## **Council elections update**

THE nominations for the upcoming Council elections in Mount Alexander have been finalised. In five out of the eight wards, only one candidate has nominated and so there is no requirement for those residents to vote.

It would appear that this is shaping up to be an interesting election. Before this year's electoral restructure of Mt Alexander Shire, there were five wards and seven councillors. There are now eight wards, with eight councillors. Following the election, there will be at least three new Councillors. And as mentioned above, there will be elections held for only three of the wards. Finally, depending upon the election outcomes, there could be something of a political, cultural and generational shift.

The three wards plus the candidates where voting packs will be sent out are:

The *Times* spoke to the two candidates who will be representing residents in the readership area: Matt Driscoll, who has already served one term as councillor and has spent the past year as Mayor, and newcomer Rosalie Hastwell.

#### **Matt Driscoll**



Matt is happy that nobody is standing against him in Loddon River ward, but is a little conflicted. "Have I done a really good job, or is it that nobody wanted to put their hand up?" he asked. "Because I do know that it's a hard gig sometimes. It doesn't pay much and councillors get bagged from time to time. Just as well I have a thick skin!"

One initiative that may have resulted in fewer nominations for Council is where potential candidates were invited to speak to either the Mayor, Deputy Mayor or the CEO about a councillor's role. "I must have spoken to at least 15 to 20 people about what it takes to be a councillor," Matt said. "This may have discouraged some people from standing. But ultimately, I'm surprised and disappointed that more people didn't nominate."

Matt believes that the most recent Council operated effectively, owing to its diversity of views. "You need that range, so that it reflects

the diversity of the Shire's residents," he said. "We disagreed on lots of things, but we all got on well and were generally able to reach consensus. Sometimes you need to be taken out of your comfort zone to understand an issue."

In his time on Council and as Mayor, Matt has found that the most enjoyable part of his roles has been meeting a wide range of people. "Ninety-nine point nine per cent of people are great," he said. "That's the part of the job I love."

Other takeaways from the job? "Look, Council's a strange beast," he said. "What with Federal and State governments and then the people you represent, it's a difficult dance. And when I began, I naively thought that I could change more things. But honestly? You can change stuff around the edges, but at the end of the day you get pushed from all sides."

Matt's final words, on a subject that is obviously close to his heart: "Housing. If we're going to fix the housing crisis, the State laws must change. Without those changes, the crisis will continue," he said.

#### Rosalie Hastwell



Like Matt Driscoll, Tarrengower Ward's Rosalie Hastwell is surprised that nobody

nominated to stand against her. "I believe in democracy, and it's always good to have choice," she said. "In this instance, it wasn't to be."

Rosalie did point out, however, that the lack of candidates in the forthcoming council elections was a phenomenon seen across Victoria, and not confined to Mt Alexander Shire.

"One reason for the lack of candidates could be that there was a statewide requirement for all nominees to complete online training," Rosalie said. "It wasn't onerous, but it did clearly spell out a councillor's role. Maybe that meant people were better informed, and decided that being a councillor was not a good fit for them. They may have also come to that conclusion after speaking to the Mayor, the Deputy Mayor or the CEO. It was great that Council gave potential candidates the opportunity to have those discussions."

Clear-eyed and formidably well-informed, Rosalie is very much aware of the road ahead. "Councils are under a lot of pressure financially," she said, "and that is going to make the job even more challenging."

If there is to be a significant cultural and generational shift in the next Council, Rosalie welcomes it. "I think that fresh perspectives and a younger and more diverse council group would be good for the Shire," she said.

Reflecting on the assistance she has received since announcing her nomination, Rosalie said that she was hugely grateful for the groundswell of community support. "I feel very honoured and also very humbled, and I want to thank the community for their warm, generous and wise input," she said. "I look forward to working with the whole community."

## **Heritage meeting**



## THERE was a time when Maldon was at the forefront of heritage planning in Australia. But has the town lost its way, in terms of conserving its built and natural landscapes?

Many believe that the short answer is: yes. A group called the Maldon Heritage Network was formed in 2023, due to the perception that heritage values in Maldon have been slipping in recent years. Its members aim to preserve and protect the town's street-scapes, mining artefacts and landscapes as well as supporting the conservation of the

area's indigenous heritage. By working with residents, government and relevant parties, the group wants to put heritage back on the public agenda.

A community meeting held by the Maldon Heritage Network last Wednesday night at the Maldon Neighbourhood Centre attracted an interested crowd of residents. Tarrengower Ward's new councillor-elect Rosalie Hastwell attended and contributed to the discussions.

