A BLUE-RIBBON DAY AT THE SHOW



Hooray for the 160th Maldon and Baringhup Show on Sunday 20 October! It was a winner of a day under blue skies at the Maldon Racecourse and Recreation Reserve, where folks gathered to appreciate the achievements of growers, breeders, makers, doers and animals of our region.

There was something for everyone to enjoy. The Maldon Brass Band and the Martini Set provided musical accompaniment by the canteen, where a troop of helpers prepared sandwiches and scones for hungry punters. Perky ponies and hightailing horses contrasted with sheep in sheds, who looked bored until they were singled out for the shearing demonstration. A voice on loudspeaker echoed through the gumtrees.

Secretary of the Maldon and Baringhup Agricultural Society (MBAS) Leeanne said she was thrilled with the turnout on the day. "The drawcard for this show is that once you walk in the gate, everything is free for kids so you don't have to keep

putting your hand in your pocket to pay for things," she said. "It's a great day for families."

Collections, crafts and cookery in cabinets lined up alongside floral and fruit displays, showcasing skills of locals young and old. MBAS committee member and crafter Debbie McDonald said that the Show was returning to its pre-COVID scale and received very positive feedback. "I've had so many people come and say it's one of the most terrific displays they've seen," Debbie said.

Proud winner of a blue ribbon for his banana cake, Albert from Newstead proved that making the decision to have a go and enter the Show can be very rewarding. It was his second entry, having baked a Bloke's Chocolate Cake eight years ago. "Somebody mentioned the Show to me and I thought I would try again," he said, revealing that he was inspired by Stephanie Alexander and added his own twist to create the winning recipe. "I do like to cook, just because I enjoy it, but I don't

normally bake. I have Italian background so it's in my blood!"

There were activities for kids at every turn, with magic and puppet shows; reptiles and bouncing castles; haunted house and icecream cones. Logan and Ashton tried their luck with the fairground clowns game and the shouts of 'mum!' squawked from the rock-climbing tower all day.

The fun and inclusive events drew big crowds. There were prizes for dogs who were waggy, obedient or who looked like their owners (which is a kind way of saying that the owners look like their dogs). The Gumboot Toss was risky for observers in front and behind and on either side, who noted that the technique seemed to be perfected by those who knew when to let go. The *Tarrangower Times* dodged a boot or two and had a wonderful day at the Maldon and Baringhup Show; blue ribbons to the organisers and see you next year.

Map Mystery

THE TT was intrigued by the questions raised in the Letter to the Editor last week ('A Sign of the Times' 18/10/2024) and set out to investigate. Thanks to Sharon Telford, of Telford's Road, for bringing the issue - which is evidently close to her heart as well as her home- to our attention.

The first thing our intrepid reporter uncovered is that if there is a blatant mistake on Google Maps, it is possible to report it by navigating to the location and clicking on its name. Then click 'Report a Problem' to see a menu that includes 'Missing place,' 'Add or fix a road' and 'Wrong Information,' with an option to

share feedback or report technical issues to Google Maps.

The Langs Rd mystery was not so easily solved, however. The current street signage indicates two legs of Langs Rd, one between Morris and Hornsby Streets that seems to be the original stretch, and a second leg between Hornsby Street and Allens Lane, crossing over the railway line.

Google Maps online also calls this second, longer stretch of road Langs Lane.

However, the Google App for mobile devices calls it Woodlocks Lane and the Street View photo, which was taken in 2010, shows a sign saying Woodlocks

Lane. As Sharon pointed out, the road is known as Woodlocks Lane in other places including maps for the Castlemaine to Maldon Trail.

The indomitable TT investigator had no luck with the Wayback Machine (the internet archive) and has requested clarification from the Council, who manage local roads and signage, to find out why and when Woodlocks Lane became Langs Rd. If further information is forthcoming, you can read about it in the *Tarrangower Times*.

Rare comet visible over Australia for first time in 80,000 years

Three days to 3G shutdown

Small and family businesses have just three days to make sure they do not have their vital business systems and equipment fail when the 3G network is switched off on 28 October, says the Australian Small Business and Family Enterprise Ombudsman, Bruce Billson. “Many of us do not realise there is an awful lot of technology and equipment we use every day that’s enabled by 3G as the wireless comms link and that it will stop working when the system is turned off later this month unless it is upgraded,” Mr Billson said. “Don’t risk being caught out. Please, check the functionality of your technology so you’re not a 3G casualty.”

Snake season is here, so be prepared and stay safe

As temperatures rise, snakes become more active, seeking food and mates. Abby Smith from DEECA advises: “Most bites occur when people try to capture or kill snakes. It’s best to leave them alone and keep dogs on leads.” Snakes pose little danger when left undisturbed. Wear long pants, proper shoes, and carry a mobile in the bush. Keep pets away from snake-prone areas and maintain lawns and clean up around your home. If bitten, call 000. Snakes are protected under the Wildlife Act 1975. For first aid, visit St John Ambulance.

Free camping

Premier Jacinta Allan and Minister for Environment Steve Dimopoulos visited Leanganook Camping Area in Mount Alexander Regional Park on Sunday 13 October to announce camping will be free at all 131 of Parks Victoria’s paid campgrounds from 1 December 2024 until 30 June 2025. The government is also investing in additional maintenance, repairs and operating costs to ensure campgrounds are kept clean and safe for all to enjoy. Existing bookings for the summer will be honoured and refunded. To camp in a national parks or state forest, make a booking at parks.vic.gov.au.

