## RUNNING FOR A CAUSE



They're hydrated, they've stretched their hammies and they're super keen: the start of the half-marathon last Friday morning, outside the Maldon Railway Station.

**T**he weather couldn't have been better for last Friday's Run The Maine, when over 900 competitors set out in spring sunshine to raise funds for a good cause and to have a great time. And improve their PB, of course!

Three hundred and twenty-three keen runners tried their luck in the half marathon, starting from the Maldon Railway Station and finishing in Castlemaine. Most of the runners arrived in

Maldon on the steam train, which was totally booked out. Those who couldn't get a seat on the train had to find their way out to Maldon by other means. Runners' ages ranged from teens to seventies.

There were 232 runners who opted for the 10km run through bushland, while 373 runners and walkers took a circuit that extended through Castlemaine's botanical gardens.

Winning times were 1.16.54 for the half marathon; 38.28 for the 10km; and 16.30 for

the 5km run/walk. But in the end, did it matter if a competitor took a little over a quarter of an hour to run 5km, or 1.23.29 to walk the same distance? The main thing is, they did it!

Thanks to its volunteers and sponsors, Run The Maine has widespread community support. It has become a popular event on the calendar for many runners, both locally and from across the state.

# Butts Pavilion update

## First off, some history:

Almost 150 years ago, a group of Maldon locals banded together to share the expense of building a pavilion at the Springs reserve - an area which is now known simply as the Butts.

With Council eventually coming to the party for half the costs, the pavilion was built and ready for use by the end of 1877. The pavilion has seen some repairs, both minor and major, over the years. This includes reroofing with corrugated iron in 1901.

Since it was built, the pavilion has been used by community groups for all manner of community events - everything from sports carnivals and picnics in earlier days to the Hill Climb and the Maldon Folk Festival in more recent years.

While the pavilion still stands on Crown Land and is unarguably an important part of Maldon's heritage, it is unusable. In December 2021, Parks Victoria fenced it off and declared it unsafe due to white ants being detected in the structure.

After three years, why is the Butts pavilion still fenced off? Why has there been no action, despite the possibility of it collapsing?

## No funds

The reason for the pavilion still being fenced off would simply appear to be insufficient funding for Parks Victoria. This lack of funding seems to be affecting Parks Victoria's operations in general and the maintenance of its historic structures in particular.

It is difficult, however, to measure just how dire that lack of funding is. Some months ago, the *Times* attempted to contact Parks Victoria's Melbourne office for a comment regarding the lack of progress on the pavilion and also about an unsafe picnic table on top of the Mount that needed replacement.

After a month of attempting to extract a response from Parks Victoria, the *Times* approached the office of Bendigo West MP Maree Edwards to request her electorate staff's assistance. It took them almost **two months** to extract a statement from Parks Victoria:

*"We're planning to replace the picnic table at Mt Tarrengower in the new financial year. We're looking at options to conserve the shelter at the Butts Pavilion, and will continue to update the Friends of Maldon (sic.) on work and activities at the Historic Area."*

The *Times* also asked questions about Parks Victoria's operating capacity, and was told that this remained unchanged. Nevertheless, lack of funding would appear to be making it difficult for Parks Victoria staff to carry out their jobs. There are budget constraints across almost all areas, with staff having to spend valuable time applying for grants to carry out essential works, including weed eradication.

## Progress? A little, but...

If you're an optimist, you'd think that there may be some faint light at the end of the tunnel. The Friends of the Maldon Historic Reserve group have been on the case, and met with Maree Edwards and Parks Victoria staff back in May regarding the lack of progress on the Butts pavilion.

Is the Friends' advocacy starting to pay off? Will Parks Victoria be springing into action and at least bracing the pavilion's structure and treating the termite infestation? And then eventually restoring it to its former condition?

Here's Parks Victoria's official answer, and many thanks to Parks Ranger Lachie Cullum for expediting this reply:

*"The shelter will remain closed for the foreseeable future pending the outcome of an engineering assessment currently underway and allocation of funding to undertake repairs."*

In other words: Parks Victoria has looked at the problem, but isn't promising action any time soon.