With group member Robyn Ballinger directing traffic, a range of issues was covered.

#### They included:

- The closure of Carmans tunnel, with concern expressed at the loss of this tourist attraction and the perceived poor response from the government department responsible for its management.
- Significant trees there are five trees over 500 years old in the township, with another five or six that are over 400 years old. These trees deserve greater protection.
- The town centre new businesses moving in are not adhering to heritage guidelines when putting up signage or when painting the outside of shops. Also mentioned: 'demolition by neglect', with some old buildings falling into a sad state of disrepair.
- The proposed State Government planning regulations, which would overturn
  the old stipulation that a building should
  fit well into a neighbourhood what are
  the implications for Maldon? Will these
  regulations override the town's heritage
  overlay?

 Housing strategy - While there is no doubt that new homes will be built on Maldon's outskirts, will it be possible to do this in such a way that the entrances to Maldon aren't 'trashed'?

One of the final comments on the night: "We need to get people talking about heritage again."

Last week's meeting was the second event organised by the Maldon Heritage Network. The first one was an event in July, where academic and town planner Trevor Budge delivered a presentation called *Maldon's Heritage: Why does it matter?* You can read this at maldonmuseum.com.au - go to the page titled 'Heritage Heros'.

If you're 100% genuine about heritage, you'd knock all the houses down, banish cars, roads and elm trees and let the bush take over! But being serious, heritage is why a lot of people choose to live here in the first place. It is important.



Of course heritage is important - absolutely. Maldon is the First Notable Town, after all. But I'd still like to see the damage in some of the old buildings fixed up. It takes away from the positives of our heritage.



Heritage is Maldon's life blood. Without heritage, Maldon wouldn't be what it is. It draws tourists to town - otherwise they wouldn't visit.



Heritage is 100% important. Maldon is unique. Without its heritage, people wouldn't come here - Maldon would be just another small country town.

## **Maldon Pantry update**



MALDON Community Pantry is fast approaching its first year of providing food relief to the local community. As the Pantry becomes better known, and as the cost of living continues to squeeze budgets, visitors to the Pantry have been steadily increasing since opening last November for a three week trial. For many of us, the stigma associated with needing some help still makes it difficult to pop into the Pantry to get some much-needed supplies. So, let me set the scene for you!

You'll wander into the grounds of the Holy Trinity Anglican Church at 50 High Street, and head towards the hall behind the church building. Up a couple of steps, and into the hall – one of the welcoming volunteers will say hello, introduce themselves, and if you're new to the Pantry show you about and answer any questions you might have. They'll leave you to choose items from the Pantry offerings (there are bags provided) and offer you a cuppa – the kettle is never far from boiled if you want to stay and chat. No-one is looking over your shoulder and no-one is asking you questions about your circumstances. What is important, is that you visit the Pantry on your own terms.

While the offerings available at the pantry will vary from week to week, we do try and ensure that a wide range of fresh and non-perishable food is available: bread (thank you to our wonderful Maldon Bakery who donates fresh-baked loaves each week), milk, eggs,

tinned fruit, cereal options, fresh fruit and vegetables, soups, pasta, rice, tinned vegetables, condiments, yoghurt, drinks, and the list goes on. Thanks to the very generous local donations and support from the Regional Community Vet Clinic there is also some help to keep the furry members of your household fed. The Pantry is open 9am to 11am every Wednesday morning.

This week also sees the opening of the Maldon Neighbourhood 'Mini Pantry' – you can find it in the entrance of the hall and can access non-perishable tinned and bottled goods and long-life milk during opening hours (Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday 9am to 3.30pm). (If the hall is locked, pop into the office and someone will open the door.) It's a terrific initiative and will provide an important addition to local food relief.

So, next time you're stuck for some pantry staples, or you're just curious about the Pantry, please pop in! You will be joining the over 800 people who have visited or been supported by the Pantry since opening last year.

Those times and locations again: Maldon Community Pantry (here is where the larger range of food is found) 9am to 11am, every Wednesday, 50 High St (behind the Holy Trinity Anglican Church). And the Maldon Neighbourhood Centre Mini Pantry, 9am to 3.30pm, Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday, 1 Church Street.

## Teddy & Me closes

EARLIER this month, Teddy & Me's owner Marilyn Kennedy made the difficult decision to close her shop, which had been operating in Maldon since 1997. The *Times* caught up with Marilyn last week to talk about her time as a retailer.

It was while working at Monash University in the computer department that Marilyn developed a hankering to own a shop in a country town. Each week, she travelled into the city and bought a range of country newspapers from McGills Newsagency in Elizabeth Street. "I saw a notice advertising Teddy & Me, came and had a look at the shop and bought the business," Marilyn said.