Road maintenance blitz revs up across regional victoria

The State Government is rolling out a major road maintenance blitz to rebuild, repair, and resurface roads right across Victoria. Over the next nine months, crews will complete thousands of projects on our network, ranging from road rehabilitation and resurfacing, to patching potholes and maintaining bridges, traffic lights, signage and road infrastructure. The blitz will target the state’s busiest travel and trade routes, with works set to be delivered on roads that were prioritised based on expert assessments and community feedback.

Powercor is encouraging people to plan ahead this spring by carefully selecting the right trees and location when planting near powerlines. Plants growing too close to powerlines are a safety risk and can cause power outages and fires. Powercor says the simplest solution is to avoid planting trees under powerlines altogether.

National Party announces VCAT plan

The Nationals have declared that they will restore to landowners the right of appeal against VCAT decisions, saying the move will give voice to those affected most by the transition to renewable energy. Leader of The Nationals Peter Walsh also says the party will institute a default 2km buffer zone around proposed wind towers to minimise the impact on residential properties and nearby communities. The Nationals state they will advocate to the Commonwealth for tax exemptions on compensation received by landowners for hosting major transmission lines or other impacts caused by renewable energy projects.

Check your breasts

October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month and Cancer Council Victoria is urging Victorians to check their breasts. Head of Screening, Early Detection and Immunisation at Cancer Council Victoria, Kate Broun said, “Breast cancer is a common cancer, but it’s also highly treatable when found early. That’s why it’s important that Victorians get to know the normal look and feel of their breasts, have a breast screen every two years if they are eligible, and see a doctor if they notice any changes.”

Cooperative plan to heal country

DJAARA, the Dja Dja Wurrung Clans Aboriginal Corporation, and national conservation not-for-profit Bush Heritage Australia launched a shared plan on Wednesday 16 October to guide landscape management across nearly 3,000 hectares of Bush Heritage-managed reserves in north-west Victoria. The two organisations, which have worked together for 17 years, celebrated their Wurreka Galkangu partnership and the Wurreka Galkangu shared strategic landscape plan in a ceremony on Djandak (Dja Dja Wurrung Country) at Bush Heritage-managed Bellair Reserve, east of Bendigo. The Wurreka Galkangu partnership is a deep commitment to right-way land management that creates space for culturally led land management practices and Western science to meet.

Bendigo family and domestic violence roundtable

Local organisations, advocates and first responders that operate in the family and domestic violence sector joined Federal Member for Bendigo, Lisa Chesters on Thursday 17 October for a crisis roundtable to discuss how the National Plan to End Violence against Women and Children 2022-2032 (National Plan) is being rolled out locally. Encouragement for Young Writers

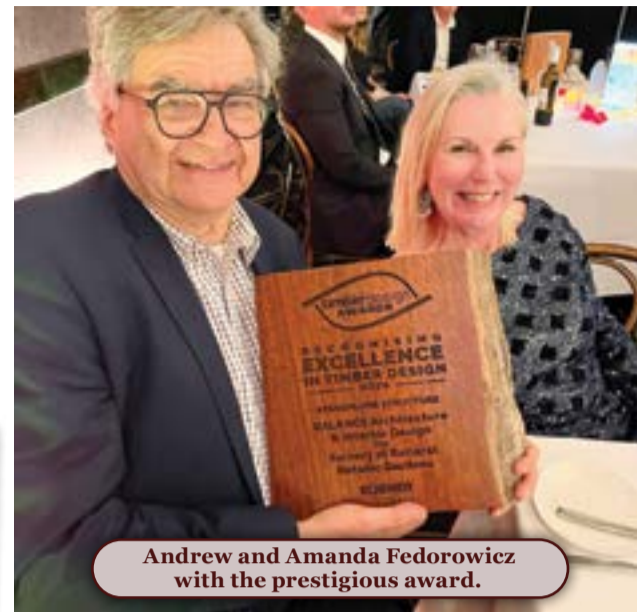

Award for Spectacular Fernery

LOCAL resident Andrew Fedorowicz, Heritage Architect and fellow of the Australian Institute of Architects, has won a prestigious award for a unique project at the 2024 Australian Timber Design Awards (ATDAs). The presentation ceremony took place on Wednesday 16 October in Sydney and Andrew enthusiastically named it a 'night of nights!'

The ATDAs recognised outstanding timber design in the built environment and they awarded Andrew's company, Balance Architecture and Interior Design, Winner for Excellence in Timber Design in the category of Standalone Structure for the Fernery at Ballarat Botanic Gardens.

The original fernery was built in 1887 but demolished in the 1920s due to timber deterioration. The new construction, which is a striking rebuild of the nineteenth century structure, is crafted from a highly durable, nature-resistant and responsibly-sourced South American teak called cumaru. "The whole point of it was that it had to be exactly the same as the original. It had been made from timbers that couldn't withstand the Australian climate," Andrew said. "That new building will outlive all of us."

Andrew described the award and the reactions of visitors to the Fernery as a "real pat on the back," and was chuffed when his fellow architects cheered his achievements on the night. "It was the pinnacle of my architectural career."

New literary group presents Arnold Zable



THERE'S a new group in town and they have wonderful plans to bring 'all things literature' to Maldon. The Maldon Readers and Writers Group is introducing itself by running its first event on Sunday 10 November: an afternoon in conversation with celebrated author Arnold Zable.