Members of the Friends of the Maldon Historic Reserve group that the *Times* spoke to were at pains to emphasise the fact that Lachie Cullum is doing an excellent job with the resources that are available to him. They are concerned, however, about the fact that the State Government has been reducing funding to Parks Victoria for some years and is currently

reducing it even further. This will lead to budgetary constraints that would inevitably lead to a degradation of areas such as the Butts historic reserve and the surrounding natural environment.

A looming problem for Parks Victoria is the condition of the Beehive chimney, which has been fenced off owing to the odd brick crumbling away and dropping to the ground. The expense of restoring the Butts pavilion will probably pale into insignificance compared to the potential cost of fixing the chimney.

Watch this space.

To say that Daniel is a versatile musician is an understatement! He plays piano, organ and just about any brass instrument you care to name. "Euphonium is my usual instrument,

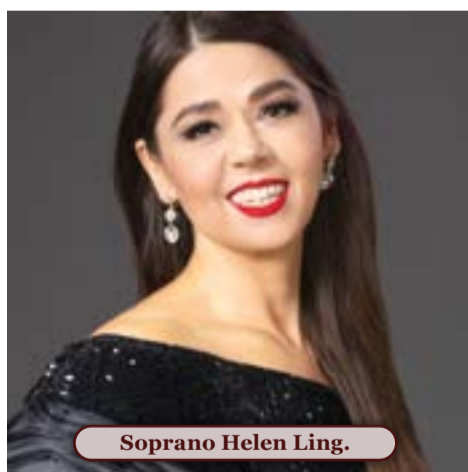
but if needed I can get by on the rest," he said.

Yes, gambling advertising should be banned. Gambling is an addiction for some people, so shouldn't be encouraged.



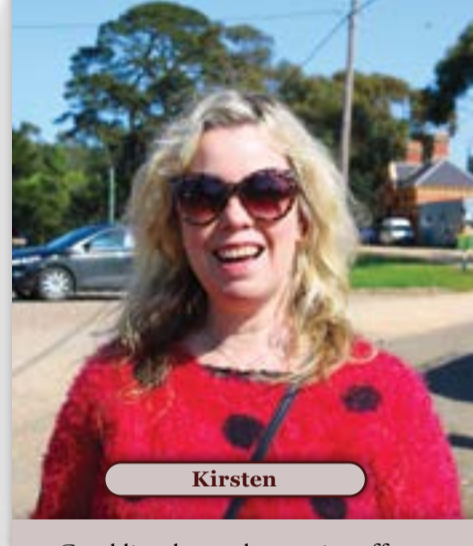
Sophia

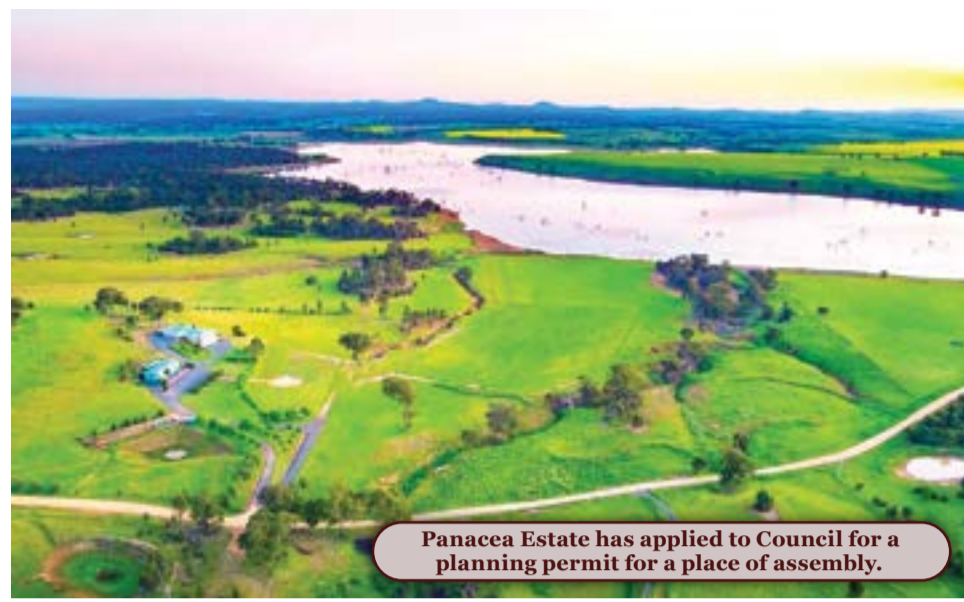
Uncle Rick Nelson will provide a Welcome to Country, sharing his knowledge and stories about Country and what it means to the Djaara people.

