"It's a cracker of a play," Bette says. The producers hope that audiences will keep their lips sealed about the play's thrilling conclusion.

The dedicated performers have been working hard on the pacey dialogue and high-tension interactions, enacting one cliff-hanger after another. The play keeps audiences guessing until the very end. After preparing for weeks in its custom rehearsal studio, the group has a unique way of transporting the set to the performance venue. "The set is taken across on horse float," laughs actor and committee member Maggie Browne. "We build the stage, proscenium arch, curtains, everything," Maggie says.

The play runs for six shows only, with wine, cheese and nibbles served at Friday evening performances, while the matinee interval will be a fancy affair featuring 'High Tea with Bubbles'. With such great local talent involved, a gripping plot and a welcoming company, there's no reason to miss this fun night at the theatre; just don't give away the ending!

Shining a light on Maldon sports



NEW lighting was officially launched at Bill Woodfull Recreation Reserve last week as Maldon's footy and netball teams trained for finals. State Member for Bendigo West Maree Edwards, Federal Member for Bendigo Lisa Chesters, Mount Alexander Shire Council representatives and the Maldon Football Netball Club (MFNC) gathered on Thursday 5 September to click the switch on new oval and court lighting.

Works at the sports ground have installed new 100 lux LED lighting around the oval and 200 lux LED lighting at the main netball court, giving the more than 260 players additional opportunities to perfect their game.

MFNC President Jamie Fox said the lights would extend training hours but also improve safety for players. "There were lights only on one side of the netball court before, so they could only see half the ball," he laughed. "I don't know how they trained like that!"

The new lights will also help expand development programs and teams, giving more people the opportunity to play. "Our community has grown around clubs like the Bombers - the new lighting ensures there's more opportunity for locals to join in the fun and support local sport," Ms Edwards said. Ms Chesters pointed out that the new lighting was made possible by a collaboration between all levels of government and said it was great to see the funds directed to the small town of Maldon. Mayor of Mount Alexander Shire Councillor Matthew Driscoll pointed out that the lights also make sport more accessible. "Better lighting means more equitable and inclusive participation of women and girls in local sport too," he said.

The new lights were funded by all three tiers of government: Mount Alexander Shire contributed close to \$60,000, with \$200,000 from the State Government's Country Football and Netball Program and over \$250,000 contributed by the Federal Government.

Heritage: hearing community views

MALDON Heritage Network is following up its successful first public presentation with a community meeting, to be held on Wednesday 18 September at 7.30pm at the Maldon Neighbourhood Centre.

The next event will continue the conversation about local heritage commenced at its event in July titled 'Maldon's Heritage: Why Does it Matter?' by Trevor Budge AM. Attended by approximately 70 people, Trevor's presentation placed Maldon in an international heritage context and traced the history of its heritage protection, its role in groundbreaking heritage planning practice in Victoria and the relevance of heritage today. A transcript of Trevor's talk can be found on the Maldon Museum and Archives Association website under 'Stories – Heritage Hero'.

The Maldon Heritage Network is a group of community members who share an interest in protecting, preserving and promoting Maldon's heritage, which is rich and varied. Whether it be an Aboriginal cultural heritage site, an old building, a significant tree, the remains of gold diggings, stories and oral histories, or long running events and groups, what makes heritage important is that it plays a role in local life: it is part of the continuum of a community's history and people's place in it. Local heritage is also fundamental to larger questions of development, land use, ownership, sustainability, community participation and design.

The group is keen to hear community views about Maldon and district's heritage, including any concerns or priorities that need addressing. These ideas will be collated and used to inform future directions for the group, which anyone is welcome to join.

Nostalgia as café closes



IT seemed natural that café owner Katrine Elliott would reflect and become nostalgic when speaking about the closure of the business that she has steered through more than 17 years. The iconic Berryman's Café and Tearooms will cease operations on Sunday 29 September and hold a clearing sale in the following week.

Chatting to the *Tarrangower Times* last week, Katrine recalls the positive influence that it has had on her life. "I came to the country from the city and took over the business in June 2007," she says. "I was looking for a house but I found a café and it just ended up as a lovely opportunity."