The Maldon Readers and Writers Group (MRWG) was formed by Bernice Steinfort and Peter Veenhuizen, who hope to offer opportunities for connections amongst book-lovers of the area. The MRWG says that the afternoon promises to be insightful, informative and inspiring, and Peter and Bernice hope it is the first of many events to come for the newly formed group. Sean's scratchboard skill

Wood grain.

IT'S not every day you get serenaded in Main Street with Annie Laurie played on a viola by the artist you meet for an interview. This month at the MANet Art Gallery, the visiting artist is Sean Kenan, a multi-skilled arts person verging on being a local Renaissance Man. He is a Scratchboard Artist and Street Performer; he teaches Irish fiddle and plays music in the streets of Castlemaine and Daylesford.

Sean has some very strong opinions about art and music and he is very handy with a relevant quote... He quoted Samuel Butler who wrote, 'Life is like playing the violin in public, you learn as you go along'.

Sean has lived in Maldon for about 10 years now. Back in the early 1970s he went to Prahran Technical College and studied Graphic Design. Before that at school, Sean was always drawing on blotting paper as he was brought up in the days before bios (1950s). In those days school children were taught to write with steel nib pens and there were inkwells in each desk, hence the blotting paper. Sean said he concentrated on drawing rather than paying attention to lessons.

Woodcarving has also been a hobby for Sean since he was about 15. These skills led him to experimenting with Scratchboard which requires both carving and cutting skills. This interest in wood is reflected in Wood Grain, which also illustrates his cutting skills. Sean uses tools similar to lino cutting equipment which enable him to achieve very fine detail in his work as you can see in the set of miniatures.

Unsurprisingly, Sean said that he has been profoundly influenced by David Frazer's amazing lino cuts. However, while David's work is getting bigger and more complex, Sean's work is quite small and in some cases tiny. There is a box of miniatures in the exhibition which are \$20 each. Larger works are \$60.

Sean uses Scratchboard and Clayboard. The process is similar to woodcuts and wood engraving. A thin layer of clay is applied to a board and then covered in Indian ink. Scratching the black surface reveals the white clay surface underneath. The works are not prints as each one is an original creation.

But let's talk about his work on exhibition in the MANet Art Gallery. I first saw him at the most recent gallery opening when he dextrously wove

his way through the crowd playing his viola with nary an accident, as people chatted and sipped delectable sparkling rosé from Welshmans Reef.

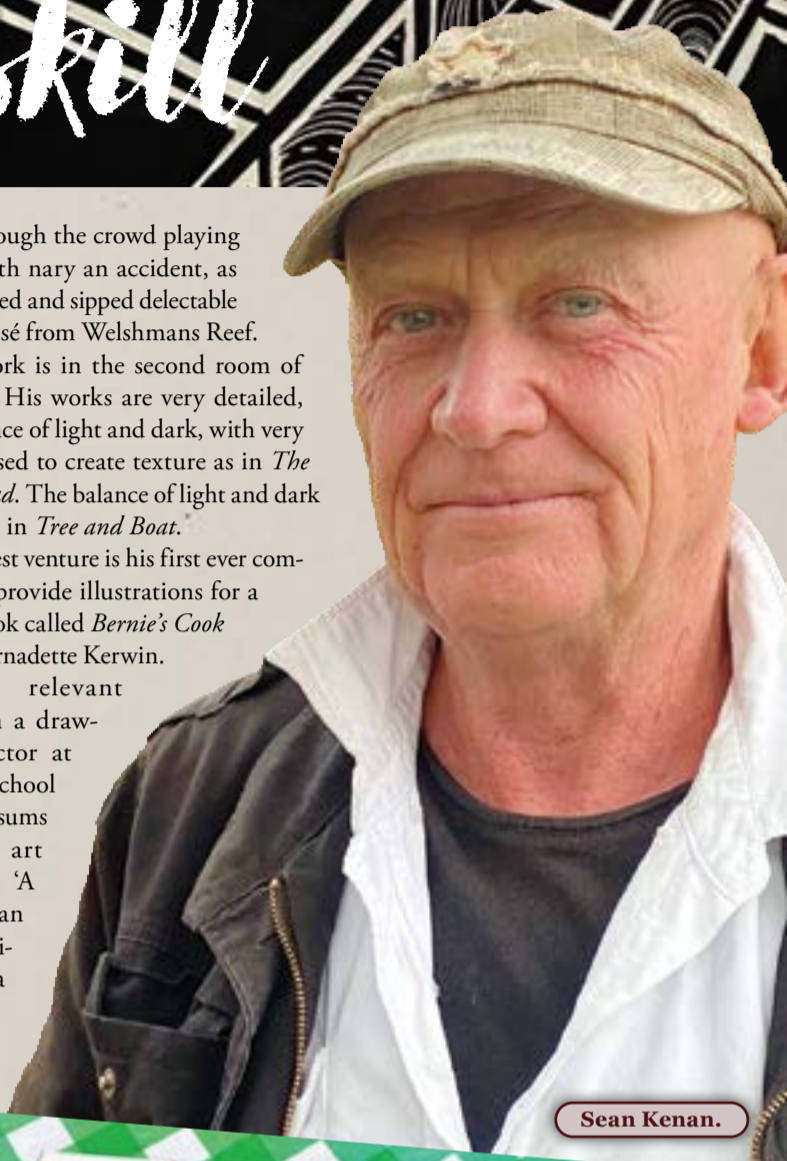
Sean's work is in the second room of the gallery. His works are very detailed, with a balance of light and dark, with very fine lines used to create texture as in *The Crooked Road*. The balance of light and dark is very clear in *Tree and Boat*.