# Panacea - place of assembly permit



**Panacea Estate has applied to Council for a planning permit for a place of assembly.**

**AT the beginning of this year, Panacea Estate's Peter Christen applied to Mount Alexander Shire Council for a place of assembly permit. This permit would allow small events to be held at the vineyard.**

Peter used a town planning company from Bendigo to lodge the planning permit application. Nine months later, he is still waiting patiently for the application to chug its way through Council's bureaucratic process.

There has been some progress made. The emergency and fire plans have been signed off by the authorities. An acoustic engineer has conducted a study, which has shown that noise should not be an issue for neighbouring properties. There have, however, been objections lodged with Council regarding the proposed permit. The objections are related to concerns about noise, bushfires, the environment and the impact on the road.

Those of you who have been to Panacea Estate will know that it lies at the end of a gravel road on the shores of Cairn Curran, with a backdrop of spectacular views over the lake and nearby hills. The cellar door is set in a park-like area leading down to the vineyard.

As Peter pointed out, Panacea Estate is the perfect spot for weddings, parties and other events. "At present, there's no limit to the number of people who can visit the cellar door on any given day," he said. "But I can't hold an event as such. It's one of those grey areas. Certainly I could do a one-off application for

an event, but the place of assembly permit is really the only way to go."

Peter said that the permit application was for 12 events of up to 200 people per year, but with a cap of 700. "I'm not looking at holding shows for thousands, like Groovin' The Moo," he said. "It would be small events, such as comedy shows and concerts, which are commonly held in vineyards everywhere."

Without the guarantee of a place of assembly permit, Peter pointed out that his hands are tied when it comes to developing the vineyard. "I can't go to the expense of building infrastructure to support holding events on a regular basis without the permit," he said.

After three years of owning Panacea Estate, Peter said that it is time to seek a wider audience for his wine. "And one way to do that is by holding events," he said. "It's wonderful country here. The word is spreading about Panacea's wine, and we have a good turn up at the cellar door. But why not share Panacea's beautiful views with more people?"

At present, Peter is waiting patiently for Council to come out of caretaking mode, following the upcoming Council elections. The next step will be a mediation meeting with the objectors, organised by Council. Peter encourages those supportive of his planning application to write to [planning@mountalexander.vic.gov.au](mailto:planning@mountalexander.vic.gov.au).

# If in doubt, get tested!

**THE *Times* caught up with Maldon Fire Brigade Captain Sean McCubbin last week, with the intention of talking about his recent cancer diagnosis and ongoing treatment.**

In the end, the interview ranged far and wide. Sean speaks his mind, is passionate about many issues, knows Maldon like the back of his hand and has a bunch of entertaining stories. All of which made for an interesting conversation.

But back to the main topic. Six months ago, Sean felt a little dizzy in the morning and thought nothing of it. After a day at work, he came home and collapsed. "The next thing I knew I was being treated by the Maldon CERT team and Avoca paramedics," he said, "and got carted off to Bendigo Health."

After blood tests and a CAT scan, Sean was told he wasn't going anywhere for a while. Long story short: following more tests, cancer was diagnosed and he was taken into theatre for surgery where part of his bowel was removed.

Over two weeks later, Sean was discharged and began a combination of chemotherapy and immunotherapy, delivered via a port in his chest. He's not out of the woods yet, with a liver lesion and secondaries in a lymph node. "But tests show that the treatment is working," Sean said. "I may need surgery on my liver, but let's wait and see."

The message that Sean wants to get out to the world: "If you've got any symptoms, get checked out straight away. Bowel cancer is one of the commonest cancers, and in the past it has usually been associated with older people," he said. "But that has changed; I was 45 when I was diagnosed. It has become more common in people aged in their forties, and even younger."