Was she specifically after a shop that sold toys? "No," Marilyn said. "I would have been quite happy to have bought a shop selling other things - homewares, for instance. But Teddy & Me seemed to be a good fit. I don't drive, and Maldon has a bus and isn't far from a train station. Plus there was a flat above the shop that I could live in."

And so it was that Marilyn threw herself into the highs and lows of owning a shop in Maldon. While building up a loyal customer base, she also made some changes to her stock, including specialising in collectable toys that appealed to adults as well as children.

As a shopkeeper, Marilyn had a gentle manner and was generous with her time and expertise. Teddy & Me became a popular shop, with many repeat customers.

The pros of being a shop owner? "I loved the independence of being the one making the decisions," Marilyn said. "And I really enjoyed the relationships

I had with my customers - many of who have become friends."

The cons? In all the time that Marilyn owned her shop, she was unable to take a holiday. Apart from being on the Maldon Inc committee for some years, she had little time for outside activities. Another fly in the ointment: after 21 years of operating her shop out of the same building, Marilyn had to move to other premises. "I only wish I'd been able to buy the building," she said. "Then I would have had complete independence."

In her 27 years as a shop owner, Marilyn has seen many businesses come and go. "Everything comes in waves," she said, "with shops and businesses opening and then closing. Then there's another cycle and it begins again."

At present, Marilyn is living with a cancer diagnosis and is undergoing treatment. "I tried keeping the shop open only on weekends for a while, but it became too difficult for me," she said.

In the meantime, Marilyn is adjusting to retirement and keeping as well as she possibly can, under difficult circumstances. But she has no regrets about her decision to move to Maldon and buy a business. "I'd do it all over again," she said. "I love the town, the people are wonderful and I've enjoyed my time at Teddy & Me."



## Celebrating forty years - but still going strong

STAFF and residents at the Maldon Hospital came together for a special afternoon tea recently to celebrate Kath Hanson's 40 years of service at the Maldon Hospital.

Kath's career at the Hospital began on 1 September 1984, and as a permanent part-timer she has worked in a range of positions over the years. In that time, she has seen many changes.

"Back in the earlier days, all the staff had to wear dresses, and just look out if you wanted to show your knees, especially with Matron checking each morning," Kath said.

Kath recalls the days when all meals for the Hospital and for Meals on Wheels were cooked on-site. "No frozen veggies," she said. "Veggies were peeled and cooked as needed and all food was fresh daily from the local outlets. At Christmas time, all the Christmas puddings would hang in the kitchen."

Another significant change, according to Kath, is the increase in admin. tasks. "There wasn't much paperwork years ago but now we have inspections, accreditation, work cover, external safety audits, cleaning audits and the list goes on!"

Like her mother, Kath has always been a great supporter of the Maldon Hospital. "My mother baked, mended sheets and babies' nappies, knitted bonnets, booties and bed socks and did whatever else was needed," Kath said.

Over the years, Kath has supported the Hospital in a range of different ways. She was a member of the Hospital Auxiliary for over 20 years and held the position of President for 14 years. When there was a shortfall of \$100,000 for the new building, Kath was on a committee that was able to raise \$129,000 in just 18 months - a great achievement for a small town. She has also served on the committee formed to celebrate the Hospital's 150th anniversary, the Quality Committee and has organised staff reunions.

And then there were all the Hospital's Easter

floats over the years. "Sunday afternoon was spent decorating the truck at the back of the Hospital, then Monday morning it was time for the finishing touches before we jumped on board for the parade," Kath said.

When Kath first started at the Hospital, staff would tell her that they had been working there for 10 to 20 years. "My response was, get a life!" Kath said. "I didn't know at the time that I would become one of those people."

Why has Kath stayed so long? "With some people staying for 10, 20 and 30 years of service, that minimal staff turnover proves that it's a wonderful place to work," she said. "It's a small facility that has a family-like atmosphere."

Kath paid tribute to the loyalty, commitment and friendship that all of the staff at Maldon Hospital have shown to her. "The staff are outstanding," she said. "They work hard to create a service that the community can be proud of."

So has Kath retired? Well, no - she enjoys her job too much! Let's call it transition to retirement. Her hours have reduced, and she now works for 25 hours a fortnight. And Kath loves spending time with the residents and patients; listening to their stories and popping in a joke here and there.

"Kath chips in and helps out where needed," General Manager & Director of Nursing Shannon Uren said. "For instance, there was a time in recent months when there was a COVID outbreak among the nursing staff. Kath came in and worked as a nursing assistant and she was a Godsend."