Sean's latest venture is his first ever commission to provide illustrations for a little A5 book called *Bernie's Cook Book*, by Bernadette Kerwin.

Another relevant quote from a drawing instructor at the Slade School rather aptly sums up Sean's art and music, 'A single line can express vitality, just like a single note on a violin'.

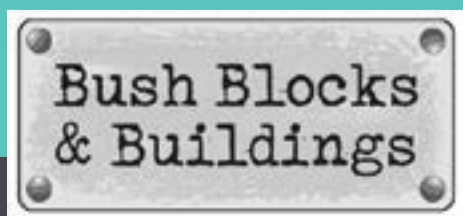

Dhelkaya Health partners with Redbox Wildlife Shelter to support local kangaroo care

In a significant step towards wildlife conservation, Dhelkaya Health is proud to announce a new partnership with Redbox Wildlife Shelter, coinciding with World Kangaroo Day on 24 October. This collaboration aims to enhance the safety and care of our local kangaroo population by equipping Dhelkaya Health's fleet vehicles with Wildlife Assistance Kits.

These kits, generously donated by Redbox Wildlife Shelter, contain basic supplies and information for drivers who may encounter injured wildlife during their travels. Each kit provides basic support for small animals, as well as crucial contact details and guidance notes for managing injuries of all sizes.

Nikki Medwell from Redbox Wildlife Shelter expressed her enthusiasm for the initiative: "Our volunteers generously put these kits together so that anyone can have the right information at their fingertips (in their glovebox, under their car seat) if they ever need it. Our shelter specialises in kangaroo care, and often injuries can be treated and rehabilitated to a state where these gorgeous animals can return to the forest with their mob."

Dhelkaya Health Fleet Officer, Kirsty White recently visited the Redbox shelter and was inspired by the work being done. "I am really pleased that we are now able to provide our staff with the correct information, not only about who to contact, but how they can help the injured animal, if they choose to at the time," Kirsty said. "Seeing the amazing work that Nikki and all the volunteers are doing at the shelter first-hand gave me a much better appreciation for the positive outcomes that they can have for injured kangaroos and orphaned joeys."

This partnership reflects Dhelkaya Health's commitment to community well-being, not just for its residents but for the native wildlife that enriches the region. As we celebrate World Kangaroo Day, both organisations encourage the community to engage in responsible wildlife practices and to utilise the Wildlife Assistance Kits when necessary. NEWSTEAD PRIMARY'S DAILY FITNESS PROGRAM

Newstead Primary School is known for its unique culture, and one of its standout programs is Daily Fitness—a triumphant half-hour activity held each morning. This program brings the school together, with six pairs of Grade 5/6 students leading activities for the younger students.

All students, except for the leaders, are divided into six groups. Each day, a different pair of 5/6 leaders work with a group, setting up an activity and teaching the younger students how to play. While the leaders set up their equipment, the other students participate in stretches and dances, following the Grade 5/6 students who lead them from the front.

Once the stretching and dancing are done, the leaders call out their groups and lead them to their activity. They explain the rules and guide the students through the game. Throughout the session, three bells ring to signal different stages of the activity. When the final bell rings, the session ends, and the groups return for more stretching. The leaders pack up their equipment neatly in the sports shed and then help with the stretches until it's time to return to class.

Leaders are assigned a specific type of activity, such as ball skills, running games, tag games, or obstacle courses. They must choose a game within their category to teach during the session. When the Prep/1 students have a sports day coming up, the leaders select games that will be featured on the day so the younger students can practise and learn the rules in advance. For example, on Tabloid Sports Day, each pair of leaders picks a game, sets it up, and teaches the students how to play, encouraging them to give it their best effort.

Each term, the leadership roles rotate to ensure all students have a chance to lead. Grade 6 students have first priority, but Grade 5 students are also given opportunities, especially when paired with a Grade 6 to learn the ropes. This approach spreads leadership skills across the class, ensuring fairness and giving everyone a chance to take on a high-quality role. The leaders are responsible for setting up and packing up their activities, which requires communication, teamwork, and a strong sense of responsibility—all of which align with the school's core values.

Daily Fitness not only keeps students active and healthy but also helps them develop skills for a wide range of sports. It provides the younger students with valuable life skills and builds friendships and strong leadership qualities in the Grade 5/6 students.

Q. With summer coming up I've noticed tall grass growing everywhere and I'm worried about my dog getting grass seeds in his coat. How will I know if grass seeds are irritating him and what can I do about it?

A. This is certainly a question we hear a lot at this time of the year. While dogs may be having a great time running around in the grass, pesky grass seeds can get caught in their coat and start moving towards the body. The shape of the seeds allows them to easily pierce and enter the dog's skin and continue to move deeper inside the body. Common areas for grass seeds to become lodged include in between the paws, in the ears, nose and underneath the eyelids.

Signs that your dog may be affected by a grass seed include licking constantly at their paws, limping, shaking their head or having sore ears, continued sneezing or drooling, red or swollen eyes, or constantly licking at a particular area of their body. Complications arise due to the fact that grass seeds can carry bacteria and cause infections, and they can continue to move within the body, causing abscesses or issues far from the entry site.