In the meantime, Sean is back at work on light duties, out at Kaiser Reef's processing plant at Porcupine Flat. "I was allowed to

go back to work at the doctor's discretion, basically to save my sanity," he said. "Kaiser has been unbelievably good to me, I can't thank them enough."

There have been a few near misses in Sean's life. He bears the scars from a dog attack - an Alsatian that he regularly walked for a neighbour, but which turned on him one day for no apparent reason.

Then there was the first big fire that he attended, down in Creswick. "It came over the ridge and we were down at the bottom, like sitting ducks. We had a burnover on the truck," he said. "I was the pump operator, it was a petrol pump and the fuel kept on vaporising. How it didn't stop working was a miracle. Luckily we had a full tanker of water."

In later years, there was a suspected brain aneurysm which saw him paralysed down one side and taken to hospital in Melbourne. "I came out of that one alright," he said.

Then there was the loss of his partner Kathy Gain to cancer, leaving him to raise their young daughter Bonnie.

And if you want further proof that Sean is a tough fella: only a few weeks ago, he took part in the gruelling 28-floor Melbourne Fire-fighter Stair Climb at the Crown Metropol. Quite an achievement for someone who had recently finished six rounds of treatment on a two-weekly cycle!

Speaking of treatment, Sean has embarked on second round of fortnightly chemotherapy and immunotherapy. When the *Times* spoke to him, one of the more visible side effects of his treatments were breakouts on his skin. But the good news: he has kept his hair!

Sean has nothing but praise for the medical attention he has received, from the time that the CERT team attended to his current treatment. "CERT, ambos, Dr Fowler, Bendigo Health, the district nurses, specialists, everyone has been amazing," he said. "This has turned

my life upside down, but I'm staying active and positive. I've got my family (wife Emma, daughter Bonnie and young sons Patrick and Henry) to think of."

While Sean gets on with his treatment, he has backed off from his role as Maldon Fire Brigade Captain. Bruce Clements is currently Operational Captain. "I hope to be back in action before the end of summer," Sean said.

Sean was approached by Bendigo Health to become an ambassador for bowel cancer - to talk about his medical journey online, to encourage others to keep an eye on their health. You can check Sean's story out at [bendigohealth.org.au](http://bendigohealth.org.au).

Sean's final words: "If in doubt, get tested!"

**Note:**

If caught early, over 90% of bowel cancers can be successfully treated.

As part of the National Bowel Screening Program, people aged 50 to 74 receive a bowel cancer screening kit in the post every two years.

People aged 45 to 49 do not automatically receive a kit. They can obtain one, however, from the Program, by requesting a kit online, calling 1800 627 701 or asking their doctor.

Don't be squeamish about a poo test - just do it! It could save your life.

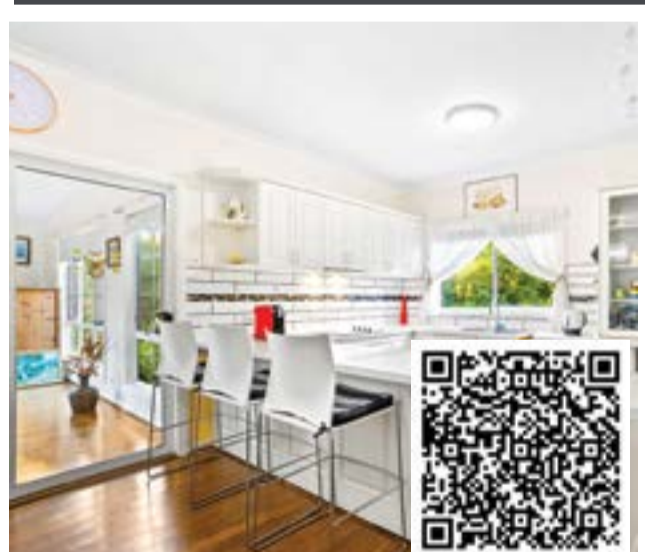

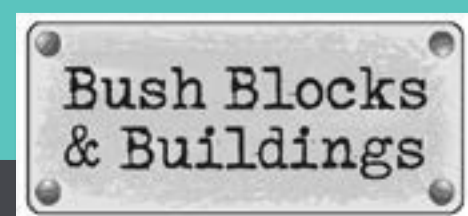

# Len fox painting award



“Let there be light!” Bendigo West MP Maree Edwards, after turning on the new lighting system last Friday night.

