been issued a fine of \$9,880 by the EPA. Mr Ratajczyk said, "Businesses must have appropriate controls in place to manage and dispose of all wastes generated by their operations, they are expected to be proactive about preventing pollution, and EPA won't hesitate to take action when pollution

Words with John Marsden



IT'S not surprising to learn that John Marsden is passionate about language. As his appearance at the Newstead Young Writers Festival approaches this weekend, the beloved best-selling author and educator reveals to the *Tarrangower Times* that his fervour for words goes beyond writing and reaches back into his own childhood.

The TT asked him what he believes is the value of encouraging young people to be interested in writing. "Using words can make an incredible difference in your life," John says. "It's not just writing, it's communication." He refers to a Cornish proverb that says 'the tongueless man gets his land took,' and describes some practical ways in which language is an important tool, allowing people to advocate for themselves in medical and legal settings or avoiding scams. "People who are language-deprived can really struggle," he says.

John Marsden is most widely known for his young-adult fiction, a genre that he reportedly chose after observing that teenagers had become uninterested in reading. His books include 1987's *So Much To Tell You* and the

wildly popular series starting with 1993's *To-morrow, When the War Began* which has been reprinted over 16 times and filmed for the big screen. John's books may be fairly described as having achieved the goal of getting more young people reading. He has since broadened his attention to education at the schools he founded: Candlebark and Alice Miller.

John's approach to teaching writing is not as rigid as one might expect from someone who has been so successful with the written word. "One of the tragedies in our language is that people believe there are rules," he laments. "The truth is that all those so-called rules are just conventions." His English lessons are often filled with provocations and challenges for the students to find new ways to express their ideas. "I want the students to explore the wider sense of the language and its possibilities."

Having grown up in a more traditional educational setting, John recalls rebelling against some of the writing lessons that were given to him at school. Often, he says, he would use the tasks that were set (for example, to create a story using a given list of words on a chalk-board) to write something completely unexpected. He describes the results as mixed, and says that very little of his childhood writing survives; "only a few fragments that my mother kept." But it is clear that even as a child, John Marsden was an inventive and passionate wordsmith with strong opinions about education. Don't miss his appearances at the Newstead Young Writers Festival tomorrow! John will appear as part of the opening panel about 'The Joy of Writing' from 10am on Saturday 20 October, and is running workshops for young people throughout the day. Historic Hill Climb returns to Maldon for 95th anniversary event

OVER 100 competitors from across South Eastern Australia will converge on Maldon this weekend on October 19 and 20 for the annual Innes Motors Historic Hill Climb at Mt Tarrengower, marking the 95th anniversary of the first event on the hill.

Hosted by the Bendigo Car Club and the Historic Motorcycle Racing Association of Victoria, the two-day event will feature cars and motorcycles built between the 1920s and the early 1980s. With vehicles representing British and European manufacturers, as well as a variety of Japanese, American, and Australian makes, there's something for every motoring enthusiast to enjoy.

Butts Reserve will transform into the pit paddock for the

weekend, where spectators can wander through to admire the machines and chat with their owners. The course runs along the Mt Tarrengower Lookout Road from Butts Reserve to the Poppet Head at the summit.

In addition to the thrilling hill climb, a large motoring display will showcase a variety of historic vehicles, including a noteworthy late-1960s Hill Climb special featuring twin VW engines, which has won the Australian Hill Climb Championship multiple times.

The event kicks off with practice sessions at 12 pm on Saturday, followed by official timed runs starting at 9 am on Sunday. Don't miss this unique opportunity to witness a piece of motoring history in action!



VCAT zone decision for Derby Hill

THE Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal (VCAT) has directed Mount Alexander Shire to issue a Certificate of Compliance to the owner of the former Blue Light Camp to enforce its existing use as a 'youth camp'. The published decision indicates that a hearing took place on Thursday 29 August and the order was made on Tuesday 24 September.

The Mark Ward Property Group, which owns the Mill Markets at Daylesford and Geelong, acquired the land known as Derby Hill in early 2023, after the Blue Light Foundation sold the popular school camp. At the time, the Group announced on social media and its website that "the complex will house accommodation for at least 80 people with the prospect of future development to double that figure," and indicated that the plan was for worker and tourist accommodation.

The dispute at VCAT arose after Mount Alexander Shire Council refused to issue a certificate of compliance to use the site for the purpose of 'accommodation'.

The VCAT decision indicated that while the direction to denote the site's use as a 'youth camp' is potentially a stepping stone to a higher allocation, such as 'accommodation' as requested, the process to determine existing use rights is vigorous and requires 'higher levels of proof' than the applicant provided.