Named after Berryman's boot shop, which was resident on the site from about 1890, the green-tiled façade has housed the eponymous cafe since the 1970s and has been managed more recently by Katrine's sister, Jess. Not only has the running of Berryman's Cafe been a family affair, but it helped Katrine to be more involved in her own growing family and the local community.

"My kids were young and it gave the flexibility to be involved in kinder and school activities," she said. "I've been on every committee, for every event. I've been able to be involved in a way that I wouldn't have been able to without the café, if I was doing a nine-to-five job." Katrine also credited the flexibility of cafe life with being able to pursue her longheld goal of becoming a nurse, which is now her primary career.


Since offering the business for sale, Berryman's Café has had many interested buyers but none who could commit; Katrine needed to make a decision about signing a new longterm lease. "It's a shame, because I tried to sell it and we had a lot of interest but everyone's circumstances are affected by the current economy,"

Meanwhile, Katrine manages to smile at the memory of the *Tarrangower Times* taking her photo during the early days, when the photographer wanted some scones for the photo: "So I smiled for the camera, holding up a tray of frozen scones!"

There are still a few weeks to enjoy a soup, a Reuben sandwich or a great coffee by Jess and everyone is welcome to the clearing sale commencing on Monday 30 September. Katrine will be taking offers for shop fittings, crockery, platters, kitchen equipment and fridges: everything must go. Mount Alexander Council reached a decision about the proposed 16 block subdivision of 1 Lowther Street, at its monthly Council meeting on Tuesday 10 September. After considering reports relating to the proposed stormwater management strategy, Maldon Design Guidelines, arborist report, assessment of native vegetations, and despite Officers' recommendations to accept the proposal, the motion was not carried. Some Councillors expressed concerns about water drainage management, proximity to the mine and potential problems for future owners. Mayor Matthew Driscoll used his casting vote to reject the motion, saying, "I'm concerned about this in relation to the health and safety and the character of Maldon township." The matter has been deferred to a future Council meeting so that Officers can prepare grounds for refusal of the application.

Varroa mite detected in Victorian Bees

Varroa mite has been detected for the first time in Victoria at a property in Nangiloc near Mildura; an infested hive was identified by Agriculture Victoria during almond pollination surveillance.

Agriculture Victoria Acting Chief Plant Health Officer Dr Stephen Dibley said Agriculture Victoria is working with the affected beekeeper and others close by to minimise spread and guide management actions. Beekeepers with concerns can contact Victorian Varroa development officers by email at Victorian.VDO@agriculture.vic.gov.au or by calling 1800 958 485.

Beekeepers in Victoria are urged to check their hives and to report suspected cases of varroa mite to the Exotic Plant Pest Hotline on 1800 084 881.

R U OK?Day, an annual National Day of Action and a reminder to check in with your friends, family and colleagues, was Thursday 12 September. R U OK? is a suicide prevention charity that aims to inspire and empower people to meaningfully connect with friends, family and colleagues who might be struggling with life. New boat ramp for Laanecoorie Reservoir

Laanecoorie Reservoir is set to be home to a new boat ramp that will allow boaters, fishers and skiers to get the most out of the reservoir as part of Victorian Fisheries Authority's Better Boating infrastructure upgrade program. The project includes a new ramp to be constructed at Brownbill Recreation Area, the creation of additional car parks, foreshore improvements, and upgrades to the Aids to Navigation which help show boaters what speeds they can go in certain areas.

Goulburn-Murray Water (GMW) Loddon/ Campaspe Storage Manager Paul Wakenshaw said the project was great news for visitors to the reservoir. "This will enhance safety and reduce congestion by separating high-speed boating areas from foreshore bathing zones, while also improving overall site accessibility," he said. Works will begin on 10 September and are expected to be complete by mid-October, weather permitting.

Don't delay triple zero call for stroke

Alarming new Stroke Foundation data has revealed Australians are putting themselves and others at risk by not knowing that a stroke is always a triple zero call. Stroke Foundation Chief Executive Officer, Dr Lisa Murphy, says: "When a stroke strikes, it attacks up to 1.9 million brain cells per minute, so it is absolutely critical that triple zero is called immediately to get the patient the emergency specialist treatment they need, as quickly as possible."