A large crowd gathered at the Castlemaine Art Museum last Friday night when Bendigo West MP Maree Edwards announced the winner of the Len Fox painting award. This is an acquisitive prize that is awarded every two years to commemorate the life and work of E. Phillips Fox. The \$50,000 prize money is funded through a bequest by Mona Fox in memory of her partner Len Fox, with the trust also contributing towards the award’s not inconsiderable administrative costs.

Before the prizewinner was announced, Ms Edwards turned on the Castlemaine Art Museum’s new gallery lights. The State Government contributed \$272,000 towards the cost of the state-of-the-art lighting system.

The 2024 Len Fox award winner is Nellie Napa Coulthard for her painting titled *Tjuntala Ngurangka - Country with Wattle*, which celebrates the beauty of the artist’s country. Nellie’s home is in Yankunytjatjara Country, which is located near Oodnadatta.

Judges of the Len Fox Painting award were curator and writer Emma Busowsky and artist John Wolseley. In an entertaining speech, John outlined how difficult it was to narrow 300 entries down to a final cut of 56 paintings. “It was nervous breakdown material,” he quipped. “Judging art awards is a dangerous thing to do. Once when I judged a prize in Sydney, I was kicked by a disgruntled artist after announcing another artist as the winner!”

# Community grants

# Roadside slashing begins

MOUNT Alexander Shire Council will be starting its annual roadside slashing program this month, which is expected to continue until late November/early December (weather dependent).

Council slashes vegetation along the road shoulder of the majority of Council-managed sealed roads and rural intersections in the lead up to the high-risk weather season each year.

Slashing vegetation along roadsides reduces the risk of grass fires when cars pull over to the side of the road. It also improves

safety by creating clear lines of sight for road users.

Procedures are in place to identify areas of high value vegetation and to reduce the spread of noxious weeds.

Council works with the CFA to understand areas of fire risk and the team takes weather conditions into account when planning the day's work.

Please take care if you see the teams out and about as they are operating heavy equipment.

Council encourages you to drive carefully as you overtake.

# Watch out for AI

ARTIFICIAL Intelligence (AI) is expected to be used at local council elections in October, according to the Victorian Electoral Commission. Voters are urged to think critically about campaign material, while encouraging campaigners to be transparent in the use of any AI-generated or AI-modified material. The VEC is calling for visible labelling on such material to ensure voters are not misled.

"Tackling political mis- and dis-information is essential if we are to protect voter confidence in our electoral system," VEC Electoral Commission Sven Bluemmel said. "I urge campaigners to meet community expectations by clearly labelling any election material that has been generated or

modified through the use of AI."

There are no laws in Victoria that regulate truth in political advertising. Voters are encouraged to exercise their own judgement. They should look for an authorisation statement, showing who authorised the distribution of material - this is a legal requirement for all election campaign material.

Voters are reminded to visit the website at [vec.vic.gov.au](http://vec.vic.gov.au) as the source of truth for all information about the election or electoral processes. The VEC will continue to address incorrect information about the election on its misinformation register, which is available on the website.

**Natural Newstead**

**Rich rewards on the Loddon**  
 Looking for Sacred Kingfishers along the Loddon on dusk when a large bird floated into view, then descended to its perch on a fallen log.  
 A splendid **Nankeen Night-Heron** in adult plumage. Crepuscular and nocturnal hunters they feed on small fish, crustaceans and frogs in the shallows. It's not uncommon to see them in the hour before dusk as they depart their daytime roost in the River Red-gums beside the river.



As I moved upstream three more individuals flew off, including this subadult. It landed on a nice exposed and sunny perch, tolerating a close approach. Adults in breeding fettle are uniformly rufous/cinnamon on the upper parts and sport three white nuptial plumes.



The second individual ... subadult with white patches on the upper wing coverts.