The evidence presented at the hearing convinced VCAT that the site had been altered and tailored between 2008 and 2023 to suit youth activities, thus reinforcing the existing use. In its summary, VCAT pointed out that the land is zoned Public Conservation and Resource (PCRZ), and that the Mount Alexander Planning Scheme indicates that the use of 'Accommodation' is a prohibited use on PCRZ zoned land. Mount Alexander Shire Council and Mark Ward Property Group have been approached for comment.

New worker housing may help crisis



A partnership between the State Government and the largest employer in Castlemaine to build new housing for workers will reportedly improve rental availability in the region. Member for Bendigo West Maree Edwards MP joined with the Managing Director of DonKRC (formerly Castlemaine Bacon Factory) on Friday 11 October to announce that funding from the 'Regional Worker Accommodation Fund' (RWAF) will contribute to the building of new homes on Farnsworth Street, Castlemaine.

Ms Edwards said that workers moving into the new housing will free up homes for other local renters. "I think there is a flow-on effect; it opens up opportunities for others," she said.

The RWAF is designed to boost affordable housing for workers and their families across Victoria and in Castlemaine has resulted in this project that the partners hope will also address the shortage of affordable housing.

Mount Alexander Shire Council (MASC) CEO Darren Fuzzard said of the multi-partner initiative: "Our council's been very focused on trying to improve the availability and affordability of housing for many years. These are not cheap initiatives to undertake and it takes a lot of people to make things like this happen."

Construction of the new homes is not expected to commence until 2025, but the announcement comes as DonKRC heads into a busy period before Christmas. Managing Director, Will Ursell, pointed out that the company already offers a variety of options for workers, including a busy shuttle bus from the train station and existing homes in the town. "There's a lot of housing that we're already involved in to support the business," he said. "This project allows us to bring in more skilled workers." He described the proposed homes as a combination of single and double story kit homes built in Victoria and delivered by a Bendigo supplier.

Regarding housing in the shire, Mr Fuzzard said that MASC is unique in that it has dedicated staff working on the issue. He said it must be approached from various angles. "This is one solution and it's one of many that we need. We're trying to get a better mix," he said.





Social media survey

BLAST FROM THE PAST

TOWER METAL POLISH



RICHARD Dennis Stacey was born at Brokenback near Baringhup in 1877 and worked for much of his life as a miner. He also had an inventive bent and applied for patents related to rock drills and the moulding of concrete pipes. He married Margaret Herbert in 1907 and together they had five children.

In May 1922 the *Tarrangower Times* reported that Stacey had pegged out a claim at Tarrangower behind the Mount. The site contained a deposit of magnesite, a form of magnesium carbonate. Samples had been analysed and were found to be of a high quality. A representative of the Florite Works in North Melbourne, which used over 100 tons of magnesite each year to produce magnesium compounds, visited the site and offered to buy a railway truck full of the mineral.

There is no evidence that Stacey was able to complete the order but in January 1924 he applied for a mining lease over about nine acres of Crown land in the district of Tarrangower west of Cookman's Reef. He proposed to mine for magnesite and expected to spend £100 on the venture.

Five months after Stacey applied for his mining lease local merchants Dabb & Co advertised 'Tower Metal Polish' in the *Tarrangower Times*. The product was described as being made in Maldon from a local mineral by the Maldon Polish Company. It sold for eight pence a cake and its catchy slogan was 'Tickle the Metal with Tower and it smiles without tarnish'. The advertisements only appeared for eight weeks in June and July 1924.

Tower Polish was made of magnesite and was sold in blocks the size of a bar of soap. The paper wrappers featured a logo depicting the Mount Tarrengower Tower that was constructed just before the product was launched. Local printer Ernest Whitlock produced the wrappers. Apart from being a general metal polish it was also recommended for cleaning glass and white shoes. The Tower Polish trademark was officially registered in October 1924. Tower Polish was probably only produced for a short period but stocks of it may have continued to be held by local businesses such as Brooks' Store in Templeton Street up until the 1970s.

The site of Richard Stacey's magnesite lease is probably on the Western Track just west of Back Mount Road and north of South Parkins Reef Road. The site is listed on the Victorian Heritage register as the Maldon Magnesite Shaft. It includes a shallow shaft about 1.8 metres deep and several small shallow holes in the bank of a dry creek.

We will be back next week, and it will be 'All Aboard' for another journey with the cards! Perhaps more spinach, as Pop-Eye enjoyed, is what we need!





The mine of information

SCRATCH a bit and discover what lies beneath the surface.