During this season, it pays to be vigilant for grass seeds – get in the habit of running your hands over your pet's coat and feet after they've been running outside, and check their ears and eyes. Keep their coats clean and clipped short, especially around the feet. If caught early, grass seeds can be removed. However, this sometimes needs to be done under sedation to avoid pain and stress to your pet. If you suspect a grass seed, it is best to get your pet seen to by a veterinarian straight away.

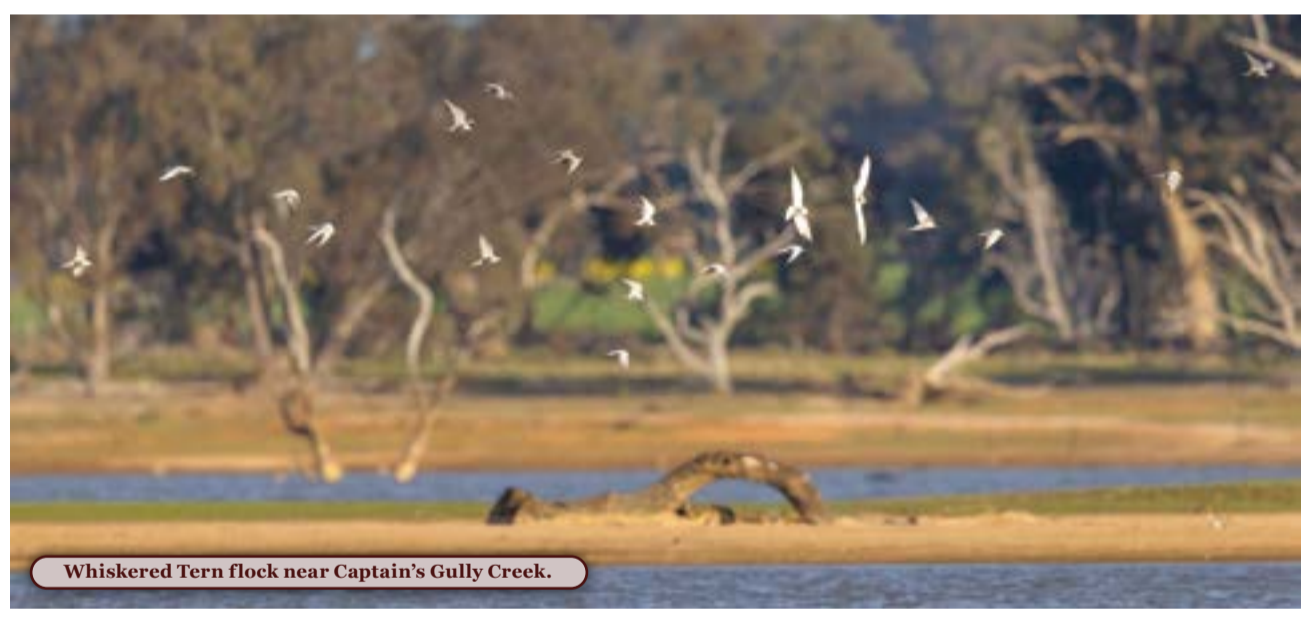
Terns on the lake

After something of an absence **Whiskered Terns** have returned to Cairn Curran.

Last week I enjoyed watching a flock of about 20 birds feeding over choppy waters near Joyces Creek. They were making frequent short dives in pursuit of prey, presumably small fish. I observed two a couple of weeks back, the first for quite some time.

Several were clearly adults in breeding plumage with bright-red bills and sooty underparts. Whiskered Terns are largely an inland bird where they favour shallow, freshwater wetlands. Their numbers fluctuate locally – in wet years I've seen several hundred on the wetlands of the plains, whereas in dry times they may depart the district altogether. Apparently they are mainly a summer visitor to southern Australia, but I have recorded them in all seasons.

I was amazed at how quickly the flock moved across the lake, travelling a kilometre or more in what seemed like moments, before beating back into the wind at a much slower pace.

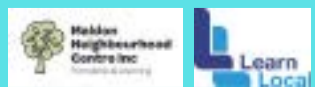

BLAST FROM THE PAST

MALDON STRIKE BREAKERS

IN June 1902 William Irwin became Premier of Victoria following the resignation of Alexander Peacock. Within a month Irwin went to an election and won when he promised to reduce the numbers of members of State Parliament and public servants. In May 1903 when railway workers went on strike over reductions in their conditions, Irwin introduced strike suppression legislation, cancelled the accrued financial benefits of union leaders and recruited strike breakers. Mining engine drivers worked with large steam engines and were qualified to replace striking locomotive drivers.

On Tuesday 19 May 1903 at the half-yearly meeting of the Maldon branch of the Amalgamated Mining Engine-drivers' Association, John South asked the branch executive if they approved of members applying to replace railwaymen on strike. President Martin Cooper said they condemned such conduct but there were always a few 'black-legs' who disgraced themselves. Robert Bromley then said that the branch should support other unionists, and he was annoyed to hear reports that one of their branch officers was a 'black-leg'.

The branch treasurer William Jenkins called for calm and asked the meeting to check if the allegations were true before they condemned anyone. Secretary William Preece however said he knew who had applied for the railway jobs and prompt action should be taken to protect those who were innocent. John South then moved that members of the branch condemn the actions of mining engine drivers who applied for positions during the railway strike.