When she's not up at the Hospital, Kath enjoys gardening, reading and going uptown to enjoy a coffee and a chat. She is also a very modest woman, who has been reluctant to tell her story.

But it's a story that's worth telling!






## The falcons are flying in!



## **Traction Engines**

SOME of the readers of this article, I'm sure, will be farmers. Farmers are very hard-working people and a lot of that work is physical. Therefore, any labour-saving device is going to be welcome and this has been true since someone invented the wheel, a couple of years before I was born.

Australian farmers have the reputation of being particularly innovative, and this is not surprising, given the extreme conditions and the nature of the work. Mechanical shears, threshing machines, circular saws, lathes.... you get the idea.

We think that living off grid is very hip and sustainable, but out in the Aussie bush 100 years ago, it was nearly all off-grid; no petrol stations or power points then.

So how to power your shearing shed? I introduce to you, the traction engine.

The Maldon Machinery Museum has got a collection of traction engines and they all

work. These things are just great to watch, an OH&S nightmare.

There's things spinning around, up and down, smoke and steam, hissing and banging, Steam Punk? Yeah, we've got Steam Punk.

Adam Tori, who we met previously with the saws and axe collection, knows a bit about these traction engines and I had another fascinating chat with him recently.

Basically, the traction engine is a power plant for all your farm gadgets. It has a big, almost flat pulley sticking out one side, which drives a long leather belt, which then runs the pulley on the gadget, pump, saw, shears, etc.

One thing that is counterintuitive about mechanical things, is that the simpler they are, the more complicated they are to operate. Think about your car. Under the bonnet is a mass of highly tuned machinery, electronics and gizmos that most of us know just about nothing about. So how do you start it; just turn

the key or push the button, that's it.

Ok, let's start the traction engine, a very simple, single-cylinder motor. There's a little tray filled with paraffin, which is lit and this heats up the basic carburettor. You know when it's hot enough when you spit on it and it sizzles; there's no other way. Then after some more adjusting and fiddling, you give the flywheel on the side a big heave and off it goes, hiss, hiss, hiss, bang, hiss, hiss, bang, bang...keep your fingers out.

People love these old engines; they've got so much character, almost a living thing, which will reward you if you treat it properly and neatly trim off a limb if you don't, no questions asked.

There are five here in the museum, three made in Ballarat by Ronaldson & Tippett and two imported from England, 'The Blackstone'. The local ones are slightly less fancy, with square edges and straight spokes, whereas


the imported ones have curved spokes on the flywheels, supposedly for safety, so that if your arm gets caught when you are starting it, the curved spokes will flick it out, not tear it off. See, I wasn't joking.

These engines cost the equivalent of about \$50,000 in today's money when new and so it was common for several farmers to buy one between them. The latest engine here was made in the 1920s, after which diesel engines gradually took over. So the timeline progression was horse, steam, oil or kerosene, (these engines) and then diesel.

The museum regularly has days when they run these amazing old engines. Have a look at the website or give them a call and come down for a look and a listen, but keep your hands in your pockets!





### BLAST FROM THE PAST

#### THE MALDON SWIMMING POOL

A Maldon Swimming Club was formed in 1906 and held carnivals at the South German and North British mine dams. From about 1913 Club members held regular swimming classes for children at the South German dam.

In 1923 the Royal Life Saving Society initiated the 'Learn to Swim' campaign in Victoria. This campaign was supported by the Education Department and gained momentum in 1928 after the Melbourne *Herald* sponsored it and Olympian Frank Beaurepaire became the campaign's president. Many swimming pools were built in Victoria as a result of this campaign.

In September 1928 Shire President Cr Matthew Fogarty convened a meeting to discuss the building of a swimming pool in Maldon. A committee to manage the project was elected with Alex Robertson, headmaster of the State School, as its president. The Shire Council, the Advance Maldon Association and School Committee pledged their support and all agreed that the pool should be built near the State School.

The pool was estimated to cost £300, assuming it was built with voluntary labour. Many individuals and local organisations offered financial support. However, in a letter to the *Tarrangower Times*, 'All In' suggested that the town's children be asked for donations. As they would benefit from the pool, they should dip into their 'fairly large' bank accounts to help pay for it.

The pool was opened on Saturday 7 December 1929. It was built of concrete with clay surrounds and was filled via a concrete pipe from the town's reservoir above the present site of the tennis courts. The pool was 90 foot long and 30 foot wide. Its depth tapered from 2 foot to 7 foot. The total cost of the pool and its two dressing sheds was £500, of which the State Government contributed £126.