Stroke Foundation is urging all Australians to learn the F.A.S.T. acronym which highlights the common signs of stroke. F is for face-check their face, has their mouth drooped? A is for arms-can they lift both arms? S is for speech- is their speech slurred, do they understand you? And T is for time- time is critical, call triple zero immediately.

Cash flow concerns for small business

New figures from the Australian Small Business and Family Enterprise Ombudsman reveal a jump in requests for help from distressed business owners who are fearful that another business who owes them money has become insolvent or who are worried about their own ability to meet their financial commitments. The Ombudsman said payment disputes were an early warning sign of a cash flow problem and can have a ripple effect that threatens the viability of other businesses.

The number of requests for help with insolvency increased by 50 per cent. These included people considering insolvency and those concerned that an insolvent business owed them money.

About 20 per cent of requests for assistance relate to contract disputes while nine per cent involve a franchise disagreement, typically relating to contract renewals, breach of franchise agreement or early termination. Small and family businesses with a dispute can find more information and guidance on the ASBFEO website - asbfeo.gov.au – which also includes resources, check lists and tools.

Financial fact sheet for small businesses

The Australian Banking Association (ABA) has collaborated with Chartered Accountants Australia and New Zealand (CAANZ), CPA Australia (CPA), and the Australian Taxation Office (ATO) to create a support-based factsheet for small business customers who might be struggling to make repayments. Many things can cause a business owner to have difficulties repaying their debts and it's easy to get overwhelmed in this situation. The factsheet builds on a campaign from the ABA which reminds customers facing financial difficulty that they don't need to 'tough it out on their own'. E-tickets for V/Line

State Minister for Public and Active Transport Gabrielle Williams announced last week that eTicketing will be available from Wednesday 18 September, giving passengers the option to display their tickets on their smartphone. The new electronic ticketing option will provide passengers with a link to their ticket via SMS or email when they make a reservation for a long-distance train or scheduled coach service – rather than visiting a staffed station to buy a ticket or have one mailed by post. The tickets will also cover additional travel on Victoria's public transport network, such as metropolitan trains, trams and buses, in the same way that a paper ticket currently does.

Passengers can still choose to collect tickets they have purchased online from their nearest staffed V/Line station, V/Line ticket agent, or premium Metro station, or have them sent via post before they travel.

Resources for farmers

Agriculture Victoria (AV) is encouraging farmers to take up ongoing support and assistance to help manage current difficult seasonal conditions. AV's Aimee McCutcheon said the Agriculture Victoria website explains what support is available to farmers, including financial support and assistance, mental health and wellbeing support. Ms McCutcheon said Agriculture Victoria offers extensive free practical information, resources, tools and calculators to help farmers with forward planning, feed budgeting and livestock management. Farmers are also encouraged to closely monitor their soil moisture and dam water levels over the coming months to ensure water availability is included in future planning. Agriculture Victoria manages soil moisture probes in various locations across the state, providing real time soil water content data by recording soil water content from 30cm down to 1 metre as a reference point for a paddock. Unite to untangle illegal fruit netting

Wildlife authorities are putting the spotlight on the shocking extent of grey-headed flying-fox injuries and deaths from illegal netting entanglements, as organisations unite to educate community gardeners about wildlife-friendly fruit tree netting ahead of the spring growing season.

Since 1 September 2021, it has been illegal in Victoria to use or sell household fruit tree netting with a mesh size bigger than 5mm x 5mm, as larger mesh netting is more likely to entangle, distress, and seriously injure or kill animals. To help check if netting is compliant, try poking a finger through the mesh and if it can pass through, then it's too big. Community members should remove and stop using non-compliant netting immediately. For more information on how to protect both household fruit trees and wildlife, visit: tinyurl.com/ fydexsva. Natural Newstead

Great Egret, fishing

It is usual to see Great Egrets fishing around the margins at Cairn Curran.

Small numbers are resident year round, almost always seen alone. This species doesn't breed locally, at least to my knowledge, so these individuals are probably sub-adults ... a few breeding plumes are often present.