THE Maldon Artist Network (MANet) is busy punching above its weight yet again with the launch of the Maldon Portrait Prize 2025, when entries opened last Tuesday 1 October. Artists have from now until 1 March to get their entries in. All artists who have lived or are living and/or working in Australia are eligible to enter. In addition, there is a new exhibition of the work of all eight artists who comprise the MANet Art Gallery, to be opened on Saturday 12 October, at 3pm, by Rosalie Hastwell, Tarrengower Ward Councillor Elect.

We really hope to see you there to enjoy our re-opening after the short break we took, having had a very busy June / July with the Small Works of 25 guest artists in the gallery for six weeks, followed by a gothic-themed exhibition for the Goldfields Gothic Festival of Dark Ideas.

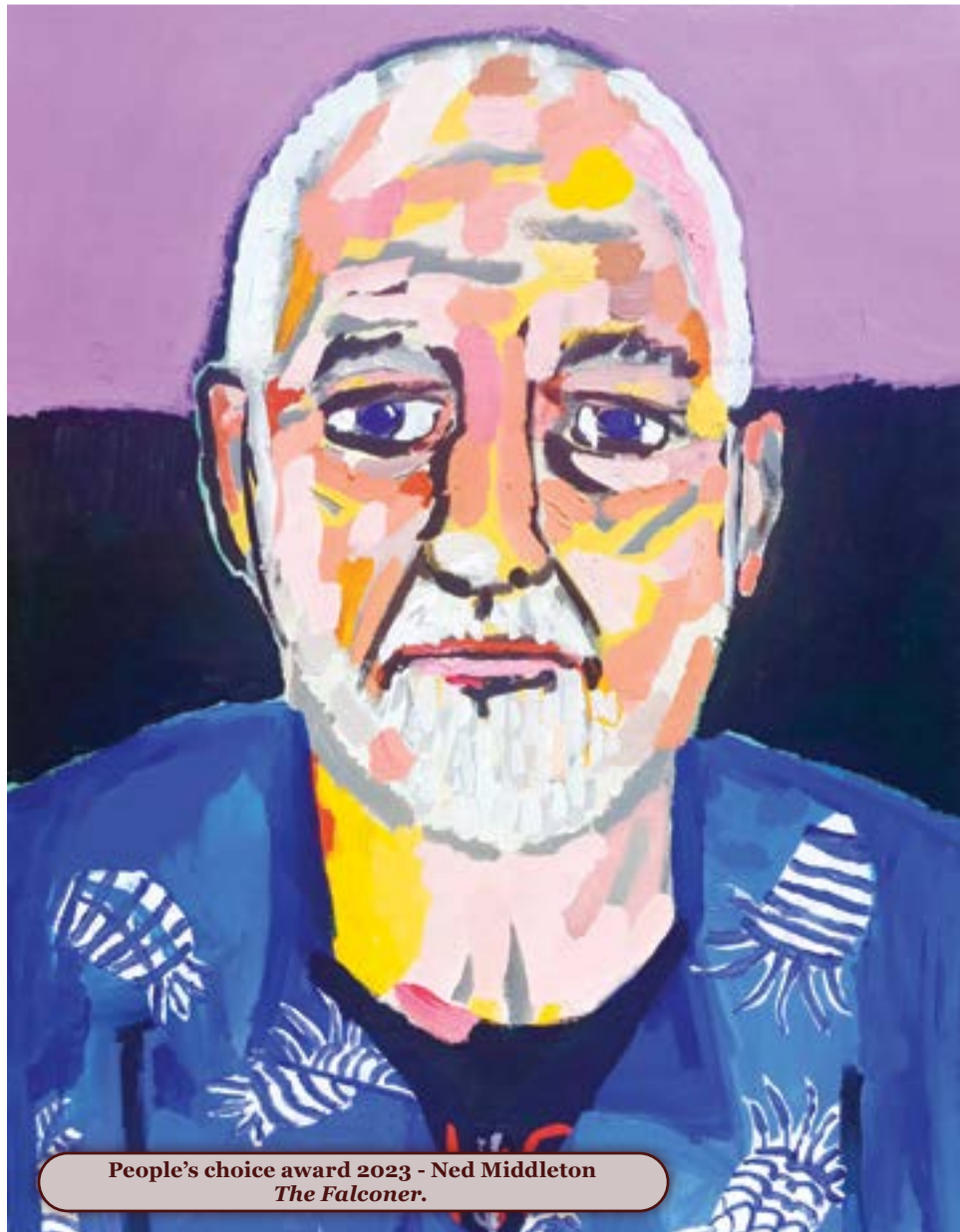

# THE REST IS HISTORY

## Maldon Police Lock-up

**GOLD** was discovered in Maldon in December 1853. In January 1854, the size of the rush warranted the establishment of a Government Camp and Assistant Commissioner Gorges Macdonald Lowther was dispatched.