In the discussion that followed, John Evans said that strike breakers were beneath contempt, but before the motion was passed, all the facts should be known. William Preece replied that he thought the motion did not go far enough and those who were suspected should publicly explain themselves. Robert Bromley then said he was waiting to hear from James McAlpine, who had applied for a job with the Railway Department.

McAlpine, who was present, said that he had been out of work and being unable to get a job locally had walked to Bendigo. There he met Frederick Wagener and both applied unsuccessfully for railway jobs. He said he wasn't aware that the strike was about wages and didn't think he had broken any of the branch's rules. McAlpine also apologised for what he had done saying it was done without thinking.

Martin Cooper said McAlpine's explanation was satisfactory but William Preece disagreed as McAlpine had transgressed against a basic principle of unionism. The majority of those present however thought that as McAlpine had come forward and apologised, his explanation should be accepted. McAlpine thanked the meeting when it passed a motion accepting his apology.

John South's original motion was passed. William Preece then moved that all engine drivers suspected of being strike breakers should attend the next meeting of the branch and explain themselves. Preece's motion was passed without dissent.

'WINNING THE LOTTERY SHOCK'

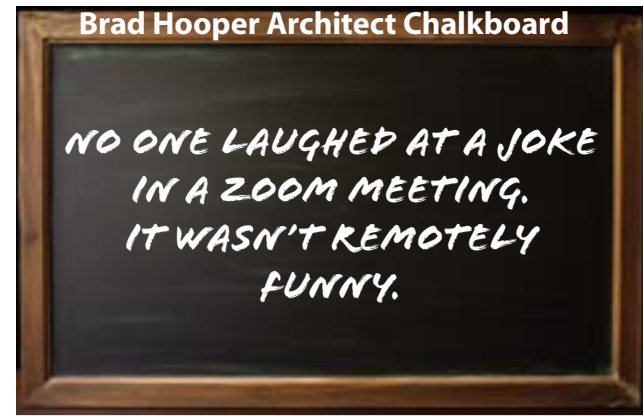
'Count your cards', 'Don't trump your partner's trick' and 'Keep a Stopper!' in no-trumps play. Invariably we still manage to break those rules!!

STORIES FROM THE... MALDON VINTAGE MACHINERY &

MUSEUM

Maldon's Lara Croft Michelle Ross

ONE of the best things about the museum, other than the exhibits, is the people you meet there. I have always been a history tragic, but on my last visit to the museum, I met Michelle Ross. Michelle has a YouTube channel with 9,000 followers and a website called Goldfields Guide; she really is an enthusiast.

If you're even remotely interested in goldfields history and I'm guessing if you're reading this there's at least a spark, have a look at Michelle's sites.

It's great to see younger people involved with museums generally and Michelle is leading by example.

I just had to ask how she got started, "I was always into history as a kid, ancient Egypt and all that." But later on she found that her boys loved being out in the bush, running around and that led to gold fossicking and discovering relics.

So it was a mixture of archaeology and treasure hunting, I'm thinking an Australian Lara Croft.

She had about 140 pages of information on the website when it was launched and on the first day received over 1,000 hits. It now has over (almost) 700 locations on it.

Michelle really makes the history fascinating; she's a storyteller. One thing leads to another and Michelle's curiosity has her investigating specific aspects of mining. For a while she was investigating abandoned tunnels (note - these were stone drainage tunnels, not mine tunnels, there are some really cool ones in Ballarat) and currently she's into mining machinery. Later in the mining boom, large amounts of money were spent on equipment, and the area had some of the biggest, most sophisticated machinery in the world, some of it manufactured locally. She was describing the beam engine at Moolort, which was basically a big pump, a very big pump, think 50 feet high and powered by a steam engine, the biggest beam engine in Australia (note - it was the biggest in Victoria and one of the best in the world at the time- it was imported from England. The huge beam engine at the Berry No 1 Mine near Creswick was manufactured locally though) and used to pump the water out of a deep mine shaft.

Some favourite mine sites are Kingower, Weala (Wehla), Wild Dog, Morton's Inn at Waanyarra, Majorca. Have a look at her video on YouTube about Kingower; it will make you want to go and explore. There's all sorts of stuff still lying around, but unless you know what you're looking at, most of it just looks like piles of bricks and holes in the ground. I guess that is the point that I keep coming back to. Some other sites are the deep lead mines near Creswick and the quartz mines at Stawell. There's a Goldfields Guide video about Stawell, which is surrounded with monuments and references to the gold rush, not to mention a fully working commercial gold mine.

Which brings us back to Maldon. Some of the best relics of machinery foundations are right here. Go down to the end of Parkins Reef Rd and you'll find what's left of the North British mine. As well as that we've got the quartz kilns which you can see without even getting out of your car in High Street and the bucket dredge at Porcupine Flat near Fogartys Gap Road. Other favourite sites are Walhalla and Ballarat.

There was a progression from alluvial mining, panning in creeks to mining on an industrial scale. Much of this started in Ballarat, where the ground was soft and sandy and the miners had to work out how to get down deep, without being buried in mud or sand. Then they had to get beneath the basalt. Speak with anyone in the museum and it all starts to mean something.

The Victorian goldfields are still the seventh largest gold producer worldwide, with significant mines at Fosterville north of Bendigo and Stawell, plus the Kaiser Reef processing plant just outside of town in Maldon.

As I've mentioned before, the more I learn about the gold rush, the more I realise I don't know.