They prefer to hunt in still water, moving slowly with regular pauses before extending their snake-like neck in a flash to seize their prey, often a small fish. This individual was fishing in choppy conditions and undeterred was catching one small fish each minute or so.





Battle for Australia Day

LAST Wednesday the Maldon RSL Sub Branch conducted a commemorative service at the Maldon Cenotaph to honour the Battle for Australia Day. The commemoration recognises those defence personnel that fought so hard during WWII to defend our country from the threat of the Japanese.

The Battle of the Coral Sea, the Battle of Kokoda, the Bombing of Darwin, Townsville and the northern shores of Australia are all recognised as the fight for Australia.

We have, in recent times, commissioned local, Zoe Boyd Creative, to do our wreaths and she always provides us with a description of why she has chosen the flowers she uses. I have included a copy of the transcript.

The colours of the Australian Defence Force ensign, dark blue, red, light blue and yellow sit proudly at the head of this wreath.

The wreath features golden wattle, the national floral emblem of Australia.

Together with the wattle are flowers and gum nuts of deep browns, like the beaches and coastlines surrounding Darwin, vibrant blue like our coastal waters and white like the clouds in our skies, all of which were so strongly fought for and defended during 1942 and 1943.

This delicate combination of elements are held in place by coral-coloured thread in honour of the Battle of the Coral Sea, the largest naval battle ever fought off Australia's shores.

USE IT OR LOSE IT

RECENTLY an episode of Radio National's 'The History Listen' discussed the kangaroo dogs that were first bred about 1800 in Sydney by crossing Scottish deerhounds with greyhounds. Their ability to hunt and kill kangaroos provided early colonists with a plentiful supply of fresh meat. As the European occupation spread so did the kangaroo dogs. First Nations people also adopted them.

From the 1830s colonial hunting clubs were formed that used the dogs to hunt kangaroos for sport. In Victoria squatters bred packs of hound and frequently invited visiting dignitaries to join in their hunts. In 1858 S.T. Gill depicted these events in a series of lithographs entitled 'Kangaroo Hunting'.

In the late 1850s kangaroo hunts were held at Baringhup. The first reported event occurred on Tuesday 30 December 1856. 'Sportsmen' were invited to meet at Robert Lawrence's Loddon Hotel (now the Loddon Store) at 8 o'clock in the morning. The hunt was considered a success when more than 10 kangaroos were bailed up and three were killed by the dogs.


Lawrence organised further hunts from his hotel as did James Bloomfield the publican at the nearby Davenham Hotel. In May 1858 Maldon-based sportsmen, led by Hugh Pettitt, the owner of the Springs Hotel, formed the Nuggetty Hunt Club. Soon, at these hunts, kangaroo dogs competed against each other with bets being placed on the outcome. Among the outstanding dogs were Hugh Pettitt's Bomba and Turpain, a dog owned by John Lawlor of Barkers Creek.

Like many First Nations people the Dja Dja Wurrung also used kangaroo dogs. In 1860 Thomas Hannay moved to Maldon and purchased a stationery business in High Street. He had previously travelled through Western Victoria as a photographer. Among the photographs Hannay took after arriving in Maldon is one of a Dja Dja Wurrung camp near the Loddon River. The group photographed have two large, lean hounds that were almost certainly kangaroo dogs.

Locally kangaroo hunts declined in the early 1860s probably due to the introduction of European game species such as hares and rabbits that could be hunted with greyhounds and other smaller dogs. Many people however still owned kangaroo dogs and there were frequent references to them in the local press.

In March 1868 Donald Martin, head teacher at the Porcupine Flat Common School, was charged and found guilty of allowing his kangaroo dog to kill fowls owned by his neighbour George Searle. While Martin claimed his dog had never previously killed fowls, evidence was given that the dog frequently worried cows and chased young cattle. Martin was required to pay Searle damages and was also fined for keeping an unregistered dog.



Library News

THE annual Dementia Action Week is held in September and there are a number of community groups in Maldon whose activities fit this year's theme: '*Act Now for a Dementia-Friendly Future*'.

Around two-thirds of people with dementia live in the community, yet research shows that more than 60 per cent of people would rather not think about dementia. A lack of knowledge and understanding of dementia leads to people living with dementia experiencing stigma, discrimination, social isolation, loneliness and not seeking help. Social participation in the community can come to a standstill once a diagnosis is made, which is why dementia-friendly communities are important.