Although the camp site was clear of the existing diggings in Long Gully, within three weeks it had become surrounded by miners and a fence was required to be erected around the camp.

Tarrangower soon was proclaimed a place for holding petty sessions and the camp consisted of a police tent and a smaller lock-up tent. The tents were made of calico, with dirt floors and were not lined and had no fly over them. Prisoners who were held in the lock-up sat chained to each other, sweltering by day and freezing by night. The chaining was necessary to prevent the prisoners escaping.

During the winter of 1854, the Assistant Colonel Surgeon inspected the camp's tent accommodation. He reported that the tents were in defective condition and the lives of the Government officials were greatly endangered.

By 1857, the Lock-up that was then in use was also in a pitiful state of repair and without a roof. It was reported in the *Mount Alexander Mail*, that a man named Gillespie, who was arrested for insanity had been held in the lock-up for a number of days and exposed to storms of rain, day and night.

The Lock-up was not only used for adult offenders, but also for children. In May 1860, three children, who were convicted of having no visible means of support, were kept in the Lock-up for 10 days. Their father, Patrick Currey, had recently been committed as a dangerous lunatic. The children were sentenced to three months imprisonment in the Castlemaine Gaol. Eventually they were pardoned by the Governor and went to live with their uncle.

In 1864 a more substantial building replaced the old Lock-up. The new Police Lock-up, located in Francis Street behind the police station, was built by William H. Smith, a local coachbuilder and wheelwright for the Public Works Department, at a cost of 490 pounds and seven shillings.

While the design of the lock-up was the same used in other country towns at the time, including details such as barred gates, high windows and grand locks, its walls were built from local brick and granite. This gave it a local character, making it one of the more attractive lock-ups and a building of architectural significance.

### Library News

**RECENTLY one of the volunteers working on the library history project has been digging into the archives to find out which books subscribers were borrowing 50 years ago. Were their reading habits similar to those of today's members? What differences can be identified, and what does this tell us about the interests of library members?**

One thing that has apparently not changed is that many were very avid readers, borrowing multiple books each week. The process of borrowing (and returning) was, of course, very different pre-computers, with an annual register kept, listing each member and the books they selected, with the titles recorded and then marked through with a line when each item was returned. It is interesting to compare the list of popular titles and authors of the 1960s and 1970s with the 'top 20' of the past 12 months. There was the same enthusiasm for fiction, and especially crime and mystery titles, with perhaps more romance than amongst the list of popular titles of 2024. One significant difference, revealed in the current data, is the inclusion of more Australian authors (10 out of 20) and non-fiction titles (3 of 20). Two of the 20 most frequently borrowed titles were from our local history collection. Two of the non-fiction books focused on Indigenous history, perhaps reflecting the growing acceptance of the reality of Australia's past and the need for reconciliation. ### Book Reviews

#### *The Horse: A Galloping History of Humanity* by Timothy Winegard, 2024

The Horse is an epic history unlike any other. Its story begins more than 5,500 years ago on the windswept grasslands of the Eurasian Steppe. When one human tamed one horse, an unbreakable bond was forged and the future of humanity was instantly rewritten, placing the reins of destiny firmly in human hands.

Since that pivotal day, the horse has carried the fate of civilisations on its powerful back. For millennia it was the primary mode of transportation, an essential farming machine, a steadfast companion, and a formidable weapon of war. Possessing a unique combination of size, speed, strength, and stamina, the horse dominated every facet of human life and shaped the very scope of human ambition. And we still live among its galloping shadows.