This is the most important exhibit in the museum, the mine. Gold mines are the reason Maldon is here, the reason that Melbourne, even Australia became what it is now.

At the height of the gold rush Bendigo was the richest city in the world, that's a big

Melbourne was the second largest city in the British Empire, after London. Melbourne was basically the port for the goldfields. Back to the mine. Yesterday I met another

really interesting identity at the Museum, Michelle Ross.

Michelle is a true enthusiast. She is one of those people who obviously has a passion and is driven by it.

Her particular passion is the history of gold mining. Her other passion is her two sons, who were desperately trying to drag her away. She's also pretty good at multitasking.

Have a look at Michelle's web page goldfieldsguide.com.au or her YouTube channel Goldfields Guide. This article nearly didn't get written because I couldn't stop watching.....

The museum holds quite a few authentic relics from the early gold days. To my untrained eye, they look interesting, but with Michelle's amazing knowledge, they all come to life, almost like Ben Stiller's Night at the Museum (obviously, that was the message of the movie).

The mine exhibit is partly constructed on a real mine shaft. When they were digging it out, they came across an 'adit' (mining terminology for a service shaft), it's yet to be fully explored. The museum is basically on the site of the Great Western Mine, which was 1,100 feet or about 300 metres deep. Mt Tarrengower is about 250 metres high from its base (569 metres above sea level), to put that in perspective. It produced about 63,000 ounces of gold, or about two tons. Again, to make that more meaningful, 63,000 ounces is worth \$245,700,000 today.

That's just one mine, in Maldon!

Bendigo produced around 650 tons of gold during the gold rush. I don't have enough zeros in my calculator for that. Again, the richest city in the world.

So, you can see what all the fuss was about.

I keep getting distracted. Back in the mine exhibit, the relics

- A Kibble bucket, which was used to transport equipment and sometimes miners in and out of the mine.
- Safety cages, which were basically lifts, but with spring loaded arms which would activate if the cable
- A California pump, which used a long continuous belt with blocks attached, moving inside a square tunnel, wound by hand which

would transfer water away from the base of the mine

Cradle with sluice, which was used in the very early days, just by shovelling gravel in the top and then tipping water through the sluice which traps the heavier gold and lets the waste flow away. This was for alluvial gold found in creeks.

Most of the relics came from the now closed Carmans Tunnel mine on the south side of

Book Launch at the Athenaeum Library, Friday 25 October, 10.30am

THE library is proud to support local authors Denise Main and Ian Chisholm to launch their novel Voices of The Whipstick. During the Victorian COVID-19 2020 long winter lockdown, Denise and Ian began writing together, and Voices of The Whipstick came into being and was published in late 2023.

Please join us for a morning of inspiration at the Maldon Athenaeum Library, 97 High Street, Maldon (next to the Post Office). Morning Tea is provided, gold coin donation.

Here is a brief synopsis of Voices of the Whipstick, described as a tender and deeply moving novel that explores what can befall those who lose what they love most.

Mick Tranter was born and raised at the edge of the ancient Whipstick Forest, north of Bendigo. When the outbreak of WW2 interrupts his active rural lifestyle, he joins the AIF, and on his last night of leave, he meets and falls in love with a young woman at a Saturday night dance. Love letters and a photo of her go with him to the battlefields of New Guinea and become his talisman. He experiences the harrowing brutality of jungle warfare, only to be posted as missing in action and all communication is lost with his girl and his family. Later, he is found ill and wounded. He survives the war but returns home in a fragile mental state. Despite the love and care from his mother and his best friend, he is haunted by guilt and shame and enduring sadness over the loss of the girl he loves. He retreats to his beloved Whipstick Forest, but his troubled mind, not relieved by reclusiveness, worsens until he has an epiphany that sets him on the path to atonement.

The authors:

Denise Main was raised in Bendigo and graduated from the Northern District School of Nursing. She was appointed Community Health Nurse at the Eaglehawk and Long Gully Community Health Centre, one of the first community health centres in Australia. Her experiences endeared the community to her and provided the many stories she had the privilege of hearing. Her first manuscript, Mission: Angela, a spy/historical fiction novel, was published in 2022.

Ian Chisholm was born in Swan Hill and completed his secondary education at Maryborough High School. After completing a Graphic Design Diploma at Bendigo School of Mines he graduated from the Technical Teachers College in Melbourne and began a career as a secondary art teacher. Writing began seriously when recalling and writing what eventually became A Collection of Imperfect Memories of a Life Half Remembered. After many years he renewed his acquaintance with Denise Main and a deep friendship formed through their many mutual interests. It was their shared interest in writing that prompted them to co-write the manuscript which became Voices of the Whipstick.