Maldon Athenaeum Library previously received a grant from Tarrangower Dementia Alliance (TDA) to help break down the stigma and create a Dementia-Friendly future for Maldon. The group is auspiced by the Maldon Neighbourhood Centre with Dhelkaya Health and Mt Alexander Shire Council as supporting members. With these funds, the Maldon Athenaeum Library has been able to facilitate small but significant changes that will help the Athenaeum become more accessible to all in the community. From the funding and with the help of a walk-through audit by one of the TDA members who has Dementia, a number of changes have been actioned:

- Name Badges: Coloured Lanyards and large font used on the Volunteers' name badges make the Duty Volunteers more recognisable to approach.
- Toilet Block: sensory colours help members differentiate the floor from walls, including the toilet seat cover.
- Signs to locate the toilet block, both outside and inside the building.
- Colour, larger size and font of the shelving labels to make it easier to read for those facing sensory issues,
- Yellow lines on the outside steps leading to the front entrance to help ensure safety for those with depth perception difficulties.

The library will be adding a map of the library for the website. There will be colours for each room, to help people living with dementia and their carers to navigate through the library.

Come walk with us On Tuesday 17 September 2024, Tarrangower Dementia Alliance, Maldon Croquet Club and the Maldon Athenaeum Library invite you to take a walk with us to see what small but significant changes can be done to keep our local community Dementia Friendly. Leaving at 10.30am from Maldon Neighbourhood Centre, a walk to the Maldon Croquet Club, across to the Athenaeum Library, then returning to the starting point. The walk finishes around 11.30am, with a morning tea and talks by Tarrangower Dementia Alliance members.

People who need dementia assistance for themselves or loved ones they are caring for should call the National Dementia Helpline on 1800 100 500.

Book Reviews

Somebody I used to Know by Wendy Mitchell, 2018 Wendy Mitchell had a busy job with the British National Health Service, raised her two daughters alone and spent her weekends running and climbing mountains. Then, slowly, a mist settled deep inside the mind she once knew so well, blurring the world around her. She didn't know it then, but dementia was starting to take hold. In 2014, at age 58, she was diagnosed with young-onset Alzheimer's.

Mitchell shares the heartrending story of her cognitive decline and how she has fought to stave it off. What lay ahead of her after the diagnosis was scary and unknowable, but Mitchell was determined and resourceful, and she vowed to outwit the disease for as long as she could. As Mitchell learned to embrace her new life, she began to see her condition as a gift, a chance to experience the world with fresh eyes and to find her own way to make a difference. Even now, her sunny outlook persists: she devotes her time to educating doctors, caregivers, and other people living with dementia, helping to reduce the stigma surrounding this insidious disease.

Still Alice by Lisa Genova, 2007

Still Alice is a compelling debut novel about a 50-year-old woman's sudden descent into early-onset Alzheimer's disease, written by first-time author Lisa Genova, who holds a PhD in neuroscience from Harvard University.

Alice Howland, happily married with three grown children and a house on the Cape, is a celebrated Harvard professor at the height of her career when she notices a forgetfulness creeping into her life. As confusion starts to cloud her thinking and her memory begins to fail her, she receives a devastating diagnosis: early-onset Alzheimer's disease. Fiercely independent, Alice struggles to maintain her lifestyle and live in the moment, even as her sense of self is being stripped away. In turns heartbreaking, inspiring and terrifying, *Still Alice* captures in remarkable detail what it's like to literally lose your mind.

The Lost Girls by Jennifer Spence, 2019

What would you do if you had the chance to change a pivotal moment from your past? How far would you go to save someone you loved? These are just two of the fateful choices a woman must face in this highly original and hauntingly evocative detective story of love and loss. At the core of the enigmatic Stella's story, past and present, is a mystery she is compelled to solve of a beautiful young woman who went missing 50 years ago and a tragedy much closer to home she must try to prevent. As Stella unravels the dark secrets of her family's past and her own, it becomes clear that everyone remembers the past differently and the small choices we make every day can change our future irrevocably.