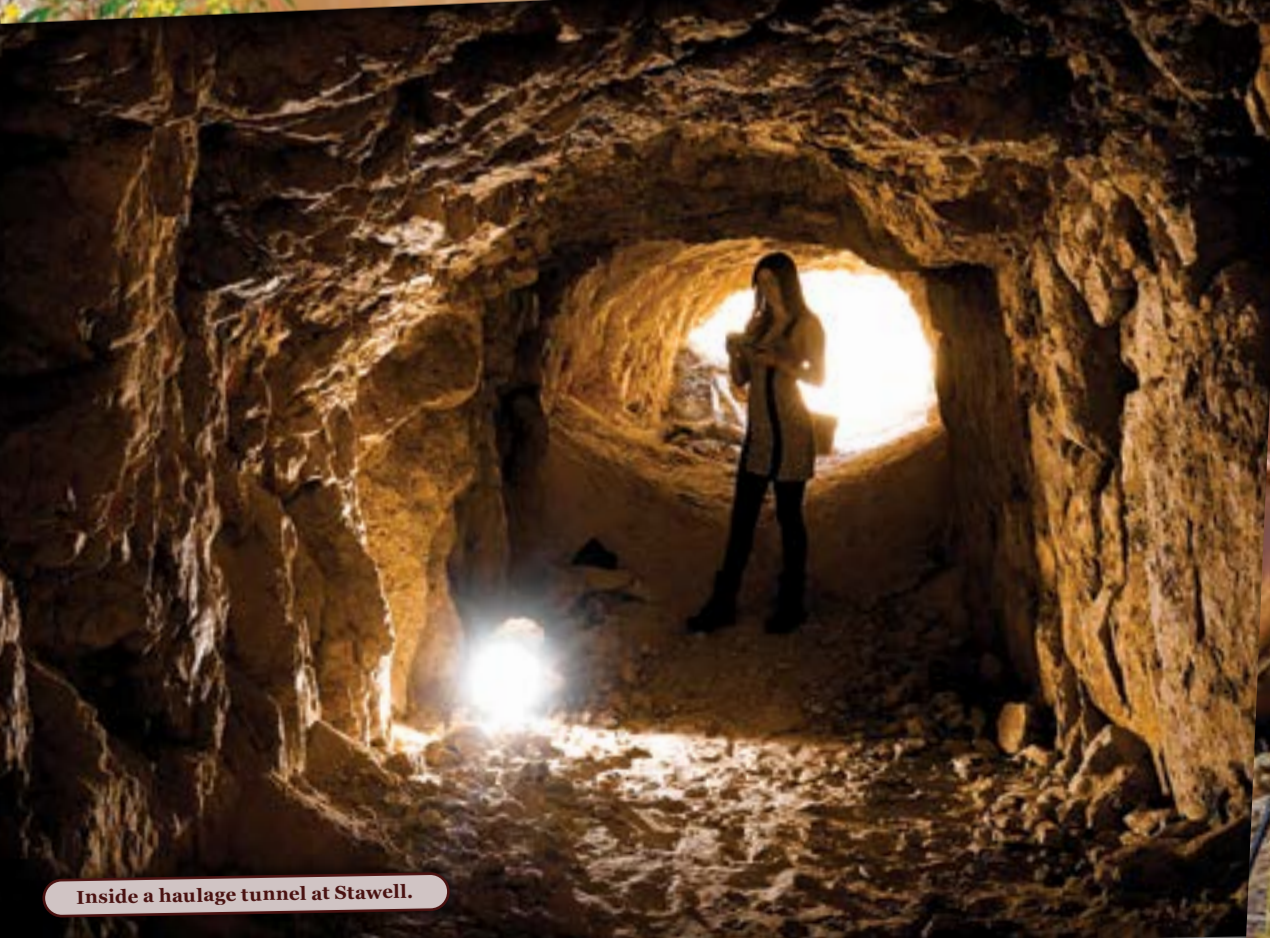
The real benefit of speaking with Michelle is that she has such a broad knowledge so that she can put it all in perspective and all the elements start to make sense. The timeline, the progression of the machinery, the social effects and the very foundations of Victoria.

There's so much to it and our town of Maldon was right in the thick of it. I don't think this is the last conversation with Michelle Ross and I thank her for her time and patience and infectious enthusiasm.

Sports special!

IN celebration of grand finals, lost and won, this week the library news focuses on sport. We all know that sport is much more than just a game. Sport brings people together. It has the potential to break down social barriers, to inspire and motivate, to teach teamwork and perseverance. So, books about sport can be more than just about the game or its players, more than just skill development, victories and defeats and sporting heroes. Here are some examples of books about, but not just about sport.

The Matilda Effect by Fiona Crawford (2023)

The Matilda Effect is the story of the Australian women's soccer team, the Matildas, and their ultimately successful struggle, alongside other women from around the world, to compete in World Cup football. The book was aptly named: historically, 'the Matilda effect' honours US activist, freethinker and pioneer Matilda Joslyn Gage. The phrase has been used to describe a bias denying recognition to women and women's activities. From the 1980s, when women had to pay to participate in the pilot Women's World Cup, to 2019, when the principle of equal pay for women players was finally accepted amid surging interest in their game, *The Matilda Effect* takes the reader on a journey of human rights and gender equality history. (This book is in the library's Social Science section).