From the thundering cavalry charges of Alexander the Great to the streets of New York during the Great Manure Crisis of 1894 and beyond, horses have shaped both the grand arc of history and our everyday lives. Horses revolutionised the way we hunted, traded, travelled, farmed, fought, worshipped, and interacted. They fundamentally reshaped the human genome and the world's linguistic map. They determined international borders, moulded cultures, fuelled economies,

and built global superpowers. They decided the destinies of conquerors and empires. They were vectors of lethal disease, and contributed to lifesaving medical innovations. Horses even inspired architecture, invention, furniture, and fashion.

#### *Long Island* by Colm Tóibín, 2024

Eilis Lacey is Irish, married to Tony Fiorello, a plumber and one of four Italian American brothers, all of whom live in neighbouring houses on a cul-de-sac in Lindenhurst, Long Island, with their wives and children and Tony's parents, a huge extended family that lives and works, eats and plays together. It is the spring of 1976 and Eilis, now in her forties with two teenage children, has no one to rely on in this still-new country. Though her ties to Ireland remain stronger than those that hold her to her new land and home, she has not returned in decades.

One day, when Tony is at his job and Eilis is in her home office doing her accounting, an Irishman comes to the door asking for her by name. He tells her that his wife is pregnant with Tony's child and that when the baby is born, he will not raise it but instead deposit it on Eilis's doorstep. It is what Eilis does and what she refuses to do in response to this stunning news that makes Tóibín's novel so riveting.

*Long Island* is about longings unfulfilled, even unrecognised. The silences in Eilis' life are thunderous and dangerous, and there's no one defter than Tóibín at giving them language. This is a gorgeous story of a woman alone in a marriage and the deepest bonds she rekindles on her return to the place and people she left behind, to ways of living and loving she thought she'd lost.

#### *What I Wish I Knew About Dementia* by Wendy Mitchell, 2022

What can a diseased brain tell us about being human, living our own lives better and helping those with dementia get the best from theirs? When Wendy Mitchell was diagnosed with young-onset dementia at the age of 58, her brain was overwhelmed with images of the last stages of the disease - those familiar tropes, shortcuts and clichés that we are fed by the media, or even our own health professionals. But her diagnosis far from represented the end of her life. Instead, it was the start of a very different one. Wise, practical and life-affirming, *What I Wish People Knew About Dementia* combines anecdotes, research and Wendy Mitchell's own brilliant wit and wisdom to tell readers exactly what she wishes they knew about dementia.

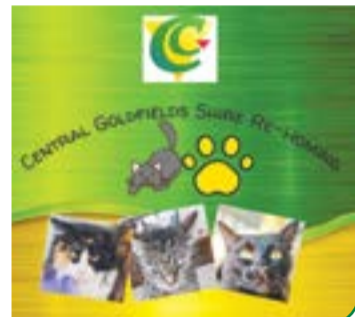

## Local filmmaker to host mental health Q&A following screening of *Just a Farmer*

**IN recognition of World Mental Health Day, Castlemaine Safe Space will host a special screening of the feature film *Just A Farmer*, followed by a panel discussion with the film's producer and actor, Leila McDougall.**

The event, scheduled for Thursday 10 October at the Castlemaine Theatre Royal, aims to bring attention to mental health issues in regional communities through the story of a farming family dealing with loss and hardship. Leila McDougall, who co-wrote and stars in the film, was inspired by her own family's experience with mental health challenges. Ten years ago, she and her husband, Sean, organised a community event in their canola fields to raise awareness about mental health in farming communities.

Despite the event's success, Leila knew that more needed to be done, particularly after the COVID pandemic disrupted community connections. Determined to keep the conversation going, she decided to turn her message into a film—despite having no prior filmmaking experience. Through perseverance, she completed *Just A Farmer*, a heartfelt exploration of resilience and the critical role of mental health support in rural Australia.

Castlemaine Safe Space, a non-clinical

support service that has welcomed over 500 guests since its inception, is the ideal venue for the screening. The organisation offers a safe and confidential place for people in emotional distress and their carers, operating with empathy and non-judgment.

The event begins at 7pm, with the screening at 7.30pm, followed by a Q&A session featuring Leila and community members involved in suicide prevention. Attendance is free, with donations appreciated.