Book Reviews

Verity by Colleen Hoover, 2018

Lowen Ashleigh is a struggling writer on the brink of financial ruin when she accepts the job offer of a lifetime. Jeremy Crawford, husband of bestselling author Verity Crawford, has hired Lowen to complete the remaining books in a successful series his injured wife is unable to finish.

Lowen arrives at the Crawford home, ready to sort through years of Verity's notes and outlines, hoping to find enough material to get her started. What Lowen doesn't expect to uncover in the chaotic office is an unfinished autobiography Verity never intended for anyone to read. Page after page of bone-chilling admissions, including Verity's recollection of what really happened the day her daughter died.

Lowen decides to keep the manuscript hidden from Jeremy, knowing its contents would devastate the already grieving father. But as Lowen's feelings for Jeremy begin to intensify, she recognises all the ways she could benefit if he were to read his wife's words. After all, no matter how devoted Jeremy is to his injured wife, a truth this horrifying would make it impossible for him to continue to love her.

The Morning Star by Karl Ove Knausgaard, 2020

It's a normal night in August. Literature professor Arne and artist Tove are with their children at the resort in southern Norway. Their friend, Egil, a driver by day, is staying in a cabin nearby. Kathrine, a priest, is on her way home from a seminar, the journalist Jostein is out on the town, and his wife Turid, who is an assistant nurse, has a night shift.

Above them all, a huge star suddenly appears in the sky. No one, not even the astronomers, knows for sure what kind of phenomenon it is. Is there a star burning itself out? Why then has no one seen it before? Or is it a brand new star? Slowly the interest in the news subsides, and life goes on, but not quite as before, for unusual phenomena begin to occur on the fringes

The Nancys by R.W.R. McDonald, 2019

Tippy Chan is 11 and lives in a small town in a very quiet part of the world - the place her Uncle Pike escaped from the first chance he got as a teenager. Now Pike is back with his new boyfriend Devon to look after Tippy while her mum's on a cruise.

Tippy is in love with her uncle's old Nancy Drew books, especially the early ones where Nancy was 16 and did whatever she wanted. She wants to be Nancy and is desperate to solve a real mystery. When her teacher's body is found beside Riverstone's only traffic light, Tippy's moment has arrived. She and her minders form The Nancys, a secret amateur detective club.

But what starts as a bonding and sightseeing adventure quickly morphs into something far more dangerous. A wrongful arrest, a close call with the murderer, and an intervention from Tippy's mum all conspire against The Nancys. But regardless of their own safety, and despite the constant distraction of questionable fashion choices in the town that style forgot, The Nancys know only they can stop the killer from striking again.

The Nancys is gripping and glorious, a heart-warming novel for anyone who's ever felt they were on the outside looking in. At its heart it is about the family we make and how we must summon the courage to face the truth, no matter what the cost may be.

Monty: Always do.







Boneseed – is that a weed?



YES, Boneseed (Chrysanthemoides monilifera) is classified as a Weed of National Significance (WONS) across Australia and as a 'Regionally Prohibited' noxious weed in the North Central Catchment (our region) in Victoria. It was introduced from South Africa to Australia as an ornamental garden plant around the late 1800s and has become an extremely invasive environmental weed, spreading from gardens into native environments across southern Australia. It's now spreading very quickly within the Mount Alexander Shire.

Please remove Boneseed if you find it in your garden or on your property, as it very easily spreads into our native bush. Like all weeds, it's a problem because it displaces native plants, reducing native biodiversity in our natural environment. Dense infestations virtually eliminate the growth of native understorey plant species and reduce the growth of native shrubs and trees, which negatively affects our native birds and animals by altering their habitat, ecosystem and essential food chain.

Boneseed is a woody shrub growing to around two

metres high and wide, comes from the daisy family and produces typical 'daisy-like' bright yellow flowers in late winter to spring (see photo). Its leaves are a distinct green, oval-shaped with irregularly toothed edges. It produces hard, round seeds during summer, which are spread by animals such as birds and foxes, as well as through water, garden refuse and soil movement.

Boneseed has shallow roots which makes it easy to hand-pull small plants (see photo) at any time of the year, which can be left to decompose on the ground. Larger plants need herbicide application by using 'cutting and painting' the stumps, which is best done when plants are actively growing. For very dense and large infestations, spraying or burning may also be



Friendly Ford fanatics


MAIN Street Maldon was treated to an informal parade of early Ford Falcons on Saturday, as a stream of gleaming colour glided through town.