Brotherboys: the Story of Jim and Phillip Krakouer by Sean Gornman (2005)

The Krakouer brothers exploded onto the football scene in Perth in the early 80s and were quickly lured by big money to play for North Melbourne. But despite their uncanny ability to win the ball, Jim and Phillip were subjected to racist taunts both on and off the field. It seems Jim was always on a trajectory towards trouble, while his brother Phil stayed on the straight and narrow. *Brotherboys* is about how two brothers handled their sporting success, how the AFL handled two unusual sporting heroes, and how, as a sporting nation, we handled our Indigenous brothers. (Located in the Autobiography, Biography and Memoir section of the library).

Cycling Solo: Ireland to Istanbul

by Hazel Edwards & Trevelyan Quest Edwards (2006)

Explores five months of cycling solo across Europe via the UK, France, Germany, the Swiss Alps, Serbia, Bulgaria, Hungary and Turkey. So, it's as much about the journey, warts and all, as it is about the sport of cycling: with forgettable campsites, random kindnesses, eccentrics, falls, punctures and steep kilometres in between. Perhaps reading this book will inspire some cyclists to dust off their bikes and risk an extreme adventure somewhere exotic and alone. (Find this one in Travel Tales).

The Boys' Club: Power, Politics and the AFL by Michael Warner (2022)

The Boys' Club is the inside story behind the power and politics of the AFL, revealing how a fledgling state administrative body evolved into the Australian Football League and its meteoric rise to become one of the richest and most powerful organisations in the land. Journalist Michael Warner lifts the lid on the scandals, secrets and deal-making that have shaped this iconic Australian game. (Located in our Politics section)

Finding Gobi by Dion Leonard (2017)

Another book about and not just about sport. In 2016, Dion Leonard, a seasoned ultramarathon runner, finds a stray dog while competing in a gruelling 155-mile race across the Gobi Desert. 'Gobi' is small in size but big in heart, keeping pace with Leonard for nearly 80 miles. Although they did not win, this was a journey filled with drama, grief, heartbreak, joy and love that changed the lives of both man and dog forever. (In the Autobiography, Biography and Memoir section of the library).

Barassi: The Biography by Peter Lalor (2010)

Even those of us who have little interest in football will have heard of Ron Barassi. As a champion player he is credited with having all but invented the position of ruck rover and as a premiership coach he is said to have revolutionised the use of the handball. He was also one of the first to push for fully nationalising the game. But as integral as Ron Barassi is to football, he is quick to point out that, "It was never my life." In this book Barassi tells his story in his own words: the

devoted family man, the dabbler in the arts, the champion for disadvantaged kids, and the tale of a fatherless boy who was determined to make his own way in the world. This is a deeply personal portrait of an Australian sporting legend. (Also in the Autobiography, Biography and Memoir section).

Book reviews

The Dark Wives by Ann Cleeves, 2024

The man's body is found in the early morning light by a local dog walker in the park outside Rosebank, a home for troubled teens in the coastal village of Longwater. The victim is Josh, a staff member, who was due to work the previous night but never showed up. DI Vera Stanhope is called out to investigate the death, with her only clue being the disappearance of one of the home's residents, 14-year-old Chloe Spence. Vera can't bring herself to believe that a teenager is responsible for the murder, but even she can't dismiss the possibility.

Vera, Joe and new team member Rosie Bell are soon embroiled in the case, and when a second connected body is found near the Three Dark Wives monument in the wilds of the Northumberland countryside, superstition and folklore begin to collide with fact. Vera knows she has to find Chloe to get to the truth and the dark secrets in their community that may be far more dangerous than she could have ever believed possible.

Hagstone by Sinéad Gleeson, 2024

On a wild and rugged island cut off and isolated to some, artist Nell feels the island is her home. It is the source of inspiration for her art, rooted in landscape, folklore and the feminine. The mysterious Inions, a commune of women who have travelled there from all over the world, consider it a place of refuge and safety, of solace in nature.

All the islanders live alongside the strange murmurings that seem to emanate from within the depths of the island, a sound that is almost supernatural – a Summoning as the Inions call it. One day, a letter arrives at Nell's door from the reclusive Inions who invite Nell into the commune for a commission to produce a magnificent art piece to celebrate their long history. In its creation, Nell will discover things about the community and about herself that will challenge everything she thought she knew.

Amongst the various display vehicles were Brendan, Alastair and Percy with their very cute Citroën that they call Red Rocket. They

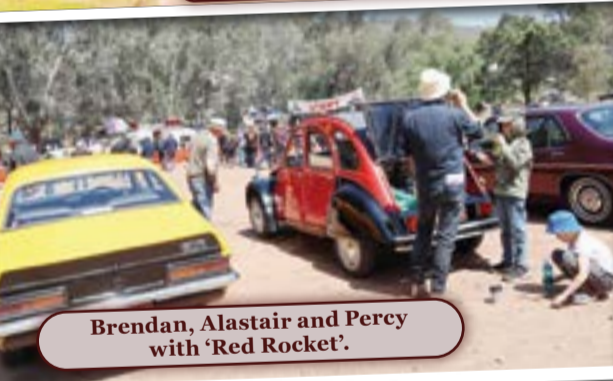

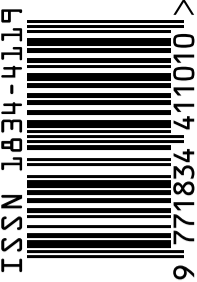