Cr Fogarty was given the honour of declaring the pool opened and he then introduced May Cox, the Education Department's Supervisor of Swimming and Lifesaving. Cox gave a lecture on 'the art and modes of swimming' supported by practical demonstrations by three State swimming champions. One of these champions was Lily Beaurepaire who, with her brother Frank, had represented Australia at the 1920 Olympics.

Following the opening, the Maldon Swimming Club held a carnival that included novelty events. Afternoon tea was served and the Shire Council treated all the children present to free ice cream and lollies. Local resident Howard Sampson made a film of the day's events that was later shown to large audiences at the ANA Hall (now the Community Centre).



#### **Library News**

NEXT week marks World Animal Day, celebrating the important role of animals, wild and domestic. Animals feature in many books in our Children's Collection, and there are works, fiction and non-fiction, in the general collection focusing on elephants, goats, birds, horses, hares, foxes and of course dogs.

For many of us dogs are a vital part of the family and their deeds, heroic or otherwise, have been the subject of many popular books. Favourites include Ahound the World: My Travels with Oscar (Joanne Lefson), Love Clancy: A Dog's Letters Home (Richard Glover), Marley and Me: Life and Love with the World's Worst Dog (John Grogan) and Walking Ollie: Or Winning the Love of a Difficult Dog (Stephen Foster).

However, this week's library news focuses on books about cats. Like many animal stories, these books tell us as much about the author and their changing view of life as they do about the cat or cats involved. These books can be found in the library's Animal Tales section.

Homer's Odyssey (Gwen Cooper) is the story of an extraordinary cat and his human companion. It celebrates the refusal to accept limits—on love, ability, or hope against overwhelming odds. By turns jubilant and moving, it's a memoir for anybody who has ever fallen completely and helplessly in love with a pet.

Particular Cats and More Cats (Doris Lessing). Lessing was a novelist and essayist who won the 2007 Nobel Prize for a lifetime of writing. This set of short stories, beautifully illustrated by Anne Robinson, recounts the cats that have moved and amused her. They also describe Lessing's own story in relation to cats, how they affected her and she them.

Dewey: The Small Town Library Cat Who Touched the World (Vicki Myron). From the day when the small kitten was posted through the book return slot of the local library in Spencer Iowa, Dewey Readmore Books transformed the small library, saved a classic American town and eventually became famous world-wide.

Cleo: How an Uppity Cat Helped Heal a Family (Helen Brown) The book is about a small black cat who helped mend a family's broken hearts. Helen Brown wasn't a cat person, but her nine-year-old son Sam was. Sam pleaded and the deal was done - the kitten would be delivered when she was big enough to leave her mother. A week later, Sam was dead. Through happiness and heartbreak, changes and new beginnings, Cleo turned out to be the unlikely glue that affectionately held Helen's family together.

#### **Book Reviews**

#### By Her Own Design by Piper Huguley, 2022

The incredible untold story of Ann Lowe, Jackie Kennedy's wedding dress designer, a black woman who made some of the most famous dresses of all time, only to be forgotten by history.

After Ann elopes at 12 with an older man who soon proves himself to be an abusive alcoholic, her dreams of becoming a celebrated designer seem to be put on hold. But then a wealthy Tampa socialite sees Ann's talent and offers her an amazing opportunity - the chance to sew and design clothing for Florida's society elite. Taking her young son in the middle of the night, Ann escapes her husband and embarks on the adventure of a lifetime.

But what starts as a bonding and sightseeing adventure quickly morphs into something far more dangerous. A wrongful arrest, a close call with the murderer and an intervention from Tippy's mum all conspire against The Nancys. But regardless of their own safety, and despite the constant distraction of questionable fashion choices in the town that style forgot, The Nancys know only they can stop the killer from striking again.

On arrival in Beijing, Jack finds himself accidentally in possession of an explosive piece of information both the Chinese and American governments are desperate to get their hands on. Alone in a strange city, suspected of being a traitor by his own side, not knowing whom to trust, Jack is faced with an impossible decision. Should he save his new-found daughter or prevent a new world war from breaking out?

#### Hide by S.J. Morgan, 2019

It's 1983 in Thatcher's Britain. Alec Johnston has left his comfortable family home in Cardiff and taken a flat with bikers Minto, Stobes and Black. There he meets Sindy, Minto's strange and vulnerable young girlfriend. When she starts to view Alec as a possible saviour from her abusive relationship, it earns Alec a big target on his back.


Our thanks go to Pyrenees PC for their hospitality and the spirit in which the games were played.




